Japanese wireless sets expose Pakistan link to Uri attack

Courtesy: TOI Srinagar, Sept 25: The four terrorists who attacked the Army's 12th Infantry Brigade headquarters in Uri+ last Sunday had brought with them two sets of Japan-made wireless sets that stand testimony to the attackers' Pakistan link. The wireless sets are inscribed with the words

'bilkul naya (brand new)' in Urdu and 'new' in English. Sources told TOI that the National Investigation Agency (NIA), which is investigating the terror attack, has procured the details of the sets' sale from the manufacturer ICOM. "The wireless sets in any country are sold to a security agency. We are already in the process of

confirming the sale of these models in Pakistan. We will send the details to Pakistan officials through our formal channel," a home ministry officer told TOI.

The wireless sets are among 48 items, including two map sheets+, seized from the attack site, all of which have been handed over by the Army to NIA investigators. While one of the map sheets is burnt, the National Technical Research Laboratory (NTRLO) is busy deciphering four coordinates mentioned on the other — 8440, 8605, 2842 and 3007. TOI is in possession of the list of 48 items submitted by the Indian Army to the National Investigation Agency (NIA) sleuths. The investigators are banking on the electronic devices to find out the details of their origin.

The serial numbers of the wireless set are being matched with the Japanese firm ICOM. "IC V82 Made in Japan with serial numbers 2832349 and 2832560 of wireless set RS ICOM and its battery mark BP 20 BN" the item number 13

reads in the list of seizures prepared by the Indian investigation agencies.

While that of the IKALL mobile phone, mentioned at number 14 in the list, reads, "Model no K 42, with triple SIM IMEI ...numbers...358064070318971" Unlike the Pathankot attackers, the Uri terrorists deleted the data fed in the pair of GPS devices found at the site. However, sources said the serial numbers of the devices were enough to ascertain the details of their sale and purchase from the US firm Garmin. Seemingly, the fideayen were particular about their personal hygiene.

There was a small hair comb of make 'Ship' and lip conditioner of make 'Chapet'. A recovery of 650 grams of almonds, 700 grams of dates, 50 grams of raisins reveals their dependence on protein and sugar along with energy drinks such as Tango, 3 packets of Tango and fruit juices have their origin in Karachi in Pakistan.

Client complaints of cheating by job consultant

Imphal, Sept 25: Clients of a job consultant service center, called Shiva Job Consultant Pvt.Ltd located at Uripok Kangchup road today alleged that the center has been shut down after collecting huge amount of money in the name proving them service. When went to collect the money to the residence of the Director of the Consultant center identified as Chongtham Chinglensana Meitei, the Clients were allegedly driven out even threatening them, said a client Kafiyat Khan while speaking to media persons at Manipur Press Club. He said, the director collected has collected Rs. 50,000/- to Rs. 1,00,000/- depending upon the job they applied for from each job seeker. They deposited the amount as they were assured to provide jobs at outside the state. Five of the clients appeared today during the press meet however, Kafiyat Khan alleged that the Director Chinlensana had collected money from around 50 persons.

PLA observes 38th Raising Day

A press statement made available to media houses stated that the 38th Raising Day celebration was observed at the General Head Quarters, PLA, Tactical Command, Strategic Command, 252 Mobile Battalion, other army unit, departments, along with its central Bureah, SR-1, SR-2, SR-3 and SR-4. As a part of the Raising day observance, cadres of the outfit paid salutation to the party's flag and also to the martyrs who had laid down their lives

fighting for the freedom of Manipur. The statement said that the cadres of the outfit along with the people fled balloon carrying the outfit's festoon at Central Bureau's divisions 2,4,6,8, and 10 to mark the observance. President of the RPF Irengbam Chaoren sent message to the people on occasion of the PLA's 38th

Raising Day. The statement said that the outfit want the mass to discuss the presidential speech at which he said that revolutionary movement did not arise from the empty space. The revolutionary movement is the product of history, identity, culture, politics and economics of the region. The PLA also appealed the people to ponder upon the

concept of education mentioned by the president. It cautions the people from the policy of the ruling regime at which youths are being diverted from the core issue through education. The statement further appealed the people to unite all the community who have been living together since time immemorial and to sacrifice for the people.

Pakistan accuses Modi of 'well thought out vilification campaign'

From Sajjad Hussain (PTI) Islamabad, Sep 25: Pakistan today rejected Prime Minister Narendra Modi's assertion that it was exporting terror, saying the remarks were part of a "well thought out vilification campaign" to distract attention from Kashmir. Pakistan Foreign Office, in a statement, said Prime Minister Modi in a public meeting in Kerala "tried to malign Pakistan". "It is unfortunate that Indian leadership continues to indulge in a well thought out vilification campaign against Pakistan by making provocative statements and baseless accusations. Such irresponsible display of behaviour at the highest political level is regrettable," the Foreign Office said.

"It is evident that, as an act of desperation, India is trying to distract world attention from the atrocities perpetrated" by its forces in Kashmir against "innocent and defenseless" Kashmiris, including children and women, the statement said. The "atrocities" in Kashmir intensified since the "extra-judicial killing of Kashmiri youth leader" Burhan Muzaffar Wani in July this year, it said of the slain Hizbul Mujahideen commander. Pakistan's reaction came after Prime Minister Modi launched a blistering attack on it yesterday in his first public address after last Sunday's deadly Uri terror attack. Modi said the sacrifice of 18 soldiers will not go in vain while all out efforts will be made to isolate Pakistan

globally. "Terrorists should hear out clearly that India will never forget the Uri attack...I want to tell the leadership of Pakistan that the sacrifice of our 18 jawans will not go in vain," Modi told a public meeting on the Kozhikode beach held on the sidelines of the BJP national council meet. He said while countries in Asia are working to make the 21st century Asia's, Pakistan is engaged in a conspiracy of causing bloodshed across the continent by sponsoring terrorism and killing innocents. The Pakistan Foreign Office statement alleged, "In the last seventy-five days, Indian occupation forces have brutally martyred more than 100 Kashmiris, blinded hundreds and injured

thousands." The Foreign Office claimed that the international community has taken notice of these "blatant human rights violations" with concerns expressed by several countries as well as UN and Organisation of Islamic Cooperation (OIC). It also accused India of continuing to sponsor terrorism in Pakistan through state apparatus. "The arrest and confession statements of a serving Indian Navy officer and intelligence operative, Kulbhushan Jadhav, reveal beyond a shadow of doubt as to how India fuels terrorist activities in various parts of Pakistan, including Balochistan and FATA (Federally Administered Tribal Areas)," the statement said.

Contract teachers call economic blockade from Sept 26 midnight along the NHs

Imphal, Sept 25: Contract Basis Appointed Teachers Association (CBATA) of Senapati district has called indefinite economic blockade on Imphal to Dimapur road and Imphal to Jiri road from midnight of September 26 against the non-payment of salary as well as non regularization of their post. Speaking to the media persons at Manipur Press Club today, president of the CBATA Karang Rangmei said that 136 contract teachers were appointed in the year of 2011 by the Government of Manipur. However till date, the appointed teachers did not get salary for the last 6 years. He also said that

government has not taken up any initiative for regularization of the contract teachers. Rangmei said the matter has been brought to the notice of the local MLA as well as the authority of the concern department and also served an ultimatum on September 17 to resolve the issue within seven days, however as no follow up action has been taken up the CBATA is left with no choice but to call the Indefinite economic blockade on the High Ways. The economic blockade is being supported by Naga People's Organization, Sanapati District Student Organization and Sanapati District Women Organization, Rangmei added.

Dead bodies remains unclaimed

Imphal, Sept 25: The dead bodies of the mother and her infant child is remained unclaimed by the deceased family as the vehicle owner family failed to comply the demands of the family members. Report says that, last night family members of the owner of the vehicle and deceased had a negotiation where the deceased family demanded compensation of Rs 15 lakh. As the compensation amount being high, the vehicle owner family

manages to compensate Rs 5 lakh only. Unfortunately the deceased family could not agree with the vehicle owner. The deceased Lalngakim, 35, wife of Lalvarlien Hmar and her infant daughter Zosangkim who is not even one-year-old were crushed to death inside their home located on the roadside of the IVR at Kalinagar Part I in Jiribam, when the Tata dipper bearing regd.no ML-04B 8608 met with an accident and fell onto their house at around 12:30 pm.

'Caste system can be annihilated through intercaste marriages'

New Delhi, Sept 25: Union Minister of State for Social Justice & Empowerment Ramdas Athawale has said that the caste system in the country can be annihilated through intercaste marriages. Talking to newsmen in Hyderabad today he said the Ambedkar Foundation is offering an incentive of 2 lakh 50 thousand rupees to those couple who undergo intercaste marriages and there is a proposal to enhance the amount. Mr

Athawale stated that he supports the reservation demand for Marathas, Jats and Patels in educational institutions and employment without disturbing the quota of OBC reservations. He said, his party Republican Party of India is in favour of smaller states in the country and the separate state demand for Vidarbha is very reasonable and stressed the need for bifurcation Uttar Pradesh into two more states such as Poorvanchal and Harita Pradesh.

CCpur Khuga battalion holds ex-servicemen rally

CCpur, Sept. 24: The Khuga Battalion Station near Khuga Dam today organised a rally of pensioners and widows of army personnel in Churachandpur district attended by top officials of the district and ex Army men. Several stalls including that of medical were set up for more than 100 pensioners.
