'Surgical strike' inside Myanmar by Army?

New Delhi, Aug. 20: A major gunbattle took place between Army troops and suspected National Socialist Council of Nagaland (Khaplang) militants along the India-Myanmar border, in the Mon district of Nagaland, on Friday. Unconfirmed media reports said at least 30 Indian reports said at least 30 Indian paratroopers had conducted a "surgical strike" inside Myanmar, and quoted the NSCN-K+ as claiming that it had killed "five to six" commandos, However, Army sources rejected the reports and said the gunbattle took place inside Indian territory. The fierce encounter took place near Throilu village in Mon district on "our side of the border" at about 5.30am, said Army sources. "Our troops had laid an ambush along a known infiltration route. After the ensuing gunfight, the militants fled back into Myanmar. They left some weapons behind. There were no casualties on our side," said a source.

In June last year+, days after militants had killed 18 Army soldiers, Indian special forces had conducted a surgical military strike across the Myanmar border to inflict "significant casualties" on the groups behind that ambush, NSCN (K) and Kanglei Yawol Kanna Lun (KYKL). Soldiers of Assam Rifles and NSCN(K) cadres exchanged heavy fire at about 4am near Chenmoho in Nagaland's Mon district, which shares its eastern border with Myanmar, state police said on Friday.

"There was heavy exchange of fire between NSCN (K) cadres and Assam Rifles soldiers. The incident was reported early in the morning. As of now, no casualties have been reported," Yangba Konyak, SP (Mon), was quoted as saying by news agencies. Sources said senior officials had reached the spot for stock-taking, NSCN(K) is a banned militant outfit which last March abrogated a 14year-old ceasefire with the Centre. (Courtesy TOI)

No report of casualty has been reported so far but it is expected that some casualty could have been cause to the cadres of ZUF. The cadres escaped as security troops reinforce. The security later conducted mass search operation till late today evening but no report of any arrest made.

Missing focus in the proposed Manipur Regulation of Non-Local People Act, 2016,

After reading the draft bill, Para 9 may create more doubts and problems in near future.

Para 9 " No suit, prosecution or other legal proceedings

shall lie against any officer of the State Government for anything which is good faith done or intended to be done under this act".
This ambiguous statement may create more troubles in near

future in implementation of the bill. This clause doesn't give any remedy for grievance redressal. We, human beings are bound to make mistakes. Even District Judges, High Court Judges gives erroneous judgements which go against the principle of natural justice. This is the reason why we have the process of Appeals. We can appeal to higher authority

But the para 9 of the said bill prevented us from going anywhere when we are harassed by State Officials. Nepotism, Communalism, Corruption are deeply engraved inside the Machinery of State Government and State Politics In such environment, citizens are harrased on day to day basis by those people who are in power. Even we are being harrassed by VDF, Police personnel who are answerable to the rule of law.Also, conditions of Manipur is not conducive to development. Bandh, Blockades, Disturbances, Threats, Gun culture etc. are our tradition.

In this condition, how can we expect a State Government

Official to discharge his duties wholeheartedly and without any bias. In his course of action, he commits mistakes and will surely commit mistakes in order to fulfill the immediate requirements. When Officials commit mistakes, ultimate sufferer is the normal people. Officials may act against local/ non local people. A tribe from Nagaland/Mizoram may suffer in the hands of Meetei Officials. A Bihari visitor may be manhandled by State Officials. A muslim from other states/ countries who comes on religious tour may be harassed by a Meetei Official A local Manipuri may be harassed by State Officials for non compliance of rules. We can imagine in a number of ways because duties , power and functions of State Officials are not clearly spelt out. Where will we go and submit our grievances when the Bill has already given immunity to State Official in good faith? In AFSPA 1958, Officers/Jawans can shoot anybody who he thinks terrorist, because he is being given immunity from prosecution. it seems that, due to long rule of AFSPA, our mind has started working on the lines of AFSPA!!

So, instead of giving immunity to erring officials, it will be better to delete the said para. Instead, a mechanism for

grievance redressal may be added.

Imphal, Aug. 20: The upgraded Advanced Landing Ground (ALG) at Pasighat in Arunachal Pradesh was inaugurated by Hon'bleShKirenRijijuMoS for Home Affairs in the presence of Air Marshal C Hari Kumar AVSM VM VSM, Air Officer Commanding-in-chief (AOC-in-C), Eastern Air Command on Friday. The event was attended by a large number of civil and military dignitaries including the Chief Secretary and Secretary Civil Aviation Arunachal Pradesh and Air Vice Marshal Manavendra Singh VrC VSM, Senior Officer-in-Charge Administration, Eastern Air Command Shillong. A flypast by a formation of three Sukhoi-30 MKI Air Dominance Fighter aircraft.

that took off from one of the forward EAC airbases was a highlight of the event. This was followed by a Su-30MKI was followed by a Su-30MKI also landing at the ALG. The touchdown by a frontline fighter jet of the IAF at the ALG is a 'historic first' in the predominantly hilly state of Arunachal Pradesh, which has several ALGs at varying

Farlier the AOC-in-C and other senior officials who arrived at the ALG by an An-32 aircraft from Shillong and were received by the Chief Construction Engineer (North East Project). Also, the Hon'ble Union Minister had arrived in a BSF helicopter. Thus it was a rare sight to see many different types of aircraft at this forward airfield.

The new runway surface and other infrastructure built are similar to the other upgraded ALGs that have been inaugurated in the recent months. Replete with facilities such as aprons for ground manouevering, Air Traffic Control Tower, perimeter road and a security wall, the ALG will facilitate operations of fixed wing aircraft as well as helicopters of both civil and military operators.
The ALG at Pasighat will

facilitate air connectivity with rest of the country and give a huge fillip to tourism in the state of Arunachal Pradesh. The pristine and picturesque landscape of Pasighat, on the banks of river Siang, will become accessible to rest of the world. The unspoilt natural

beauty of the area is sure to round of prosperity and happiness for the local population . AAI is in the process of setting up a civil terminal, the construction of which has yet to commence. Now the need of the hour is for all agencies to get together and make it happen.

The ALG at Pasighat was taken over by the IAF in February 2010. Previously, it was small strip that was partly paved, partly grassy, and reinforced with perforated steel plates. It was utilized in the past for air maintenance sorties and casualty evacuation by the IAF. Commercial helicopter operations were also being undertaken from the helipads

that existed earlier.

It may be recalled that following a MoU between Government of Arunachal Pradesh and Ministry of Defence in June 2009, the IAF had embarked on an ambitious reconstruction plan to upgrade eight ALGs, including infrastructure development at an overall outlay of nearly Rs.

The ALGs a Walong, Ziro, Along, Mechuka and Pasighat have since been upgraded and are operational now. Two ALGs at Tuting and Tawang are expected to be ready by the year end, while the ALG at Vijaynagar would undertake for reconstruction as soon as the road connectivity between Miao and Vijavnagar is restored.
