

Dr Jitendra Singh and Shri Kiren Rijiju inaugurate the festival 'Destination North-East-2016'

PIB New Delhi, Feb. 12: The Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) Development of North-Eastern Region (DoNER), MoS PMO, Personnel, Public Grievances, Pensions, Atomic Energy and Space, Dr. Jitendra Singh and Minister of State for Home Affairs, Shri Kiren Rijiju inaugurated the festival 'Destination North-East-2016' here today. The festival is being organised by the Ministry of Development of North-Eastern Region (DoNER) and Ministry of Culture. The festival will showcase the inherent economic, social and cultural strength of the North East Region (NER) at the national level. While inaugurating the festival, Dr Jitendra Singh said that the North-East will be developed into a key destination for young entrepreneurs and Startups. He also said that North East festivals will be organised in Mumbai and Bangalore in the coming months. He said that direct flight from Delhi to Dimapur is a major step in making North East more accessible. The rest of India needs to be connected with North East in a meaningful way, he added. He said that the Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi is taking keen interest in the development of North East. He also emphasised upon the need to upgrade academic institutions in the North East to provide quality education and develop the human

resource. At the inaugural function, Shri Kiren Rijiju said that the Development has nothing to do with distance and location. The growth engine is built on the aspirations of people, not location. The Chief Minister of Meghalaya Dr. Mukul Sangma said that despite the geographical constraints, there is a growth momentum taking shape in the North-East. There is a need to tap the unique and exclusive strengths of the North East, he added. He said that it is time to carry forward the momentum more aggressively. Emphasising on the role of Bamboo in the growth of the economy of the North East, he said that Bamboo, the wonder grass, can be a real game changer for the North East. The Secretary, Ministry of Tourism Shri Vinod Zutshi said that Government of India has been giving special focus on North East tourism promotion and facilitation. He said that the North East is an unexplored paradise within Incredible India.

Shri Naveen Verma, Secretary, Ministry of DoNER said that Destination North East is a collaborative platform made possible by cooperation of various Ministries and State Governments. The inauguration is being followed by sessions on Initiatives taken for Development of North-Eastern Region, Holistic Development of Tourism in the North-East - Exploring the unexplored and Opportunities for IT and ITES in the NER tomorrow. On Day-2, panel discussions will be held on enhancing scope of livelihood in North-East, Micro Finance for inclusive growth, Startup opportunities and challenges in NER, Growing up value chain from Handloom to Fabrics to Garments, need-based Skill Development and entrepreneurship promotion in NER and positioning the North-East Handicraft in the domestic and international market as a premium brand. Cultural events include North-East folk music and dance choreography, Bihu dance featuring the acclaimed Smt. Madhurima, folk medley

choreographed by Guru Madhurima Choudhury, popular rock music of North-East - performance by the Reverse Tragedy Band, Folk fusion and crossover music and Fashion Show of NIFT. Competitions for school children will also be held such as Quiz, Dance (solo & group) and Singing (Hindustani, Indian Pop, Western Pop and Classical). The three-day mega event will include theme specific

Business Summit consisting of sectors like Tourism, Agriculture, Food Processing, Skill Development & Entrepreneurship, IT, Handloom & Handicrafts, Livelihood, Micro-Finance and Start ups. Destination North East will enable various Central Ministries to showcase their initiatives in North East India. The event will also have cultural programmes to showcase the rich culture and folk dances of North East India.

JNU students union president arrested over controversial event

PTI New Delhi, Feb 12: JNU students union president Kanhaiya Kumar was arrested today in connection with a case of sedition and criminal conspiracy over holding of an event at the prestigious institute against hanging of Parliament attack convict Afzal Guru.

(criminal conspiracy) of IPC against unknown persons at Vasant Kunj (North) Police station following complaints by BJP MP Maheish Giri and ABVP. "Kanhaiya Kumar has been arrested in connection with the case," a senior police official said. Two policemen in plain clothes came to the JNU campus today and picked up Kumar for questioning. He was later arrested, sources said. A group of students on Tuesday held an event on the JNU campus and allegedly shouted slogans against the hanging of Parliament attack convict Afzal Guru in 2013. The event occurred despite varsity administration having cancelled the permission following a complaint by ABVP members, who termed the activity as "anti-national". The JNU administration has already instituted a "disciplinary" enquiry as to how the event took place despite withdrawal of permission and said it will wait for the probe report before taking any further action.

Death toll due to Swine flu rises to 27 this year in Rajasthan

Jaipur, Feb 12: In Rajasthan, with the death of two more Swine flu patients, the toll has risen to 27 this year. According to Health Department, twelve deaths have been reported from Jaipur, while four persons died to the H1N1 virus in Ajmer and two in Churu and rest are from other cities. According to health officials, 1088 samples were taken and 131 were found positive. Out of positive cases, eighty-four have been reported from Jaipur, eight from Alwar and seven from Kota while rest are from other cities.

India today continues its stunning show at 12th South Asian Games

Agency Guwahati, Feb 12: India today continued its stunning show in Shooting at the 12th South Asian Games. They swept both the 10 metre Standard Pistol individual as well as team event. In the Individual section, Neeraj Kumar bagged the Gold, with Gurpreet Singh claiming the Silver, and Mahendra Singh taking the Bronze. The trio also won Gold in the team event. Indian shooters have, now, claimed 10 Gold, 6 Silver and 4 Bronze medals in the Games. In Marathon, India took 2 Gold



and a Bronze today as the Athletics events ended. In the Men's section, Nitender Singh Rawat claimed the

coveted yellow metal, with Khetia Ram taking the Bronze. In the Women's category, Kavitha Raut clinched the top

honours. India now has 144 Gold, 79 Silver and 21 Bronze. In Kabaddi, Indian Men's team defeated Nepal, 47-23 in a group match. Tonight, in Hockey, India will take on Pakistan for the Gold medal at 8 PM. Thursday night, Indian eves had defeated Sri Lanka, 10-0 to clinch the South Asian Games' first Women's Hockey Gold medal. India will also figure in Men's and Women's medal matches in Taekwondo, besides Handball and Football.
