## PWD irks govt. discriminatory attitude

**Imphal, June 25:** Peoples with disabilities today expressed dissatisfaction today over the state government discriminatory attitude to them.

In an email sent to Imphal Times, a disabled person said that state government authority had not arrange separate queue to submit form to Education Department for Recruitment of **Office Assistant and Multi Tasking Staff (Group D)** today.

As according to Section 47 in The Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995, all disabled should be provided equal opportunities by arranging them separate



counter for submission of the form as they are not in the position to submit the form along with normal people.

"It is unfortunate that the state education department did not recognised the disabled person", said a disabled person.

He further added that even though separate fee structure for submission of form for the

OBC, ST or SC has been mentioned but there was no fee mentioned for the People with Disabilities (PWDs).

"Fee for submission of the form for unreserved and OBC is Rs 500 and for ST/SC is Rs. 250, but there was no fee mention about the PWD", said a disabled person who had gone to submit the form at the state education department.

## Manipur Police recruitment test successful candidates threaten stir

**Imphal, June 25:** Successful candidates of the Manipur Police Constable Recruitment test for the year 2013 today threaten to launch serious form of agitation if the Chief Minister of Manipur fails to give any assurance to declare the result by July 11. An association called the All Manipur Written Test Successful Candidate of Police Constable, Male 2013, formed by the successful candidate said that they have

a meeting scheduled with the Chief Minister on July 4 and said that if the chief Minister failed to give any assurance to declare the recruitment test result candidates appeared in the examination for selection of the 200 police constable will left no choice but to undergo serious intense form of agitation.

In a press statement the organization said that written test, physical test and viva voce had already be completed and instead of

declaring the result the conduct of another fresh written test for recruitment of 2052 police constable has been conducted.

"We have no objection to the conduct of the recruitment test but it is unfortunate that they conduct the test before the declaration of the recruitment test held earlier", said the statement by President of the organization, Konthoujam Johnson.

The recruitment test for the recruitment of the 2000 constable in the year 2013 was completed on June 10 this year.

## India blamed China to cover up own fault- Maoist

**Imphal, June 25:** India never admits to its mistakes rather blames its neighbours for the same, and the same practice backfired in its effort to force its way into the Nuclear Supply Group (NSG). India blamed China for the outcome, conveniently forgetting to mention the fact that only nations who are signatory to the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT) can become a member of the NSG, of which India is not, stated a press release of the proscribed group Maoist Communist Party, Manipur. Prime Minister Narendra Modi is busy touring the globe and making goodwill gestures while using strong arm tactics on its weaker neighbors to have its way, and is suppressing the people of Manipur, Assam and Jammu and Kashmir by refusing to remove the draconian AFSPA, as a result India does not have good relation with any of its neighbours. The release also urged the people of the state to take note of the changing forms of governance and administrations across the globe so that a successful revolution can be affected.

**Agartala, June 25:** India is working towards completion of the entire border with Bangladesh by next two years time, said a top official engaged with the fencing work.

"We have agreed on an action plan in which and we are hoping that by December 2017 all the places where physical barriers are possible those barriers will be erected, if there are some riverine stretches where physical barriers are not possible we will have no physical barriers so that sealing of border can actually be done," said Sushel Kumar, Secretary Border Management under the

Union Ministry of Home Affairs.

"Fence is on requirement basis, like Tripura I have had discussion with Meghalaya, two days back I had discussion with West Bengal, so everywhere we are trying to complete the fence with the Bangladesh border. Assam we have already taken a decision that within two years we are going to seal that border. Assam has much more riverine stretches but we have decided that we will completely seal that in two years time."

After a review meeting in presence of Chief Secretary Y P Singh, DGP K Nagaraj, IG BSF J B Sangwan, District Magistrates

of all eight district of the state and various construction agencies engaged with fencing work on the progress and problems of border fencing work in Tripura-Bangladesh in the secretariat he informed this to reporters.

"All the district magistrates were here, all the agencies and BSF were here. We have discussed how to completely seal the border with Bangladesh in the state of Tripura. That is our objective," said Kumar adding: "So hurdles are because of the topography, some are because of perceptions at the local level - people's perceptions. We have

discussed with collectors and emphasised that they should open dialogue and convince people and try to see that the fence is erected."

He informed that to complete the fencing work on time and keeping in view the local issues the government of India if required will discuss with Bangladesh on raising fence at zero points at some spots.

Kumar said, "Wherever fencing is required at zero point because of certain local issues we will certainly explore that but then we have to get the government of Bangladesh to agree. That dialogue is to be done and we will see that it is done."

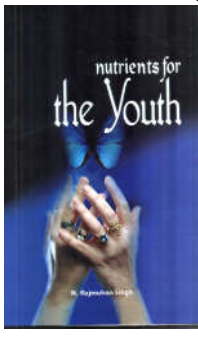
