closure of RIMS for 3 days as
deprivation to the right of the
common people, Human Rights
Initiative has put the matter
with the National Human
Rights Commission and
pleaded the commission to take
up prompt action against those
responsible to the
development.
Regional Institute of Medical
Science (RIMS), a reputed
health care institute besides
being a reputed college has
been in the news many times
in the last few years not for
good reason but for hue and
cry from patient party alleging
doctors' negligence.
Human Rights Initiative (HRI)
lodge a complaint to NHRC
against Prof. Ch. Arunkumar
Singh, Director and Prof. L.
Ranjit Singh, HOD-
Gynecology of Regional
Institute of Medical Science
(RIMS), Imphal Manipur for
shutting down OPD from 21st
July to 23rd July 2016 on the
ground that the suspension of
Dr. L Trinity Meetei during an
inquiry on Smt. Kheroda Devi,
who died during normal
delivery on 5th July 2016, will
be revoked and thereby leading
to deprivation of the right to
health of the citizens.
In the complaint, it is stated that
the closure of RIMS OPD
followed following a
suspension of a doctor
identified as Dr. Trinity who is
being alleged by a patient party
of intentional negligence after
a lady identified as Th Kheroda
Devi died during delivery at the
hospital.
It is reported that the woman
was died due to the negligence
and loopholes of doctors who
were involved in the said
delivery. In this regard, hue and
cry citizens' action/movement
led by the "JAC (Joint Action
Committee) against the Death
of Thokchom Ongbi Kheroda
Devi by the Negligence of
Doctors in RIMS Hospital" has
been carried out till date.
