BJP Manipur Pradesh demands resignation of CM Ibobi and suspension of IW SP Dr. AK Jhalajit

Imphal, Jan 29: BJP Manipur Pradesh today demanded immediate suspension of Imphal West SP Dr. AK Jhalajit who had ordered to kill Ch. Sanjit to a Manipur Police head constable S. Herojit Singh in broad daylight of July 23, 2009 at Khwairambandh Keithel when he was then Additional SP of Imphal West district, until the case is disposed. The political party also demanded resignation of Chief Minister Okram Ibobi Singh who was in charge of the Home department at the time of the incident.

In a press statement, Th. Chaoba, President, BJP Manipur Pradesh said that after revelation by head constable Herojit it is now certain that more truth in the fake encounter killings will come up. The state BJP President appealed the central government to investigate into the matter of what head constable S. Herojit had revealed to media and punished all those involved in committing the heinous crime as according to the law of the land. The press statement by BJP Manipur Pradesh president also stated that a case is now

pending in the Supreme Court of India over the alleged fake encounter case at which 1528 persons were killed during the last 30 years. Among these cases 1200 persons were killed during 2002 to 2012 when congress government is in power in the state with Okram Ibobi Singh as the Chief Minister. The killing of pregnant woman Rabina and 23 years old youth Sanjit in staged encounter on July 23, 2009 was also occurred during the tenure of Okram Ibobi Singh. The July 23, 2009 alleged encounter spark spontaneous protest across the state

freezing all normal life in the state. Th. Chaoba said that a PIL has been filed in the Guwahati High Court by the mother of Sanjit and following the directives of the court the CBI has been investigating the case. After six long years, the police constable involved in the staged encounter S Herojit had confessed to media that he had shot Sanjit by pumping 6 bullets from his 9 mm service pistol. Chaoba added that the police constable killed the unarmed youth with the order of his superior officer, the then Additional SP and now holding the post of SP Imphal West Dr. Ak. Jhalajit. Chaoba further said that as according to the statement of Herojit, Jhalajit had assured to take all responsibility of the then Chief Minister and DGP. Chaoba also reminded what the Chief Minister had stated in the Assembly house on that day. He said that Chief Minister had stated that Sanjit was exterminated as the police had left with no other choice.

Two persons arrested

Imphal, Jan 29: Two persons were arrested in the evening of January 27 in connection with the murder of Takhellamb Beikul Singh who was found dead at Sangkholi village on January 23, 2016. Both the arrested persons have been identified as Ngaramei and Yaireingam from Kharasom Village under Sanapati District. Takhellamb Beikul (57) s/o Takhellamb Takhel Singh of Selungpham Kang Thokchao under Heirok Police Station,

Thoubal District was found dead at Sangkhal Village on January 23. Since then a FIR was lodge by the family members claiming Beikul was murdered as he left home at morning around 8:30 am of January 23 to buy a vehicle with an unknown person whom he was in touch with on the phone for the past 3/4 months. Taking up the case, a police team led by SDPO Ukhrul arrested Ngaramei and Yaireingam from Senapati Bazar and they have taken into custody for questioning.

4 kidnapped in Dima Hasao

Hailong, Jan 29: Four persons, including a member of Autonomous Council and three Congress workers, have been abducted by unidentified persons from two separate places in Assam's Dima Hasao district last night, police said here today. Jibon Kemprai, member of Dima Hasao Autonomous Council, was kidnapped from his house at Thajjuwari under Diyungba police station while three Congress workers, belonging to the Biatee community, were kidnapped from a place between Umrangshu and Sangbar under Umrangshu police station. The abducted Congress workers have been identified as Luapuaia Thaithe, Joseph Nampui and Lala Nampui. In another incident, unidentified persons fired at the residence of BJP Dima Hasao district committee General Secretary Deben Thaosan at Sengya Sambudhan Raji under Sarkari Bagan police out post here. A protest rally was taken out by members of the Biatee community demanding immediate release of persons kidnapped. Deputy Commissioner Amrendra Barua assured the delegation who met him that the culprits would be nabbed immediately and the abducted will be released.

Manipur's Kourouhanba spices industry proves a boon for jobless

Imphal, Jan. 29: A Fifty five-year-old B.Tech in Food Technology and M. Tech in Bio Technology, Potshangbam Kulachandra, runs a 'kourouhanba spices industry' that has generated job opportunities for many. Potshangbam Kulachandra who hails from Haobam Marak in Manipur served in Regional Agricultural Marketing Corporation but he resigned from his job and started his own venture. In 2015, he set up 'Korouhanba Spices Industries' at Keithelmbani village and produces different food spices items. All the raw materials used for the spices are from forest products which are free from inorganic chemicals. The unit is a source of employment for local youth, as it employs around 25 local youth. "My basic objective is to start self employment at the same time employment generating in it in the state for better economy development. I voluntarily resigned from my job after getting some experience and I

started working on this and it is my dream to start such a unit in Manipur," said Kulachandra, Chief Executive Director. The spices industry produces several items like Masala paste, Garam Masala, Vegetable Masala, Chill powder, Ginger powder, Jeera Powder, Turmeric powder, Coriander powder, Mustard powder and coarse mix spices. The products are now in high demand both in the state and outside. "I'm very happy working here. Though this income I manage

for household expenditure so it's very good," said Jeevan, a staff. "We really appreciate for giving us job because before we did not have work but here we get such opportunity and earning for our livelihood so, it's very helpful," said Lilabati, another staff. Achievements of young entrepreneurs like Kulachandra will inspire many educated unemployed youth in the region to explore new innovative ideas and become self-reliant.
