6.8 magnitude Quake in Manipur leaves 8 dead and hundreds injured

Imphal, Jan 4: The people in the North Eastern region of India were jolted from their sleep in the wee hours of the morning today when the earth shook and trembled. The quake with its epicenter at Noney, about 33 kms from the state capital of Manipur along National Highway 37 hit at 04:30 local time. Strong tremors have been felt across the entire region, even as far as Bangladesh where three people were reported killed. According to State Meteorological Department the earthquake measured 6.8 magnitude on the Richter scale and struck at a depth of 17km (about 10 miles). The tremor damaged walls and a newly-built six-storey building in Imphal collapsed police said. Other buildings were also reported to have been damaged.

The region has a history of powerful earthquakes caused by the northward collision of the Indian and Eurasian plates. They are

moving towards each other at a rate of 4-5cm per year. At the time of filing this report, eight persons were confirmed to have been killed in the disaster while more than fifty persons were hospitalized due to injuries sustained during the quake. Damage report culled from the districts also revealed a worrying pattern with most of the damaged structures and buildings having constructed by the state government. Prominent amongst the structures damaged were Ima Keithel Market No. 1 & 2 where the cracked pillars revealed hollow plastic pipes buried inside them, cracks at Minuthong Bridge. Massive cracks at the ground floor wall at BSNL building near Old Secretariat, pillars of Yairipok Bazar shed cracked,

Thoubal College building, Thoubal Wangma Taba Manishang Primary School, were crumbled in the quake. Cracks in the pillar of New Market at Bishnupur Bazar, clock tower inside Govt. Polytechnic completely crumbled, retaining wall of Mela Ground of Lamboikhongnangkong completely collapsed, YPA Hall in New Lamka partially injured, cracks at Nungba SDPO's office, Saikul market shed damaged, mud walls of 26 houses collapsed at Charbung village under Sadar Hills, along with reports of damaged powerlines and electric poles. Even the Buildings of Manipur Press Club were also crack in the tremor.

The casualty list is expected to rise over the next few days while allegation of under preparedness and public outcry over government inaction is gaining momentum.

State Govt. announces Rs. 5 lakhs compensation for quake victims

Schools close for 7 days

Imphal, Jan 4: State Government today announces Rs. 5 lakhs as compensations for each person killed in today's high voltage tremor in the state which destroyed several properties besides killing at least 8 persons. The death toll is expected to rise as rescue works are being underway at different places of the state. Number persons injured in today natural calamities has already reached 124 as according to report collected from RIMS, JNIMS and other private hospitals in and around Imphal area. Talking to reporters, spokesperson of the government M. Okendro, who

is also Minister of Education while speaking to reporters said that government will bear all necessary requirement for the treatment of those injured in today's tragedy. Besides, the education Minister said the state cabinet has resolved to close the schools for 7 days, for checking any damage to the school buildings to ensure safety of the students. As for the Ima Keithel which has been destroyed partially, Okendro said that the government will make alternative arrangement for the women vendors while the building is being renovated. He also said that depending upon the necessities government will

open relief camp at the required places. Meanwhile, a team of Disaster Response Team of the state government has been put into action for rescue operation besides alerting the state and central para military force, Okendro added. The Minister however said that it is too early to comment on the total loss during the tremor. On the other hand Chief Minister Okram Ibobi Singh along with other cabinet ministers and MLAs today visited RIMS, JNIMS and Raj Medcity and inspected the condition of the injured who are undergoing treatment at hospital.

Kiren Rijju & Dr. Jitendra arrives

Imphal, Jan 4: Union Minister of State for Home Affairs, Kiren Rijju today arrived in the state at around 2.30 pm and took stock of the present condition of the state at the aftermath of the deadly tremor which occurred in the wee hour today. Soon after his arrival at Imphal Tulihal airport Rijju said that he came to the state as per directives of the Prime Minister Narendra Modi. On a question by reporters about the loss cause by the tremor Rijju said that he did not have the official figures as the state government is yet to submit the detail report. He said he will be



meeting the Chief Minister to review the total loss caused by the tremor. Union Minister of State for DONER Dr. Jitendra also

arrived in the state hours after the MoS Home. Both the central government representative jointly met the state government authority.

20 injured, buildings damaged in Assam quake

Imphal, Jan 4: At least 20 people have been injured in Assam in the massive earthquake that hit the northeastern region this morning with scores of buildings developing cracks across the state. "We have so far received reports of minor injuries to 20 people in Guwahati and other areas due to the earthquake. Either some goods fell on them or they were probably injured while rushing out of home. Detail reports are awaited," Assam Commissioner and Secretary (Disaster Management) Pramod Kumar Tiwari told

news agency PTL. All the injured are being treated and they are out of danger, he added. Kamrup Metropolitan Deputy Commissioner M Angamuthu said at least 15 people were injured in Guwahati city and all are being treated. "Most of them were injured while running out of home. They are out of danger. We have also received reports of at least 30 buildings developing cracks. This number will go up," he added. Mr Tiwari said there are reports coming in of cracks in many buildings across the

state due to the earthquake, but no major damage in those so far. He said the official residence of the Additional Deputy Commissioner of Cachar district, which is near the epicentre at Tamenglong in Manipur, was damaged. The Fire Station building in Cachar along with many other installations in the district also developed cracks, he added. One library building in Lakhimpur district has been damaged, Mr Tiwari said. "In Guwahati also, many buildings have been reported to be cracked in the earthquake. We are

examining the claims of the people. The exact report of damage will be known after some time," he added. Prime Minister Narendra Modi said that NDRF team has been instructed to move from Guwahati to the areas affected by the earthquake. A major earthquake with a magnitude of 6.7 on the Richter Scale rocked Eastern and North-Eastern parts of India early in the morning today, the Indian Meteorological Department said. The quake occurred at 4:35 am at a depth of 17 km below the ground and the epicentre is located at Tamenglong of Manipur.

Vendor ladies decry over failure to maintain quality in constructing Khwairambandh Keithel

Imphal, Jan 4: Vendor women of Kwairambandh Ima Keithel today denounced the state government over its failure to maintain quality in the construction of Kwairambandh Keithel. The vendor ladies showed the crumbled portion of the Kwairambandh Keithel to reporters and questioned why the pillars were damaged during the tremor while other pillars were not damaged to that quantity. She showed the reporters hollow pipes being used inside the pillar instead of iron rod. Talking to reporters at Ima Keithel President of Keithel Phambi Apunba Lup, Laishram Mema expressed displeasure to the attitude of the Chief Minister and those in the government. "Why none of them come and inspect the condition of the Kwairambandh Keithel even after 9 hours", she asked and further said that if the tremor happened at peak hours, many could have lost their lives.



She further said that CM even tried to stay away from meeting the vendor lady who went to visit him. The apunba lup of the Kwairambandh Keithel was been requesting the state government to look into the damages of the building since they have sifted. No concern authority has showed up so far except for Chairperson and Executive officer of IMC, she added. L Mema further said that if the state government must set up an inquiry and a harsh punishment must be serve

against those responsible in the construction of the building which has been damaged in today's earthquake. If the government fails to take up any measurement regarding the women shed, a team of 150 women vendors are set to meet the Prime Minister of India to details the exact situation being faced by the women vendors. They will leave for Delhi on January 29 and will attend the Trade Union convention then will meet the PM, Mema said.
