For a better society, education is a must

The directives of the Union Ministry for Human Resource to implement provisions provided under the Right to Education Act, 2009 to all the territories of the country by March 2013 is perhaps an astounding as well as theatrical statement. The decision which was taken up after due considerations and deliberations with the higher officials in the education sector seemed to have a complete lack of understanding of the ground realities and present existing conditions of Government run elementary school located particularly in the state of Manipur. The paperworks and simultaneous introduction of Sharva Shiksya Abhiyan (SSA) and later Rastriya Madhyamic Shiksha Abhiyan (RMSA) is perhaps a sincere approach of the government to improve the state of affairs of primary and elementary education system in the country. The progress reports of the two programme might have provoked those policy makers of education reforms to consider it the right time for implementation of the Right To Education Act. But has any of the policy makers at the top ever got down to the grassroots level to find out the reality of how successfully these two scheme

Level to find out the reality of how successfully these two scheme - the SSA and RMSA being implemented? Manipur joins the world in the campaign for Global Action Week for Education taken up under the initiative of United Nation's Sustainable Development Goal. As a part of the campaign initiated by a body call CALL- Manipur various discussion on what went wrong to the education system in the state has been going on. The campaign indeed is beyond the Right to Education Act. But the state of Manipur is still is not getting any fruitful

measures besides having the RTE. The Act definitely is a boon for all the countrymen however, simply an announcement to garner applause from the general public without understanding the ground reality to the conditions of some of the schools (Govt.) particularly in the state of Manipur would surely be considered a political gamble and an empty ploy to garner more votes during election time. During the course of discussion it is found out that something,

somewhere the system has failed.

Neither the community nor the government seem to be taken interest for promotion of the government school in the last one or two decades

The Education Minister of this government is showing serious concerns over the deteriorating condition of the government school. As per expert, the education system itself is a failed system, as there are no pre primary schools for students. Syllabus, recruitment of teachers, and utilisation are carrying out not for the students but for their own benefit. Above all there is no mechanism to monitor on how the government schools are functioning

CALL-Manipur's initiative to make success the Global campaign on education is the need of the hour and the new government need to encourage such a campaign for a better future.

New Delhi, April 27: Three soldiers including an army captain were killed on Thursday when a group of militants stormed a garrison in south Kashmir's Kupwara, a defence official said. Two militants were also killed in the attack at the Panzgam area of Chowkibal, the army spokesperson said, adding, "Search ops (operations are) in progress." Sources said five injured soldiers

have been shifted to a hospital in Srinagar. The attackers, suspected to be fidayeen militants, sneaked into the camp before sunrise at around 4. Sources said the group of four militants are believed to have had crossed over from Pakistan.

> Indian-origin soldier in UK jailed for life for murder

London, April 27: An Indian-origin British soldier was today sentenced to a minimum of 22 years behind bars for killing his ex-girlfriend in north-east England last year.

England last year. Lance Corporal Trimaan "Harry" Dhillon, 26, was accused of breaking into Alice Ruggles' flat and slitting her throat from ear Dhillon, who was described in a

court as an obsessive, controlling and manipulative

person, had denied murdering Ruggles in October last year. But a jury at Newcastle Crown Court yesterday found him guilty of murder and Judge Paul Sloan sentenced him to a minimum of 22 years behind bars before being considered for parole.

Describing the killing as "utter barbarism", the judge told Dhillon: "Not a shred of remorse have you shown from first to last indeed you were concentrating so hard on getting your story right when giving evidence you forgot even to shed a crocodile

Edinburgh-based Dhillon was found guilty of using his skills as a signaller with 2 Scots, the Royal Regiment of Scotland, to hack his 24-year-old victim's emails, phone messages and social media. She was found dead in a pool of

blood by her flatmate Maxine just days after she had told a police officer she did not want Dhillon to be arrested for harassment Ruggles had contacted Northumbria Police after she

broke up with Dhillon as she was concerned about his behaviour when he travelled from his Scotland barracks, got into her back yard and knocked on her bedroom window late at night. He allegedly left her flowers and chocolates and then walked away. Dhillon was ordered by his commanding officer to stay away from his ex-girlfriend but he posted her a parcel containing photos and a letter.

beaten by her neighbours for objecting to their comments about her 17-year-old granddaughter. The incident took place in an area under Murad Nagar police station on April 23

According to the victim's family, their neighbours and locals in the area had passed lewd comments and used obscene language while addressing the girl on the evening of April 21. "The matter was sorted out between the elders of the two families. Two days later, when we all were sitting at home, several men from the same family who had harassed the girl entered our house with rods and sticks and started attacking our family. They hit everyone brutally and did not spare even the women and children," said Mohammad Salahuddin, the girl's uncle.

According to the prosecution, Dhillon drove to Ruggles' home on October 10 last year and waited for her after he broke in through her bedroom window and took a knife from the kitchen. There was a violent struggle which was heard by a neighbour upstairs and Dhillon then allegedly drew the blade across

Ruggles' neck six times. His victim also suffered a wound to the nose and her hand, along

with chest injuries. Dhillon had claimed she died as a result of an accident when she leapt at him with a carving knife. He told the jury they had been struggling, that he had tried to disarm her and she cut herself when he blocked a lunge, and the knife stuck in her neck when she fell to the floor.

The jury played a frantic 999 call by Miss Ruggle's friend Maxine McGill in which she described finding the 24- year-old "covered in blood" and named Dhillon as in blood" and named Dhillon as the killer, calling him an "absolute psychopath". Ruggles and Dhillon had developed an intense rolationetic unit

developed an intense relationship over the internet while he was serving in Afghanistan and she was working for Sky in Newcastle. The jury were told that Dhillon soon set about alienating her from her friends, knocked her selfconfidence and demanded her constant attention.

His previous partner suffered similarly and her ordeal only ended after she took out a restraining order. After the verdict, Ruggles' family

released a statement through the Suzy Lamplugh Trust, which helps people avoid becoming victims of

violence Her mother Sue said: "I just keer thinking I can't believe we didn't identify the signs of stalking but you just don't know when it's going on".

China on Wednesday launched its

first locally-built aircraft carrier, less than four years after the construction of the 70,000 tonne warship began at the Dalian shipyard. The Type 001A carrier is expected to be commissioned into the People's Liberation Army Navy (PLAN) in two years as Beijing seeks to aggressively project its maritime power thousands of miles away from its shores.

The Chinese carrier has been launched at a time when India is still struggling to build its first indigenous carrier. The construction of the Indian carrier began in 2009 and it was launched in 2013. The Indian Navy said the carrier would be commissioned in 2018 but a report by the national auditor contradicted the claim. stating that the project is years behind schedule. The distraught Thai mother of a baby girl killed by her boyfriend in a murder he broadcast on Facebook Live has described the harrowing moment she stumbled across the video and rushed to alert police. Andrabi is married to Ashiq Hussain Faktoo, a Hizbul Mujahideen leader who is currently in jail. AFP **Beirut, April 27:** A massive explosion hit near the Damascus International Airport on Thursday, a monitoring group said, without specifying the cause.

"The blast was huge and could be heard in Damascus," said Rami Abdel Rahman, head of the Syrian Observatory for Human Rights The Damascus International Airport lies about 25 kilometres southeast

of Svria's capital. Britain-based Observatory, which gathers information from sources across war-ravaged Syria,

said it had confirmed the explosion had not taken place inside the airport itself.

"It's unclear what caused the explosion, but there fires raging at the site," Abdel Rahman told *AFP*. More than 320,000 people have been killed since Syria's conflict erupted in 2011 with widespread anti-

government protests. While Damascus has remained relatively insulated from the violence, fierce fighting has raged on the outskirts of the capital in recent months between rebel groups and government forces.
