Twin blasts rock Imphal ahead of Independence Day

Imphal, Aug 10: Twin IED blasts at two different places today rock the state capital Imphal amidst tight security measures being taken up ahead of the Independence Day celebration. According to police source, the first blast took place at around 9 AM near sentry post of the Border Security Force (BSF) at Maphou Barrage site under Lamlai Police Station in Imphal East District. A minor girl sustained injury while she was playing nearby at Moirang Pural Village. The minor girl identified as Tinoy (7 years), daughter of Sagoulang Singshit of Maphou Village, is undergoing at Christian Hospital at Dewland. The second blast took place at around 12:45 this afternoon beside the Leishang Hidden canal about 300 metres away



to the East from the Main Gate of Manipur University at Canchipur under Singjamei Police Station in Imphal West. No one was injured in the blast. A source said that the IED was planted among the earth pile up for road construction work at the road side.

Police constable candidates call weeklong NH economic blockade

In a press release signed by the secretary of the association L.Nandakishor Sharma, it is stated that even after four years of conducting the recruitment test for 2000 Police Constable posts by conducting physical test, written test and viva voce, the government instead of declaring the result conducted another written test for recruitment of 2052 Police constable. The association said that it had undertaken several form of protest earlier and as the government turn blind to the demand of the candidates, the association now had decided to call a weeklong economic blockade along the National Highway.

Rebel groups boycott Indian Independence Day; calls total shut down on August 15

Imphal, Aug 10: A joint statement of the United National Liberation Front of WESEA (UNLFW), Coordination Committee (CorCom), Manipur, Garo National Liberation Army (GNLA) and Hynniewtrep National Liberation Council (HNLC) has called on the people of the region to boycott the Indian Independence Day and said that there will be total shut down in the North East Region on August 15. The rebels said that some citizens of India will witness the fun fare of the celebration but the reality is that people of the region are always suppressed. "The continuous racist attacks on our WESEA people in mainland India, the latest being the humiliating incidence of Monika Khangembam of Manipur proves the

vulnerability of the people of our region in spite of carrying the stamp of genuine citizenship and passport", the joint statement said. The joint statement also elaborated on how the draconian act like AFSPA had been imposing in the region to suppress the people of the region said that people of the region should voice together for freedom of the people. The statement further appealed to avoid public gatherings and students to stay at home to boycott the Indian National celebrations. "Our target is the Indian occupational forces, not a single civilian. But, the occupation forces use civilians as shields and even trick the innocents to walk on to danger and threat to life", the rebels give warning to the mass. The statement also said that

from 1 am till 6 pm of August 15, all public and private transportation should stop service, all shops and markets should close shutters and educational institutions should remain closed. However, essential and humanitarian services are exempted from this total shutdown during the stipulated hours, added the statement.

KCP-MC declares 12 hours public curfew on August 15

KCP Poirei put another charge for corruption to JNIMS director

A press statement of the outfit said that the JNIMS director, Dr. L Deven who was regularised by violating the RR is sending out feeble to collect money from the various contract employees of JNIMS for

regularisation of their post. The outfit also continues its allegation to the JNIMS director saying that in order to conceal his misdeed to turn the JNIMS into his earning field, Dr. L Deven blind the people by providing treatment to some few person who are living under poverty line. The outfit has reiterated the allegations levelled against the JNIMS director in charge and warned of serious

consequences. It appealed the concern authority to look into the matter and take up appropriate action. In today's press statement the outfit said that the JNIMS director under its organisation "All Non Regular Employee Association JNIMS" had been collecting money ranging from Rs. 70,000 to 90,000 depending upon the nature of their post. The outfit said that it can provide all necessary documents for collection of the money.

The outfit also appealed the civil society organisation of the state to find out the misdeed of the JNIMS director who had been violating all rules instead of blindly putting him as a symbol as it would have great impact to the society. The outfit further said that money can't compromise to the party's stand against the director.

Manipur Maoist greets people on its 5th Foundation Day

Imphal, Aug 10: Maoist Communist Party Manipur (MCPM) greets the people of the region on occasion of its fifth foundation day. The rebel group extended its revolutionary salute and thanks the people for the believing in the party's activities and ideology. In a lengthy press statement the outfit narrated on how the MCPM came into existence. The statement said that MCPM was born after the then government of Manipur had tried to suppress the activities of the Manipur Forward Youth Front (MAFYF) in 2008. Saying that the faith in MAFYF is gaining momentum with the birth of MCPM, the outfit said that the struggle of the Party has been enhancing and increasing its forceful blow day by day. The statement further said that When the Party was about to appear in form and figure in 2011, one comrade Ngamkholet Baitte (Vice - President) was murdered in Tupi hill in Chandel district, Manipur by a reactionary gang party at his own village. In the year 2012 while the military wing of the Party was in formative stage Comrade Iboncha from Napet village got killed at the hand of Imphal East Commando team. In the beginning of

2013, leader of New People's Militia (NPM), comrade Hijam Pritam took his last breath at the hand of a reactionary group in a hill range of Yairipok in Thoubal district. The Party faced a great obstacle in formation of military wings after the death of those brave comrades who were well aware of deep and introspective knowledge of the organisation of military wing. Even though the first stage of the initial stage of the formation of the Party was desperately difficult at its zenith that the military group, the New People's Militia (NPM) could be formed was a great success. In its second staged, the Party put full labour to organise military groups in its complete form by collecting new young and dynamic youngsters from new generations from various quarters in Manipur in 2014. With the great success of the formation of the Military wings from the beginning of May, 2015 the aim of the Party to establish a complete unique feature of the Army groups of the Party was unfulfilled and uncompleted, the MCPM statement said. "The formation of the military wings could be made in the month of September, 2015. Thus the Party's consistent efforts

So, the MCPM said that they keep those under strict training for six months. Some of those who could not bear the obstacles and difficulties in the bad times of the Party's initial stage of complete formation stayed away from the Party. The main persons who were responsible for organising and promoting of the Party became absconders in Lamangdong circle and that led a big communication gap among the comrades of the area which made the Party face a big trouble and risk.
