UNC rolls heads over lifting of economic Blockade

Imphal, Dec. 24: Members of the United Naga Council (UNC) have rolled heads over lifting of 53 days long indefinite economic blockade from both the National Highways which connect the Main land India with Manipur. A Highly reliable source said that pressure to lift the blockade by Union Home Ministry through its parent body the NSCN-IM, has left with no choice with the UNC but to find a reasonable may to lift the blockade as soon as possible the UNC functionaries are looking forward to lift the blockade as Christmas gift, the source added.
The source also added that

Naga body decried the idea of lifting the blockade as soon of the demand made by them has been considered. The UNC has been demanding rolls back of the new district creations and release of the two UNC leaders without condition.

On the proposal for release of the two UNC leader who are in police custody without any condition, some leaders of UNC argued that their demands has nothing to do with the release of the two functionaries. They stand firms on their demands for roll back of the decision of reportedly left Senapati for Dimapur to discuss the prevailing situation with their

parent body.

Imphal, Dec 24: A delegation of the All Manipur Working Journalists' Union (AMWJU) today met the union Home Minister Rajnath Singh and er Rajnath Singh and urged him to wipe out the suffering of the various communities in the state due to the ongoing economic blockade called by the United Naga Council. AMWJU

President Wangkhemcha Shamjai, General Secretary Jit Ningomba, Vice president Asem Bhakta and Executive member Sunzu Bachaspatimayum today met the Union Home Minister at his residence at Akbar Road New Delhi at 9.30 am. The team deliberated the Union Home Minister about the suffering of the people arisen out of the prolonged economic blockade by UNC. A statement of the AMWJU said that Union Home



Minister Rajnath asked them whether the economic blockade is still underway. Earlier, expressing concern over the long blockade of a highway connecting Manipur, the Home Ministry on Thursday rapped the state government for "failing" to discharge its "constitutional" flow of traffic on roads despite repeated requests

Home Minister Rajnath Singh also asked Nagaland Chief Minister T R Zeliang to ensure there is no disturbance in the movement of vehicles passing through his state, as there have been reports of the Naga Students Federation calling for a blockade of vehicles in Nagaland.

In a stern message to Manipur Chief Minister O Ibobi Singh, Rajnath said the state is

Health sector in Manipur transformed significantly

Imphal, Dec. 24, 2016: Manipur has witnessed a drastic change in its health sector in the last 15 years. The government has been wise enough to know that health sector should be given utmost priority and over Rs 800 Crores was invested during this period.

The state has invested around 4% of the Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) annually in public health expenditure, as compared to the national average of 1.8% only. Health sector was improved considerably in both hills and valley areas alike, and hospitals in remote hill areas got a major makeover. New hospital buildings with all

necessary infrastructures and staff were inaugurated at Ukhrul, Senapati, Churachandpur, Bishnupur, Thoubal and nearing completion in the case of Chandel and Tamenglong. In total, 13 Community Health Centres (CHCs), 63 Primary Health Centres (PHCs), 336 Primary Health Sub-Centre (PHSCs) and 343 staff quarters have been constructed so far.

Moreover, the Government of India-initiative National Health Mission is being successfully implemented in the state with about 2000 trained staff supplementing health efforts of the state government. In a very laudable effort, the

Government of Manipur has established Jawaharlal Nehru Institute of Medical Sciences (JNIMS), the first state-run medical institute, with an intake of 100 MBBS seats. Also, a BSc Nursing College was established.

Public-private partnership in health sector was made effective and hence, resulted in significant development of Shija Hospital, Sky Hospital, Jeevan Hospital and Christian Hospital. With this partnership, these hospitals are now charging less fees or providing free service to those patients under Below Poverty Line (BPL) and Economically Weaker Section (EWS), 75 out of 85 PHCs and 7 PHSCs were made into 24X7 delivery centres. 102 (One-Zero-Two) Call Centre dial-up ambulance facility have been made functional too.

On the other hand, health indicators saw a significant improvement in the last 15 years. Infant Mortality Rate (IMR), which was 29 before 15 years, has now been reduced coverage increased by 17 % from 76.2 to 93.1 %. Number of Doctors in Position increased from 615 to 1068. The HIV menace in the state, too, witnessed sharp decline. During this period, the HIV Sero Positivity Rate reduced drastically by 94 %. This rate, in the case of pregnant women, also reduced by 91%. Significant number for various posts of health sector were created and recruited. At present, the State has over 1700 MBBS doctors, including 265-plus PG Holders and 350plus Clinical Specialists. Also, adequate number of nursing and para-medical staff have been recruited and deployed. The number of ANM/FHW in position increased from 412 to 543; while Dental Surgeons in Position saw 140% increase from 37 to 89 Allocation of the Health Plan Budget from the total Plan Outlay was increased from 2.8 % to 7%, which is much higher than national average,

The meeting also agreed that all CSOs of both the hills and valley should work together to resolve the existing issues and restore normalcy in the state.
