## Conflict over acquisition of land for Sports University at Yaithibi Khunou settled Land acquisition for Sports University completed

**Imphal, Oct 2:** Land owners of Yaithibi Khunou, who have been opposing acquisition of land for construction of Sports University has finally given up and signed agreement deed with the government of Manipur unloading burden from Chief Minister Okram Ibobi Singh. A reliable source said that Deputy Commissioner of Thoubal District, M Joy Singh had completed signing agreement deeds for

purchase of 25.35 acres of land with the land owners on October 1. Conflict area for construction of the Sport University is 32.65 acres, as the owners of this portion of land however, with the signing of the agreement deeds, only 7.3 acres of land is awaiting for settlement. Official source said that owners of this remaining land too have agreed to sign agreement with the government and land owners had given their assent to sign it on October 3.

The source added that the rate for one Sangam (0.62 acres) was negotiated at Rs. 6 lakh. In November, 2014 state cabinet had approved for acquisition of 442.27 Acres land of 44 Yaithibi Khunou Village, under Thoubal District for establishment of National Sports University. Of this 442.72 Acres, the area of pataland is 376.2, and land measuring 66.07 acre is Khasland. Soon after the approval of the state cabinet, land owners of

Yaithibi Khunou measuring around 32.65 acres of land strongly objected the government decision to acquire their land. Agitations after agitations were followed and confrontation took place between the land owner and the government machineries over the acquisition of the portion of land which stood in the middle of the propose site for Sport University. The matter was even move to different human Rights bodies accusing government of force eviction.

## Manipur's hill areas receive step-motherly treatment from central government

**Imphal, Oct 2:** Manipur's hill areas has been receiving step motherly treatment by the central government as the ADCs which start functioning since June 2015 are presently left out from 14<sup>th</sup> Finance Commission award as well as financial grant provided by NITI Aayog does not cover these hill districts of the state. Left with no choice the state government has approached the central government time and again to deliver fair treatment to the ADCs of Manipur but to no avail. As per the 14<sup>th</sup> Finance Commission report areas

under Schedule VI in Meghalaya, Mizoram, Tripura and Assam and the areas in the Hill Districts of Manipur, Rural area of Nagaland and Mizoram remain outside the ambit of the measures recommended for Panchayats and Municipalities. After nearly 20 years, Manipur government had finally conducted election for Autonomous District Councils in June 2015 and made the local bodies fully functional. However, with limited financial resources, it is now not feasible to carry out the fullest to fulfil the mandate.

Center is now leaving the fate of the ADCs to the mercy of the state government which does not have adequate resource on its own to run the government. A source said Chief Minister Okram Ibobi had written about the matters requesting for inclusion of the ADCs in the award by the 14<sup>th</sup> Finance Commission to both the Union Minister for Rural Development and Panchayati Raj, Union Finance Minister and also to the Prime Minister. As of now the center is not allocating any appropriate amount either in the form of grant or package for the six ADCs.

### 2 UGs arrested

**Imphal, Oct 2:** District Police Commando Imphal West arrested a member of PREPAK western side of Ngakraba bridge near Nambul River on September 29 morning. The arrested cadre is identified as Md. Habibur Rahaman (46) yrs S/o (I) M.V Abdul Hamid of Yairipok Singa, Thoubal District. Police source said that he was involved in extortion of huge amount of money from the Transport contractor of Thoubal District, Bishnupur District, Imphal East and West District since September, 2015 for raising their party fund. Incriminating articles were seized from his possession. On the same day another team of Imphal West district police commando arrested a member of KCP (Poirei group) Wangoi Mamang Thiyam Leikai area at around 11.45 am. The arrested person is identified as Huidrom Deben Singh (48) yrs S/o (I) H. Tompishak Singhof Wangoi Mamang Thiyam Leikai. Police said that he was involved in extortion of huge amount of money from the general public.

### 2 loaded trucks set ablaze

## Chadong villagers demands compensation and urged state govt. to respect PMO directives

**Imphal, Oct 2:** Chadong Village Authority has submitted a memorandum to the government of Manipur demanding payment of compensation for Rehabilitation and Resettlement package in respect of Non-recipients of the compensation of Chadong Village, Ukhrul district, who are displaced due to the construction of Maphith Dam, Thoubal River Multipurpose Project. The Village authority demanded compensation for all the properties damaged by

flooding, settlement of Rehabilitation and Resettlement matter of Chadong Village through Hereditary Land Owners and also appealed to honour the directives of the Prime Minister Office forwarded to the government of Manipur. In its memorandum the Chadong Village authority stated that the JAC- R&RCV of Chadong Village who had submitted Memorandum to the Governor of Manipur on September 17, 2016 is a bogus committee who had accepted and withdrawn their own R&R

package of Rs. 14,00,000/- in 2013 from the Government of Manipur. It further said that they had left their ancestral homes and now are non-residents of Chadong Village. The Village authority urged the state government to declare Chadong Village as the most affected zone/area and demanded immediate arrangement of alternative means of livelihood for each of the affected family by providing at least a government job to each of the affected family besides special Pension Plan for each families.

## Sapam Keba kicks start election campaign

## Irom Sharmila wants to meet Modi, take advice from him

**New Delhi, Oct 2:** After Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal, rights activist Irom Sharmila now wants to meet Prime Minister Narendra Modi expecting "good advice" from him. She had met Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on September 26 seeking his advice on how to defeat "major political parties" in her state Manipur. "Good advice should always be expected. Whether a person is an enemy or a friend, if he has some good views and wants to share it with me, I will take the advice," she told PTI. She was asked if she would also meet Modi to seek his



advice as he was elected with a huge mandate in the general elections. Sharmila on Friday had addressed Delhi University students at a function organised by the North East Forum for International Solidarity (NEFIS) to commemorate the 120th birth anniversary of Hijam Irabot, a freedom fighter and social

activist of Manipur. Sharmila, who had in the past, expressed her desire to meet Modi to seek his help in the repeal of the contentious Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act (AFSPA), reiterated her demand saying, "It is possible, I will meet because he is the authority concerned who can fulfill my demand." The 44-year-old "Iron Lady"

had an advice for students as she asked them to stop blaming the society and rather be the change they wish to see. "Youths, which are the strength of society are the symbol of unity and inspiration. You remain protesting and blaming the society. Instead, you are responsible to help or unite to bring the change you wish to see in the society," she said. On August 9, Sharmila broke her 16-year-old hunger strike demanding repeal of the AFSPA and announced that she would take her battle to the next level by floating her party as she wants to become the chief minister of Manipur to "press" for the demands.
