### Flood woes continue, relief measures stepped up

Imphal, April 3: While the state is reeling under the increasing problems of flash floods due to non-stop heavy rainfall for the past few days, various areas of the state has been impacted in a big way after most of the houses, trees were swept away by the fierce storm last night including hail. Reports reaching from Noney states that most of the trees in and around Noney area were uprooted including landslide, mudslide and crumbling boulders and stones causing inconvenience to the locals.

Newly ploughed paddy fields and farms have been submerged under water while

structures and huts have been swept away by the fierce storm damaging many vegetables and crops by the hail storms. Due to the fierce storm last night, power has been cut off. Schools and colleges have been closed due to inconvenience in travelling. Report reaching here also said that people of Noney and its surrounding areas are waiting for help and support from the concern department and state government.

Meanwhile, major rivers in Imphal valley are still running high following the non-stop heavy rain that lashed the state for the last few days. Man made flood

were still seen in various places in and around Imphal areas where people have been suffering severe inconveniences due to the flash flood.

Many temporary sheds, huts and aged trees have been swept away and uprooted from the last night fierce storm which last several hours, including one of the few growing in the median near Kalimai mandir at Yiaskul, Moirangkhom.

Preventive measures have been taken up from the government side including distribution of relief materials at most of the flood affected areas in Imphal and its surrounding areas.

Autism disorder is mainly characterized by weaknesses in ability such as repetitive behaviour in speech and communication disabilities, absenteeism from social concentration on contact eye during conversation. This asymptomatic disability is very difficult to understand but tends to appear between the years of 2 to 3 years of age. The rate of suffering autism is higher than male comparing to female.

L.Dhaneshor Singh said that the differently nature of ability to categories a persons of being disability is increase from the 7 to 21 by amending in the parliament recently which include autism. Those who want to get the benefits of differently schemes of government need to get the different schemes of government need to get the disability certificate from the concern authority. There is provision to get disability certificate from the Primary Health Centre but there may raise the certain problems due to absence of specialist doctors to determine physical

Imphal, April 3: National Federation of the Blind, the largest and apex self help organisation of the blind persons having branches all over the country with a regional centre at Guwahati for the North East and affiliated to World Blind Union will be opening a branch unit in Imphal. According to Md Imran Ali, Secretary cum In Charge North East Affairs, the National Federation of the National receration of the Blind was established in 1972 with various objectives including to act as the protector of the rights of the blind with the philosophy "Let the Blind Lead the Blind" and has been running an education, Training and Rehabilitation Centre for the blind at Dharmtul, Dist Morigoan in Assam and various other blind welfare programs and projects in many parts of the country which include, among others, placement service schemes,

computerized Braille press, Braille E-Text and Talking book library, computer and career development centres, hostels for college going blind students, national scholarship scheme for the blind, housing and interest free educational loan scheme, financial aid to the blind for medical treatment and natural calamity etc. the spokesperson further expressed the commitment of the federation to establish an institute for higher and

technical education for the blind, residential school for blind girls for integrated studies, need-base and communitybase job oriented training programs for the blind as well as to modernize the educational system for the blind as per national standard in Assam at a press meet held today at the Manipur Press Club. He also urged the state government to extend support and cooperation to make the efforts of the federation bear fruit.

### IISc tops, JNU bags 6th position in institutions ranking

New Delhi, April 3: The at number 12 in the university Bengaluru-based Indian Institute of Science (IISc) bagged the top position in the top 100 university ranking released by the centre today. Despite political controversies, Delhi's Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU) was ranked as high as number six and Jadavpur Universty was ranked

today. "JNU and Jadavpur University didn't get rankings for Afzal Guru or anti-India slogans but for the good work done by students," HRD Minister Prakash Javadekar said after releasing the list. He was referring to the controversy over a protest organized last year in JNU against the 2013 hanging of Afzal Guru, that drew charges of sedition on some of its students. In Jadavpur University rival student groups clashed over the screening of a political film, also last year.

The ranking of 100 institutes was conducted by the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) which comes under the MHRD. Including IISc, eight institutes from Karnataka found a place among the top 100.
