# Experts give mixed response to government banning violent NSCN-K

## ANI Dimapur, Nov.22: Experts

have given mixed response to the Indian Government's move to ban the militant the Khaplang faction of National Socialist Council of Nagaland (NSCN-K) terrorist organization under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967 because of its refusal to give up its violent ways.

Urging the leadership of the NSCN-K to come forward for negotiations to ensure peace and stability in Nagaland and adjoining areas, Professor Amar Yumnam, an economist and Yumnam, an economist and an analyst, said, "I don't think banning is what the government of India is looking as ultimate solution, but they are all using as a means so there is no question of justification or non-justification. They are using it as one of the means to make the NSCN realise that the Government of India really means business and really want to have talks with

Ksh Bimola Devi, another professor and political analyst, said, "In course of time, the government is to review the policy of banning NSCN (K) because the negotiation with NSCN (IM) may not be a successful one without taking into confidence the NSCN (K), because the important point is, there are many members of the NSCN (K) in Nagaland and neighboring states. So, because of that, if the Indian government want to promote or restore complete peace in whole of northeast India,

then, I think, the policy of government to ban this NSCN(K) is justified to an extent." The militant outfit came into

existence in 1988 and is active along the Indo-Myanmar border. It has been accused of killing innocent civilians

and security forces. For instance, on June 4, 2015, the Naga outfit attacked an army convoy in the Chandel district of Manipur and killed 18 soldiers. India has asked Myanmar to

hand over four top leaders of the NSCN-K, including its chief S S Khaplang and militant commander Niki Sumi.

The outfit has been involved in a series of attacks on security forces in Nagaland, Manipur and Arunachal Pradesh.

that the name of a single Bangladeshi should not be in the updating of the National Register for Citizens (NRC). During a book launch, Acharya's comment came in reply to a question on updating the NRC list and the controversy on surrounding the Centre's notification of allowing religious minorities from Pakistan and Bangladesh fleeing persecution to seek shelter in India. "Hindustan is for Hindus. There is nothing wrong with that. Hindus from different

countries can stay here. They cannot be outsiders. There is nothing to be feared about that. But how to accommodate them is a big question and we should think about that," he said.

Yangon, Nov 22: At least 90 people have died in a huge landslide in a remote jade mining area of northern Myanmar, officials said today, as search teams continued to find bodies in one of the deadliest disasters to strike the country's shadowy jade one person had been pulled alive from the rubble, but had died soon after. industry

Those killed were thought to have been scavenging through a mountain of waste rubble dumped by mechanical diggers used by mining firms in the area to extract Myanmar's most

valuable precious stone. The massive landslide crushed in neighbouring China. Secretary Rajiv Mehrishi on Tuesday

The ULFA delegation is also likely to meet Home Minister Rajnath Singh during their visit to the national capital. Speculation is rife that the Narendra Modi government is

keen to sign a peace accord with the pro-talk faction of the ULFA ahead of next year's Assam assembly election to bring an end to the nearly four decades of insurgency in the

northeastern state. Officials said a peace accord may come through by December-end. The recent deportation of ULFA 'general secretary' Anup Chetia from Bangladesh has also sent a positive signal to the ULFA leadership and that has set the

ball rolling for early signing of a peace accord. Elections to the 126-member Assam assembly are due in April-May next year. The BJP may try to take credit if an accord is

signed before the polls in its bid to dislodge the Congress, which is ruling the state for consecutive terms. Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who oversaw the peace accord signed with Naga insurgent group NSCN-IM in August, is believed to be keen for an early conclusion of the peace agreement with ULFA.

If a peace accord is signed, some of the ULFA leaders are expected to contest the assembly elections. A former ULFA leader, Hira Sarania, is now an MP (Independent) in Lok Sabha after he successfully contested the 2014 Parliamentary elections.
