Combing Operation Conducted

Imphal, Jan 22: Taking security measures ahead of the upcoming Republic Day Celebration, Imphal East and Imphal West Commandos conducted search operations at different areas of the state today morning at 4 am to 6 am.
 Team of Imphal East Police led by Additional SP (OPS) W Singhajit conducted search operation at Nahabam Bamon leikai area. Around 250 people both male and female between the ages of 15 to 50 years were verified. 2 persons who could not produce identity proof documents were detained at Porompat Police Station for further verification.
 On the other hand, a search operation was also conducted at Wahengbam Leikai, Imphal West under the supervision of Additional SP (OPS) O Bikramjit where around 200 people including female were verified but 5 persons have been detained for further verification.

Myanmar to release political prisoners before power transfer

Yangon, Jan. 22: Myanmar's outgoing administration of President Thein Sein will free about 15 political prisoners on Friday, and may release scores more, an official from the President's Office and activists from Assistance Association for Political Prisoners told Reuters.
 The release comes days before Aung San Suu Kyi's National League for Democracy (NLD) is due to form the government following its landslide victory in the November 8 election and an appeal by the United States to release political prisoners.

 Diver of the diesel auto r/c MN01F3844, Kojenbam Rojit Kumar (28) s/o Kojenbam Tomba of Phumlou said that the Maruti 800 hit his auto when he was coming from

Imphal to Phumlou carrying the passengers where all the passengers sustained injuries.
 Eye witness said the driver of maruti 800 seems to be in alcoholic state. Taking the charge of the locals attending the injured passengers, the drivers manage to escape the scene. The injured passengers have been admitted at RIMS casualty ward. Among the injured passengers 2 girls studying in 7 and 11 standard also sustained injuries.
 Rojit suffered injury on his forehead and left arm while some of the passengers suffer major injuries.
 A case has been registered by the Lamsang Police Station. The driver of the Maruti 800 is absconding while the vehicle has been picked up by police.

Woman entrepreneur encourages youth to become self reliant in Manipur

Imphal, Jan. 22: Twenty-seven-year-old Nongmaithem Momita who hails from Yaiskul Chingakham Leirak is one of the Manipur's most promising entrepreneurs, and is running a food processing unit.
 After her post graduation in commerce, she expanded her mother's business and launched 'Mom's Goo Goo Food', a food processing unit in June 2015. She employs a staff of five people and plans to further expand the business.
 "At first my mom, dad and I were part of this business. My mom would do the cooking and my dad would help in the packaging and then I would sell it to the retailers. Now, we are able to provide employment opportunities to five to six women in our locality and there are many more who are willing to work in my unit but due to lack of funds or some other issues we cannot hire them. However, we will soon employ them and further increase the production," said Momita.
 "When I started for the first time, this business was very small. I used to buy two to three kilos of meat and prepare it



alone. Sometimes, my husband used to help me in packaging and I would sell it only for Rs. 10 per packet. Now, we have different ranges of products because of my daughter's hard work," said Nongmaithem Luxmi, Mother of Momita.

The unit produces items like dry meat with spice, dry meat with bamboo shoot, dry meet shingju and pork meat pickle. These products are also available in the local shops.
 "It is very good. Now we have only four items and we are planning to produce more other items. I am earning around 6000- 7000 per month. Before I used to depend on my husband but now I have my own income so I manage my own expenditure and other household requirements," said Chongtham Ongbi Sunita, a staff
 "If we produce more products and improve the quality then there is a chance that we can export. The food quality is very good and it's very hygienic. We have not registered any complaint about the product," said Pholendro, a retailer customer.
 The Centre's 'Skill India' initiative will motivate more women entrepreneurs from the northeast to start new ventures.
 It will also help boost the economy and generate more employment opportunities.
