## JDDC resumes demand for full-fledged revenue district

**Imphal, Sept 24:** Jiribam District Demand Committee (JDDC) has resumed agitation for demand of a full-fledged revenue district by staging sit-in-protest at various part of the sub-division. The JDDC has been demanding upgradation of Jiribam sub-division to a full-fledged revenue district since the last many years. Members of JDDC expressed disappointment to the attitude of the State

Government in handling the burning issue. Alleging State Government of making false promises to the people of the Jiribam, the JDDC has resumed protest demonstration demanding immediate up-gradation of the Jiribam sub-division into a full-fledged district from starting form today with the support from the local peoples, said the member. The JDDC also threatened to launch serious form of

agitation apart from the sit-in-protest, if the State Government continues to disregard the peoples' demand. It may be mentioned that the JDDC and State Government have signed an MoU on November 9, 2011 to implement and up-grade Jiribam sub-division into a full-fledged revenue district. Merchant Union of Jiribam also staged sit-in demonstration in support to the demand of the JDDC.

## JCILPS agitations: 18 more non locals pull up

**Imphal, Sept 24:** As announced earlier members of the JCILPS along with various civil society organization of state had intensified its drive against the non locals. Today at around 11.00 am volunteers of JCILPS pulled down 18 non-locals at North AOC who were on their way to Tamenglong for a bridge construction work being undertaken by Simplex company. Speaking to the media person convener of JCILPS, BK Moirangcha said that as declared by the JCILPS to restrict entering of non-locals in the state, the JCILPS volunteers pulled up 18 non local including a minor from North AOC. The non locals were brought by a blue hill bus under the Sangai Travel Agency form Guwahati to



Mao, and again brought them by a local bus bearing registration no. MNO1-2085 to Imphal for the construction work of a bridge at Tamenglong Under simplex company. He further added that the detained non local will be sent back to their respective places by the bus which brought them here. He appealed the simplex

officials to come at the office of JCILPS within tomorrow to discuss the issue while announcing ban to Siroy travel agency for a period of one month. He further clarified that the drive against the non locals is not an anti-nation agitation, it's due to the negligence of ILPS issue by state government and central government.

## India to host 1st BRICS Young Scientists Conclave

**New Delhi, Sept 24:** The Department of Science & Technology (DST), Government of India, under the BRICS framework, is hosting a five day event where a group of about 50 young scientists/researchers from BRICS countries are meeting in Bengaluru from 26-30<sup>th</sup> September, 2016. It would be organized and coordinated by the National Institute of Advanced Studies (NIAS), Bengaluru. The meet would provide a platform for engaging, connecting and networking among young scientists to hold discussions and find solutions to some of the common challenges and problems being faced in BRICS countries. The participants are drawn from science, engineering and allied disciplines. The focus of the Conclave would be on three thematic topics - Computational Intelligence, Energy Solutions and Affordable Healthcare. This BRICS Young Scientists

Conclave assumes importance as it is taking place during India's chairmanship of BRICS in 2016 under a focal theme of 'Building, Responsive, Inclusive and Collective Solutions'. The event shall be inaugurated by Prof K. Kasturirangan, former Member of Parliament (Rajya Sabha) and former Chairman, Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO). The Conclave aims at building a BRICS Innovation Corps - who individually or collectively have specialized capability to work on their novel scientific ideas and

technological solutions which transform and accelerate change through better quality of life and higher incomes for citizen of this region. It will pave way for creation of strong generation of S&T leadership that can accelerate change collectively. Some of the lead speakers in the Conclave, among others from India and abroad, include Dr. K. Kasturirangan, Dr. Ashutosh Sharma, Secretary, DST, Dr. K. VijayRaghavan, Secretary, Department of Biotechnology, Dr. VK. Saraswat, Member, NITI Aayog, and Dr. Baldev Raj, Director, NIAS.

The growing solidarity and realisation on the part of several sections of Indians about the wrongful, illegal and unethical annexation of Manipur by India is an added advantage for the liberation of Manipur from India. Against the backdrop of the opportune historical consciousness about Manipur's rightful place in the league of independent nation-states, we must strive to harness with our collective

revolutionary unity to re-gain the lost freedom of Manipur. Liberation of a nationality materialises not in a vacuum, but in a historical lineage. Materials such as that of historicity, culture, political and economy constitute the body of a nationality. The case of Manipur is not an exception in this regard. Therefore, the struggling nationalities of the world for their self-determination are a natural phenomenon and a rightful claim. A liberation struggle which come as an anti-colonial movement locates its political objective in the uncompromising love for freedom and collective equality as the highest form of political justice. Therefore, achieving self-determination is the core of just resolution of revolutionary liberation movement. With a

long drawn history of being colonised by India, it is often pertinent to witness packages of implanted culture, economy and indoctrination of colonial values to defunct the genuine aspirations for freedom. The displacement of people from their indigenous value systems and knowledge forms have happened which in turn produced antagonising intercommunity relation and weakening of symbiotic existential worlds in Manipur. The growing weakening of inter-community relations, of being dependent on New Delhi, favour seeking behaviour, institutionalisation of corruption, urge for quotas and reservation are the consequences of India's annexation and prolonged occupation of Manipur.
