Sasikala's husband, 74-year-old chronic liver disease patient, was stable after aseven-and-a-half hour kidney and liver transplant surgery that began late on Tuesday night, said a senior doctor at the Institute of Liver Diseases and Transplantation.

Let's stop alienating people of northeast in the country: N. Biren

IT News Imphal, Oct 6: Chief Minister N. Biren Singh said that collective effort is needed to overcome the alienation of the people of North-East in the mainland India and it is our responsibility to create the sense of unity among citizens of the country. This was stated by him at the Regional Conference of State Labour Ministers and Principal Secretaries/Secretaries/ Commissioners of State labour Departments of North East States held today at Hotel Classic Grande The conference was organised by Ministry of Labour and Employment, Government of India

Speaking as Chief Guest of the function. Chief Minister said that under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his idea of "Sab ka Saath Sab ka Vikas", the Central Government has given its priority for the welfare of the people and inclusive development in the country. N. Biren Singh highlighted the harassment and discrimination faced by the people of North-East in Mainland India. Stating that North-East India is filled with talent and potential, he stressed that Manipur has the highest per capita of population in the field like sports and sends the highest numbers of officers in the Indian Army by a State etc.

Chief Minister stated that such conference/review meeting is very important and a way forward in terms of strengthening the



infrastructure to enhance the skilling the manpower and human resource of the country. State Level Skill Development Mission has been introduced to formulate prospective plans and detailed action plans for Skill Development in Manipur, he added. Shri N. Biren Singh said that apart from the Skill Development Mission, a State Mission on employment generation, housing and drinking water for every household by 2022 has also been launched by the Government. N. Biren Singh said that vocational training courses have been introduced in 40 colleges to impart skill development to the youths of the State in the field of IT, Tourism and Hospitality, Retail Management, Computer Hardware Technology etc. The Government has set a target to generate 7.50 lakh employments by the year 2022

through various departments of the State Government, he added. Addressing the delegates, Union

Minister of State for Labour and Employment Shri Santosh Kumar Gangwar said that the Government of India is focussing towards the development of North-Eastern part of India so as to bring an inclusive growth and development in the country. Stating about constituting State Social Welfare Board in every State of the country, Santosh said that the Chairperson of a State Board is to be appointed by the respective States with the by the respective States with approval of the Central Board.

On the occasion, Minister of Labour and Employment, Manipur Shri Th. Radheshyam Singh said that labourers are the downtrodden and vulnerable section of the society. He said that under the dynamic leadership of Chief

Minister Shri N. Biren, a Labour Mela was held with an aim to create awareness on the various central schemes for the welfare of labour in the State recently. The new government has already introduced many social security schemes for the organised and unorganised labourers of the State and distribution of smart cards to the labourers etc., he added.

Showing concern about those children who are working in the construction of roads with BRTF/ BRO in the State, Shri Th. Radheshvam said that such matter would be investigated and checked properly so as to stop child labour. He further assured that the government would keep an eye on the employment of children in brick

firms, as domestic help etc.
During the conference/review meeting, elaborate presentations on Child labour, plantation workers, social security schemes, matters relating welfare of unorganised workers were made by subject experts.

Banwarilal Purohit sworn in as TN Governor

Chennai. Oct 6: Banwarilal Purohit was today sworn- in as the 25th Governor of Tamil Nadu, taking over at a time when the state is witnessing political turbulence in the ruling AIADMK and demand by the opposition for a floor test. Chief Justice of Madras High Court, Justice Indira Banerjee, administered the oath of office to Purohit, a former Governor of Assam at a ceremony at Raj Bhavan here. Taking oath in the name of God, Purohit said he would "faithfully execute the office of governor of Tamil Nadu and will to the best of ability preserve, protect and defend the Constitution and the law and that I will devote myself to the service and well being of the people of Tamil Nadu."
Chief Minister K Palaniswami, his

cabinet colleagues, and DMK Working President and Leader of Opposition in the Assembly M K Stalin, were among those present. Senior BJP leaders including union minister Pon Radhakrishnan were among those present

Earlier, Chief Secretary Girija Vaidyanathan read out the Warrant of Appointment issued on September 29 by President Ram Nath Kovind, appointing Purohit as Governor of Tamil Nadu.

The first full-time Governor to be appointed since the completion of term of K Rosaiah in August 2016, Purohit, an experienced campaigner, has his task cut out as the Opposition DMK has already expressed that he would act on their plea for a floor test in the wake of the Palaniswami government being reduced to a "minority" following the August 22 revolt by 19 MLAs owing allegiance to sidelined AIADMK leader TTV Dhinakaran against the Chief Minister.

Maharashtra Governor Ch Vidyasagar Rao had been given additional charge of the state since September 2016 before Kovind appointed Purohit as Governor of Tamil Nadu.

Ganga Prasad sworn in as the new Governor of Meghalaya

Shillong, Oct 6:Former BJP leader from Bihar, Ganga Prasad was sworn in as the new Governor of Meghalaya at Raj Bhawan in Shillong yesterday. The oath of office was administered by the Chief Justice of High Court of Meghalaya Justice Dinesh Maheshwari. Meghalaya Chief Minister Mukul Sangma, cabinet ministers and officials were present on the

occasion. The Chief Minister while welcoming the new Governor, said that the State was looking forward to working together for the development of the State. Meanwhile outgoing Assam Governor, Banwarilal Purohit was given a ceremonial farewell by Chief Minister Sarbananda Sonowal and his cabinet colleagues at the Lokopriyo Gopinath Bordoloi International Airport yesterday.

DMK Working President and Leader of Opposition, MK Stalin, who had earlier welcomed Purohit's appointment, had expressed confidence yesterday that the new Governor would "take appropriate action" on its plea for a floor test of the AIADMK government.
"We believe he will not function

like the (previous) Governor incharge (Rao). We believe he is arriving here to be sworn-in as Governor, well aware of the present political situation in Tamil Nadu and that its ruling dispensation has lost majority," Stalin, who participated in today's swearing-in of Purohit as Governor, had said on Thursday.

"We are, therefore, confident that he will for sure take appropriate steps in that regard," he had said an apparent reference to opposition demands for a floor test of the Palaniswami government. He said the DMK had approached the court seeking direction to the governor to order for a floor test of the Palaniswami government "after

having lost confidence" in Rao.
