Imphal. Dec.6: Government of Manipur has ordered the Assam Riffles and other paramilitary establishment located in and around Imphal area to install electric prepaid metering system at their camps as well as offices.

A source said that the order is being issued by the Chief

Accusing the Home

Accusing the Home department of not following the Supreme Court orders in making the peoples' friendly police, Joykumar, who is also a RTI activist said that Home Minister Gaikhangam Home department had commitment to serve the Accommitment of the people. The activists further added that if the Home department had commitment to serve the people of the state then Home Department should not be exempted from the purview of the RTI act to prove their accountability

and transparency.
Joykumar said that recently the Home Department had denied giving information sought through RTI, but after the matter has been appealed to the Manipur Information Commission, the Commission had directed the Home department to provide the information within 45 days. He said if they matter is about corruption and Human Rights violations then even though the state government can exempt the Home department from the purview of the RTI, the department has to give information.

He further appealed the state government to conduct the legal awareness campaign among the law enforcing officers as well as the government officials. This is so stated against allegations to the RTI activists of misusing the RTI act. "It is not the RTI activists that are misusing the RTI act but the government officials and law makers", Joykumar said. He also added that if they are so sure about their integrity then why barking at the media or trying to bribe the appellant instead of giving the information that he sought.

Although the faith of the victimized suspended Professor and also the HOD of Computer Science Department is still uncertain since MU higher authority has not issued any official notification regarding revocation of the suspension order till date. Nothing would be wrong in

saying that Manipur University Students' Union (MUSU) election has the highest degree of violence. e Union was even once solved after on May 25,

University Prof Md Islamuddin and former dean of student welfare was assassinated inside the campus of the University in the board daylight

This year's election was the second time to be held since the union was revoked. This time too, the degree of hostilities, sense of violence among so called

student leaders of the rival contesting groups was easily notice on the first scheduled day of election that was on December 4.

The main cause of the problem this time, was the suspension of HOD of Computer Science Department following

counter charge by one rival group about the submission of manipulated attendance record of a lady candidate from the Department and the resignation of election RO. Regarding the attendance

report, a source revealed that if one critically checked on the record of all the students contesting the election, none of the candidates might be eligible to contest in the election as none of the attendance records would not be up to the mark. It was also revealed that the lady

Independent candidate was specially targeted as she denied accepting the proposal from the rival group to contest herself as their candidate eventually the lady supported by another main rival party.

On the other hand,

the languages used and shouted by so called student called student leaders and voter mobilizers

during the agitation against non- voting arrangement after the RO had resigned were observed to be highly hostile and violent.

'Have you forgotten the last incident?". "RO should be beaten up (RO netkadabani, f u g a d o u b a n i , hatkadoubani)", "Why cancelled for a girl, who is good for nothing?", "Where good for nothing?", "Where is the VC, what the hell is he doing?" these are few abusive words shouted by the agitating student provoking other students for violence act.

On the day it was also observed that many students uncomfortable to hear such

kind of abusive, arrogant, hostile, violent and unsuited languages being used by students to their teachers.
Some of the students were

even heard murmuring whether those using abusive language were real students of the University or not?

Racist attacks increasing

Peace and Ethnic Conflict in Northeast India: Cultural Borderlands of Southeast Asia: A Case Study of Nagaland-Manipur Crisis

upheavals of the II World War (1939-1945) which had deeply affected South East Asia also impacted heavily on lives of neighbouring upland and lowland communities in Northeast India, especially Nagaland and Manipur. The global processes of war, physical confrontations, armed violence and death coupled with destructions. displacements and disasters in

he lives of hill and plains

communities created flux and uncertainties which made it impossible to return to earlier social and economic equilibriums under prolonged colonial rule. Ethnic societies in Burma, and their cultural cousins in Northeast India were thrust into the cauldron of rapid change and rapid transformations, where new forces were unleashed to leave their impact on the post-colonial history of these Southern Mongoloid communities. New leaders also emerged to contend with

the critical dynamics of the era, who left varying, but distinctively similar impulses on the moods and sentiments of their peoples. Universal ideas of decolonization and self-determination enabled them to jump into the foray of the dislocation of the war, faced the issues of social, economic and political disturbances, and helped crystallize primordial or ideological slants for ideological slants for contestations for power, resources and nation making to help shape the destiny of

their respective communities. Four leaders of outstanding qualities emerged in the middle of the twentieth century, two from Burma – Aung San (Burman – 1915-1947), Thakin Than Tun (Burman - 1911-1968). Zanu Phizo (Angami Naga – 1904-1990) of Nagaland and Hijam Irabat (Meetei – 1896-1951) of Manipur, and they transformed the historical trajectories of their respective regions on the issues of selfdetermination, decolonization and revolution.

During the war, and post war

periods, there was not so much of hostilities amongst the minor nationalities of the minor nationalities Burma or Northeast India. The political trends in the modern history of the ethnic communities like the Mons, Karens, Shan, Wa. Kachins etc. in Burma, and the Nagas, the Meetei, the Kuki etc. in Northeast India were marked by their varying loyalties or otherwise in their relationship with the colonial power i.e. the British, and the imperial enemy
