## ILPS protest once again in frying pan

**Imphal, May 29:** Protest demanding ILPS in the state is once more in the frying pan with the student making no U-turn to their protest. The women Wing volunteers of the JICILPS Wing today gear up their protest by thronging



to the Bungalow of the Chief Minister at around 3 pm. The large number of women confronted the police in front of the CM Bungalow and many protesters sustain injury as police resorted in violent action to disperse them. At around 4 pm students staging protest at keishampat Leimajam leikai demanding released of the 2 students arrested in connection with ILPS besides demanding implementation of ILPS came to the road at keishampat started blocking the road. The police used water cannon to disperse the protesters, but they remained sited braving the police action. Women wing volunteers of the JICILPS and locals of the area too joined the protest and confronted the police for hours.

### Tamei visit -2:

## PHC with only 2 doctors provide services to over 40,000 villagers

**Imphal, May 29:** Lack of government attention to the health care condition of Tamei Villagers in Tamenglong district surprises reporters who visited the village recently. Media advertisements by the concerns officials of State Health Service authority appeared as a joke after seeing the dilapidated conditions of Government run Health care offices in the district. A team of reporters who went the village recently expressed shocked in seeing the condition of the Public Health Centre of the area. The Public Health Centre

(PHC) was the only health care service provider for all the 50 villages which have a total population of about 40 thousand people. Interesting the centre is run by only 2 MBBS Doctors and 6 nurses. Speaking to the group of reporters MO in-charge of the PHC, Dr Adani said the staffs in the centre are doing their best to provide 24x7 services. However, lack of manpower and other equipments as well as medicine remain as a big challenge of the PHC. "Malaria and Typhoid are very common diseases but they are helpless even to provide first aid medicine because of unavailability of any medicine

including life saving drugs", Dr. Adani said. It was also informed that the PCH has 8 beds but there is no sufficient mattresses, no pillows and no sufficient bed sheets. "BP machine is malfunction, Ultrasound machine installed in the PHC is for namesake only as there is no technician", the medical officer added. Besides, electricity over here is at the worst condition, no telephone network except BSNL he said. Although he was happy to inform the media team that the health centre is giving to more or less 26-30 OPD every day.

## SDPO hits police officer on duty

**Imphal, May 29:** An unusual incident today stunned a group of protestors after a police officer - serving as SDPO at Mayang Imphal Police station identified as Rameshwar allegedly assaulted a Police Sub-inspector of Wangoi Police Station identified as Priyokumar, while the later was trying to console a group of protestors demanding released of the

According to report, a team of police led by Sub-Inspector Priyokumar consoled a group of protestors at the area to let the commuters passed as they were blocking the road. The protestors in reply stated that they are not blocking the

students and those on essential service. When the police and the agitators were undergoing the in heated argument the SDPO came to the spot and allegedly hit him with a baton without saying any words. Angered over the attitude of the SDPO locals of the area turn their anger towards him. As the situation worsen the SDPO left the spot leaving the Sub-Inspector.

## VC of Manipur University and Education (S) Director worthless-Maoist

## "Take strict action against attacks on Africans"

**New Delhi, May 29:** Home Minister Rajnath Singh today asked Delhi Police Chief Alok Kumar Verma to take strict action against those involved in recent attacks against African nationals. Singh, who had called Verma to his residence, expressed concern over the attacks and said stern action be taken against the perpetrators. In the backdrop of cases of assault on African nationals and outrage by envoys of African countries over killing of a Congolese youth, External Affairs Minister Sushma Swaraj today spoke to Singh and Lieutenant Governor of Delhi Najeeb Jung to ensure safety of the community and strict action against the guilty. "Spoke to Commissioner of Police, Delhi regarding the incidents of physical assault against certain African nationals. Such incidents are condemnable," the Home

Minister said in a tweet after the meeting with Verma. He asked Delhi Police to increase patrolling in areas inhabited by African nationals and ensure their security. "Instructed CP Delhi to take strict action against the attackers and increase patrolling in these areas to ensure security of everyone," Singh tweeted. There have been spate of attacks on Africans living in the national capital, including killing of the Congolese youth. A 23-year-old Nigerian student was assaulted in Hyderabad on Wednesday. Three cases of physical assault and criminal intimidation of African nationals in South Delhi have been registered by the police. Two women — one from Uganda and the other from South Africa — and two Nigerian men in South Delhi had filed complaints of physical assault and criminal intimidation.

## Protest staged against bomb threat

**Imphal, May 29:** Local meira paibi of Awang Sekmai Khunou Mathak Leikai Meira Paibi today staged a sit-in-protest at Awang Sekmai denouncing the placing of bomb to the residence of one Kwairakpam Gouro (aged about 78) at Awang Sekmai Khunou Mathak Leikai. Gouro is a retired Assistant registrar of Co-operative Society, Manipur. report said the bomb - Chinese hand grenade was found outside the door of his kitchen and was noticed by a family member at around 5.30 pm yesterday. the bomb was retrieved by a team of Sekmai Police at around 6.30 pm. No groups or individuals have claimed responsibility of the bomb. The sit-in-protest while condemning the placing of the bomb demanded immediate clarification from those responsible to the placing of the bomb. Placards with slogans denouncing of the bomb to crowded area were used during the protest.
