After High Court order, Gujarat to hold local body polls in November

PTI **Gujarat, Oct. 24:** The Gujarat State Election Commission (SEC) today announced elections to various local bodies, including six municipal corporations on 22 and 29 November. The announcement comes two days after Gujarat High Court ordered the SEC to conduct the local body polls before the expiry of their terms after quashing an ordinance issued by the state government to pave way to delay local bodies polls. Elections to municipal corporations will be held on November 22, district panchayats, taluka panchayats and nagarpalikas will go to polls on November 29.

With the Patel quota agitation still rocking the state, the upcoming elections will test the ruling BJP's popularity in Gujarat, even as the opposition Congress hopes to benefit. Calling it a victory of 6.5 crore citizens of Gujarat, Congress spokesperson Nishith Vyas, said, "BJP-led government was not in favour of holding elections as they feared losing the polls. We want to thank the judiciary for intervening in this matter." In these elections, neither the compulsory voting provision nor the None Of the Above (NOTA) option will be available, State Election Commissioner Varesn Sinha said.

Pakistan targets 9 BSF posts along international border in Samba, civilian injured

PTI **Jammu, Oct. 24:** Pakistan Rangers violated the ceasefire again with heavy firing and mortar shelling overnight that targeted nine border outposts of BSF and civilians areas in Samba district along the international border (IB), leaving a labourer injured. After over a month-long lull, Pakistani troops on Friday resumed the ceasefire violations along the international border, killing one civilian and injuring three so far. "Pak Rangers resorted to unprovoked firing on BSF posts along IB in Samba sector from 2025 hours last night", a BSF officer said here on Saturday, adding that BSF troops carried out effective retaliation. The Rangers fired on nine border outposts of BSF along the IB in areas between river Basantar and river Treva in Samba sector, he said, adding that they used 82, 82 and 51 mm mortar bombs at few places along IB. BSF troops guarding the borderline retaliated resulting in exchanges which continued till 0220 hours on Saturday, he said, adding that there was no loss of life on Indian side but a civilian, who was working as a labourer in maintenance work near fence, was injured. A civilian was killed and two

others were injured last evening when Pakistani troops indulged in heavy firing along IB in Mangu

Chak border outpost. The ceasefire violations, which became a routine, had stopped after the director

general-level talks between BSF and Pakistan Rangers on 12 September.

Guard killed after truck rams into AIIMS gate

ANI **New Delhi, Oct. 24:** One security guard was killed on the spot after a truck rammed into the gate of All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) here on Saturday morning at around 5:00 a.m. The deceased guard has been identified as Sandeep Kumar. According to the night shift security in-charge at AIIMS, the truck driver escaped immediately after the accident and the number of the truck was noted by another guard. "This accident occurred around 5 o'clock in the morning. The guard Sandeep Kumar lost his life in the



accident. The guard has noted the number of the truck. The number plate indicated that the truck is from Rajasthan. The truck driver escaped after the accident," Night shift security in-charge, Arvind Kumar Tripathi told ANI. Further details are awaited.

Assam Rifles Recovers Contraband Items

Imphal, Oct. 24: Based on specific intelligence regarding ferrying of contraband items on NH- 102, troops of the 20 Assam Rifles of 26 Sector AR under the aegis of HQ IGAR (South) established a vehicle check post at Bongyang Road and apprehended an individual alongwith contraband items on 21 Oct 2015. The apprehende was identified as Sanjay Kumar, aged 30 years, S/o

Mr Suresh Kumar, resident of village Minuthong Hatta Telipati, PS - Porompat, Dist - Imphal East. He was travelling in a Mahindra DI bearing Registration Number MN-01- 6792 and heading towards Moreh. During the checking, 9300 Tins of '350 Zarda' worth Rs 28,83,000, 4800 Tins of Baba Black (50 gm) worth Rs 3,69,600, 43200 Tins of Golden Khani worth Rs 2,80,800, 39600

Tins of Baba Black (10 gm) worth Rs 27,72,000, 04 Pouch of Talab Pan Masha worth Rs 24,960 and 01 Pouch of Royal Chewing Tobacco worth Rs 1560/- were recovered from his possession. Total worth of the contraband items is Rs 63,31,920. The apprehende alongwith the recovered items have been handed over to the Food Safety Officer, Chandel.
