# MU postpones Assistant Registrar written test after DESAM despoiled answer papers

Imphal, April 3: The written
test for recruitment of
Assistant Registrar posts in
Manipur University has been cancelled after a group of DESAM (Democratic Students Alliance of Manipur) volunteers forcefully enter inside the examination hall and despoiled answer papers

today.
According to a source from DESAM, the written test had been disrupted by volunteers of the student body in protest against the improper recruitment of some important posts by the present Vice Chancellor of the varsity, Prof H Nandakumar Sarma.

Apart from showing favoritism to his relatives and close friends, Nandakumar Sarma had made various fraudulent recruitments under alleged. While demanding to clarify on improper recruits to



various posts, DESAM had sent memorandum to Prime Minister and HRD Ministry. It also imposed ban on further recruitment in the university till a clarification is made from the side of the concerned authority regarding improper recruitments, said the source, who is also an executive member of DESAM.

The DESAM member said that above 50 volunteers of the student body entered inside the examination hall today at around 11.15 AM and snatched away answer papers from the candidates. They then tore and threw away the

#### Security arrangements beefed up for first phase of polling for assembly elections in Assam, WB

New Delhi, April 3: Tight Sonowal, are in the fray. Our security arrangements have correspondent reports, all been made for the first phase of Assam and West Bengal Assembly polls which will be held tomorrow. In Assam, nearly 94 lakh voters are expected to exercise their franchise in this phase. A total of 539 candidates, including Chief Minister Tarun Gogoi and BJP Chief Ministerial candidate Sarbananda

arrangements are being made to conduct polls in a free and fair manner.

In West Bengal, 18 Assembly seats spread across districts of West Midnapore, Purulia and Bankura will go to polls in this phase. Around 5,000 polling stations have been set up for almost 38 lakh voters. Multiple layers of security,

comprising both central and state police forces, are being made. Two-phased polling was announced for 126-member Assam Assembly, while for the West Bengal Assembly, which has 294 members, voting will be held in six phases.

# NIA officer shot dead, wife seriously injured

New Delhi April 3: An officer posted with the National Investigation Agency (NIA) was shot dead while his wife seriously injured by unidentified bike-borne assailants in the wee hours in Bijnor district of north Indian state of Uttar Pradesh on

Sunday. "Tanzil Ahmad was shot dead

by two motorcycle borne persons when he was returning after attending a marriage ceremony with his wife Farzana," IG (Law and Order) Bhagwan Swaroop said. The incident took place at 12:45 AM when Ahmed, an assistant commandant with BSF who was currently on deputation in NIA, was returning from Bijnor.

In New Delhi, NIA IG Sanjeev Kumar termed it as a "planned attack"

"One of our officers, very brave officer Mohammad Tanzil Ahmad had gone to his home to attend a function last night. When he was coming back from the function a planned attack took place on him and he was fired upon.
"He was killed in the firing

SHO, Bijnor, Rajkumar said the "officer along with his wife was returning from the wedding of his niece when two unidentified bike-borne persons stopped his car and shot at him. He was declared dead at a nearby hospital".

His wife sustained serious injuries in the attack, police said. To a question, Swaroop said it is not clear whether Ahmed was part of the team in the Pathanko attack investigation case.
