The US and the Philippines have separately blacklisted the Abu Savvaf as a terrorist organisation for carrying out deadly bombings, extortion, kidnappings for ransom, and beheadings of locals and foreigners, including Christian missionaries in the south.

Heavy firing along LoC after Abdul Basit's 'peace talks

suspension' statement ANI Srinagar, April 10: Pakistani troops

resorted to unprovoked ceasefire violation along the Line of Control (LoC) in Poonch Sector in Jammu and Kashmir around early Sunday morning.

They fired mortar fire and automatics from around 4.30 p.m., which was responded "appropriately" by the India troops, said a statement issued by Defence PRO here. Indian troops retaliated in equal measure.

However, no casualty or damage was reported, added the PRO. The firing resumed after Pakistan
