Voting begins in US to elect country's 45th President

New Delhi, Nov 8: The first ballots in the US Presidential polls were cast today, just after midnight, in Dixville Notch, a sleepy hamlet, in Hampshire. New Hampshire, traditionally the first in the nation to vote on Election Day. Voters also cast ballots early today in two other small New Hampshire communities, Hart's Location and Millsfield. Unlike in India, every US state counts and declares its result once the polling is over.

A top American pollster has said, Hillary Clinton has a 70 per cent chance of winning the White House race against her rival Donald Trump. FiveThirtyEight website's Nate Silver, who accurately predicted the outcome of 2008 and 2012 presidential elections, said Clinton's projected margin of victory in the popular vote has increased to 3.5 per cent from 2.9 per cent.

Manipur University crisis

23 members of the MU's **Academic Council** members tender resignation

members of the Manipur University Academic Council, 23 of them have tender resignation from the membership in protest against the signing of the Memorandum of Understanding between the new Vice Chancellor and 4 students' body disrespecting the resolution of the Academic Council meeting

adopted on October 8. In the resignation, letter signed by 23 members of the Academic Council and submitted to the new Vice Chancellor today, the members expressed dissatisfaction to the unilateral decision of the VC Prof Adya Prasad Pandey without giving any respect to the members of the Academic

The letter wrote - " Within such a short period of assumption of office as the Vice Chancellor of the Manipur University, we are

invariably pained by your audacity to compromise with the sanctity and dignity of the Academic Council, a statutory body, of the University. This is fully reflected in your unilateral reversal of a resolution of the Academic Council which was adopted on October 8, 2016 relating to admissions.

In these circumstances, we would assert that you have no moral authority to continue as chairman of the Academic Council."

The move to tender resignation by the 23 members of the Academic Council comes after the new VC Prof. Adya Prasad Pandey had signed a memorandum of understanding with four students' bodies - DESAM, ATSUM, ANSAM and MUTSU yesterday to superseed the resolution of the Oct 8 Academic Council meeting regarding reservation of seats in admission. The Academic Council had resolved to rectify the Central Norms of 2006 while the tribal students' bodies have been demanding the amended admission norms of 2012.

The students bodies particularly those belonging to the MUTSU has been launching various formed of agitation after in charge VC Prof. Amar Yumnam had notified to begin the admission as per the resolution adopted by the Academic Council on October 8.

Sit-In-Protest staged against assault of 3 youths

Imphal, Nov 8: Meira Paibis' of Uripok Bachaspati Laikai, Uripok Bachaspati Maning today staged a sit-in-protest at Uripok Bachaspati Leikai Community Hall against the brutal assault on (3) three youth of the locality on the night of November 7 by unknown miscreants using arm weapon. Angom (O) Padmani Devi, one of the local Meira Paibi claims that on the night of November 7, the 3(three) youth of the leikai itself were brutally assaulted by some unknown miscreants of around 10 persons when they were buying some stuff at a

nearby shop. The assailant had use arm weapons and even blank fire of around 8 live rounds.

On hearing the noise of the incident, locals rush to the spot where they were able to capture one of the assailants along with the use arm weapon while the rest manage to escape taking the advantage of the darkness, she added.

DRDO hosts 58th Conference of International Military Testing Association

Imphal, Nov 8: Defence Institute of Psychological Research (DIPR), a Delhi-based laboratory of DRDO is hosting the 58th Conference of International Military Testing Association (IMTA) in New Delhi from 8th November 2016. The four-day long conference is being held in India for the first time and the event will be inaugurated by the Minister of State for Defence Dr. SubhashBhamre. It will be attended by Secretary, Department of Defence R&D and Chairman DRDO Dr. S Christopher and Ms Susan Truscott, Chair of the IMTA and Director General Military Personnel Research & Analysis,

This year the theme of the Conference is "Psychological Inis year the theme of the Conference is "Fsychological Assessment: Shaping the Future Soldier", which suits the recent trends of research that DIPR is pursuing related to the issues and concerns of our Armed Forces. The event will bring together experts of psychological assessment across the globe along with DRDO's partners from Armed Forces on a common

platform to discuss and deliberate upon topics like Multimethod approach in Personnel Selection for the Armed Forces, International Perspectives on Assessing and Countering Destructive Leadership and Combat Stress Behaviours. The Conference would also include 18 technical sessions which

Conference would also include 18 technical sessions which would focus on areas like Selection, Testing, Resilience, Aptitude, Training, Leadership and Positive psychology. Over 127 delegates from 21 countries viz., Australia, Belgium, Canada, Finland, Germany, Indonesia, Ireland, Republic of Korea, Netherlands, Nigeria, Norway, New Zealand, Portugal, Romania, Singapore, South Africa, Sweden, Switzerland, United Kingdom, USA and hosts India would attend the event. Participants from India would include DRDO scientists and Armed Forces Personnel with the Army, Navy and Air Force, associated as partners in this conference.

IMTA, the largest congregation of military psychologists is an International Non- profit body with 27 member countries under it, which deals with defence related issues and provides a forum for exchange of ideas among all member countries. The event takes place annually in one of the member countries where various issues pertaining to military context are deliberated such as training, leadership, selection, testing, occupational analysis, aviation psychology, human factors and soldier effectiveness etc.

The conference theme thus is not only an attempt to exchange notes on the current trends in the discipline of military psychology all over the world, but also to create pathways for incorporating the changing realities of the social, political, economic and cultura milieu into the selection and assessment systems.
