Monsoon session of Manipur Legislative Assembly begins; 3 Bills introduced

Imphal, Sept 2: The Monsoon Session of the Manipur Legislative Assembly begins today amid tight security. The session will have two sittings and will conclude on Monday. As soon as the House met today, the House condoled the death of former state MLA Kishore Thapa, who had represented Kangpokpi Assembly Constituency. Paying tributes to the departed leader, Chief Minister Okram Ibobi Singh said, Kishore Thapa was a soft natured person. He also said that Mr. Thapa was a prominent figure among the Gorkha community in the state. The Chief Minister further said that during his days, bandh, blockade and

any kind of extortion was not there in his area. Mr. Ibobi Singh said, the sudden demise of Mr. Thapa is a great loss to the society and it will be difficult to fill the vacuum created by his demise. State Irrigation and Flood Control Minister Ngamthang Haokip, MLAs Kh. Joykishan, Dr. Ibobalbi Singh and Speaker Th. Lokeshor Singh also joined the chief minister in paying tributes to the departed leader. The House observed two minutes silence in his honour. Later, the Chief Minister tabled in the House five different reports including Annual report of the State Vigilance Commission, Manipur for the year 2015-2016.

On the other hand Education Minister Dr. Kh. Ratan Kumar Singh introduced three government bills in the State Legislative Assembly. The bills are - the Manipur Technical University Bill, 2016; the Dhanamanjuri University Bill, 2015 and the Manipur State Higher Education Council Bill, 2016. Earlier, the Education Minister tabled in the House the Manipur Technical University Ordinance, 2016. The House also elected members of three committees of the House namely, Committee on Public Accounts, Committee on Estimates and Committee on Public Undertakings. The House was adjourned for the day at 11.30am.

JCILPS Women Wing staged protest rally Demands for new bill at the state assembly session

Imphal, Sept 2: Large number of womenfolk's of JCILPS women wings today staged a protest rally at Keisampat against the state government failure to bring up the issue for implementation of ILPS in the state Assembly Session, which begins today. Speaking to the media persons, Palungbam Ningol Thongam Ongbi Apabi Devi, Convenor JCILPS Women Wing said that JCILPS has submitted a draft proposal on August 24 including a modality papers regarding implementation of ILPS at both valley and hill districts on August 29 to the state government. Ruling government fails to bring up the matter at the assembly session on the ground of limited time as they were unable to call meeting for discussion of the proposals. Showing disappointment, Apabi Devi also said that the state government seems to neglect the movement to protect the indigenous people of the state of both valley and hill areas. Such inhumanitarian act of the state government is agonizing by the people of the state, she added. Strongly condemning the act of the state government,



Apabi Devi further said that until the ILPS is implemented in the state, countless number of strong agitations will be carried out against the government. JCILPS women wings are prepared to face what may come to deprive their agitations, she added. The agitations being carried out for the protection of indigenous people and implementation of ILPS in the state is not only for JCILPS members but it is for all the people of the state which includes government employees, MLAs, etc, she added. Apabi further said that the excess police action against the peaceful agitators is intolerable where many have suffered minor and major injuries due to the use of tear gas and mob bomb against

them. Some are still undergoing treatment, she asserted. Around 50 womenfolk's of JCILPS took part in today's protest rally which was carried out from Keisampat Leimajam Leikai Mamang where the JCILPS is undergoing rally hunger strike. They were halt at the Keisampat traffic island by a strong team of police force which were already present at the area. The women folk then staged a sit-in in the middle of the road blocking traffic along the route. Later the women protestors were made to turn back at their hunger strike premises. Banners with slogans demanding immediate introduction of a new ILPS Bill were shouted during the rally.

BJP workers stage protest near state Assembly; Around 15 BJP workers injured in police action

Imphal, Sept 2: Around 15 workers of the BJP were reported injured in police action at Khuyathong Junction at around 11 am today. The BJP workers were marching towards Manipur Legislative Assembly with party flags shouting slogans opposing fresh recruitment of Manipur Police Constable before declaring the result of the recruitment test for the same conducted for 2013 batch. Earlier, at around 10 am today large number of hard core BJP workers gathered at the residence of BJP MLA Khumukcham Joykishan at Thangmeiband. From there the BJP workers marched towards the Manipur Legislative Assembly demanding revocation of the cancellation order for recruitment of the Manipur Police Constable (Male) 2013 batch. Slogans demanding resignation of the Home Minister and immediate halt of the fresh recruitment test being held at Pangei were shouted.



The BJP workers led by its state unit President Kshetrimayum Bhabananda Singh earlier staged a sit-in protest in the close proximity of the state assembly gate. They were pushed back by a strong police force up to Khoyathong. The party is protesting against the cancellation of recruitment process of 2000 Manipur Police Constables (Male) by the Congress government in the state. BJP is demanding to immediately stop the fresh recruitment rally conducted by state Police Department

after cancellation of the early recruitment process started from 2013. The police later push them out upto Khuyathong Junction. Police then put up iron barricades to prevent them from crossing the area. The BJP workers confronted the police by pulling out the iron barricade. The police then charged them with baton and fired several rounds of tear gas shells. Around 15 workers including women were injured in the police action. Out of them condition of 4 (2 women and 2 men) were reported serious.

PET for fresh recruitment conducted

Imphal, Sept 2: Amidst protest from the Manipur Police Constable (Male) 2013 batch appeared candidates, the state Home department today peacefully conducted the Physical Efficiency Test (PET) for fresh candidates at Manipur Police Training Center Pangei. According to source, results for the PET was declared

today and almost all candidates appeared in the fresh recruitment test were declared cleared. Some of the volunteers of the Manipur Police Constable (Male) 2013 batch appeared candidates had tried to disrupt the fresh recruitment test, however large number of police personnel presents in the area foil the attempt to make any trouble.

Earlier, on August 30, 2 MLAs of BJP were arrested by the state police for trying to disrupt the fresh recruitment test at Pangei. They were later released unconditionally due to immense pressure from the center. Meanwhile, hearing of the case filed by the 2013 batch Constable. Appeared candidates was held today at Manipur High Court room number 2.

Manipur joins AITUC protest

Imphal, Sept 2: As part of the nation-wide general strike called by All India Trade Union Congress (AITUC), the Anganwadi Workers and Helper Union Manipur stage a sit in protest at front of GM hall Imphal today. The AITUC is staging the countrywide protest demanding increase of the honorarium of the workers to Rs 15 thousand and to Rs 8 thousand for helpers. The

AITUC also demand adequate honorarium in uniform manner to all Anganwadi Workers across the country and also for promotion of qualified Anganwadi helpers to the vacant post of anganwadi worker. Speaking to the media persons, L.Sotin Kumar, General Secy. AITUC, Manipur said that state government should immediately review the order of the retirement or removal of the Anganwadi workers and

helpers from their post without any pension benefits. He demanded pension on retirements of Rs 1.5 lakh and Rs 1 lakh for the workers and helpers. He further said that the state government should check the price-hike of essential commodities, as well as find a way for solution to the rising unemployment problems. SotinKumar further urged the government to implement the Food Security Act.

38 cases for unlawful items smuggling were registered during Jan to June 2016

Imphal, Sept. 2: In a concerted effort to check smuggling of unlawful items and drug trafficking, 38 (thirty eight) cases were registered during the period from January 2016 to June 2016 by the NAB. In connection with these cases, NAB (Narcotics and Affairs of Border) /District Police seized goods like Heroin- 1.364 kgs; Ganja- 48 packets and 118.5 kgs; Opium- 26.610 kgs; Nitrosun (N-10)- 8 strips and 466 tablets; Amphetamine- 140 tablets; Cough Syrup- 18 cartons and 533 bottles; SP tablets- 298 strips and 15,333 capsules; Brown Sugar- 96.6 gms; Pseudo-Ephe- 20,000 Actifin Tablets; WY Tablets- 2,575 tablets; Halontrec Tablets- 20 tablets and Drug Capsules- 18 capsules too. Further, during the same period, 455 acres of illegal Opium/ Ganja Plantation (18 acres of Ganja Plantation and 437 acres of Poppy Plantation) were destroyed by combined teams of NAB, District Police and

Security Forces at various places of Chandel, Ukhrul, Churachandpur and Senapati districts. Having felt the urgency for appropriate action to curb the growing inflow of Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances in the State, a narcotic Special Cell was opened in the Police Department in January, 1985. Further, the temporary post of the Special Officer (intelligence) was re-designated as



Superintendent of Police (Border affairs) Manipur in the year 1985. The office of the superintendent of police, Border

Affairs started functioning as a Police Station with the territorial jurisdiction extending over the whole of Manipur for the purpose of dealing with offences punishable under Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985. Further, the Government of Manipur in 1992 accorded approval for utilizing the services of the Superintendent of Police, Border Affairs for the works like Narcotics drugs Matter, Arms

smuggling activities and Infiltration of foreigners till such time the post of Superintendent of Police (Border Affairs) is re-designated as Superintendent of Police (Narcotics and Affairs of Border) with the approval of the Govt. of India. Since then the Superintendent of Police, Narcotics and Affairs of Border continued to function practically as the Nodal Officer in respect of Police Department, Manipur to co-ordinate with the Narcotic Control Bureau, New Delhi and its regional unit at Imphal. It may be mentioned that the border State of Manipur is situated very near to the so-called Golden triangle (Myanmar, Laos & Thailand). It also shares a highly porous international boundary of approximately 365.5 km with Myanmar all along the dense hilly region facilitating almost free movement of underground elements and drug traffickers and all sorts of unlawful activities.
