Imphal, April 27: For the first time in the history of Manipur, mass protest rally took out in Imphal city against the April 14 Phaknung Gangrape, here today.

Large number of peoples from both valley and hill areas, various Civil Society Organisations, Student's Body, Clubs took part in the rally which is organised by Core Committee Against Phaknung Gangrape of Two Minor Girls.

All the women of Manipur irrespective of caste and religions and all the communities and its representatives have come together with the decision to stand against the unfortunate incident of April 14 where two minor girls were gangrape said Rose Mangshi Haokip, Advisor of Kuki Women

Union Manipur. Speaking to the media persons, Rose Mangshi Haokip said that being known as Sanaleipak Manipur, we are not accustomed to witness such crimes in Manipur for the last many decades. With the coming of 21st century frequent crime rates one after another have increased numerously. Women of Manipur are against such crimes with strong condemnation and recent incident of April 14, 2017 is the very much example to say, she added.

Rose Mangshi Haokip also said solidarity, peace, integrity of both the Valleys and Hills (Ching-Tam) are all united and have decided that took out the mass rally today throughout Manipur so that in future such kind of crime never happen again. Repair of Kakching Lamkhai-Wabagai road to commence soon

Imphal, April 27: Kakching MLA Y Surchandra inspected the dilapidated Kakching Lamkhai to Wabagai road today along with chairperson and councilors of Kakching Municipal Council, engineers of National Highway Division 1 and a team of members of Kha Maikeli Light Vehicle (Passenger) Association. The NHD1 was represented by executive engineer K Premkumar and assistant engineer K Arunkumar during the tour. After getting an assurance from the legislator that repair of the road will be taken up immediately the passenger service association has decided to temporarily cancel all its proposed agitations including disruption of service of ferrying passengers on this route. MLA Surchandra stated that repair of the 15-km road, which



is a segment of national highway 137 (A), will be taken up promptly and the central government has allotted a sum of Rs 18 crore for the purpose. The work will commence as soon as there is an improvement in the weather, he added. As an interim measure leveling of road by topping it with a layer of stones will be taken up initially, he said.

He appealed the people to cooperate and immediately clear houses, shops and other structures built along the road by encroaching upon government land and also to remove sand, stone and earth piled adjacent to the road for private uses. He warned of the possible use of force to clear the presence of private belongings along the road if the request is not heeded.

Not justifiable to keep Lokpal Act's operation pending: SC

New Delhi, April 27: The Supreme Court today said the Lokpal and Lokayuktas Act of 2013 is a "workable piece of legislation" and it was not justifiable to keep its operation pending. As per the Act, the Leader of the Opposition in the Lok

Sabha will be part of the Lokpal selection panel. At present, there is no Leader of the Opposition in the Lok Sabha. A bench of Justices Ranjan Gogoi and Naveen Sinha, while referring to an earlier judgement of the apex court, said, "We are holding that it is a workable piece of legislation and it is not justifiable to keep this pending." The apex court had on March 28 reserved its verdict on a batch of pleas seeking the appointment of Lokpal in the country. Earlier, senior advocate Shanti Bhushan, appearing for NGO Common Cause, had said that even though the Lokpal Bill was passed by Parliament in 2013 and came into effect in 2014, the Lokpal is not being appointed by the government deliberately. Attorney General Mukul Rohatgi had said the Lokpal cannot be appointed in the current scenario as amendments regarding the

definition of the Leader of the Opposition in the Lokpal Act was pending in Parliament. The apex court had on November 23 last year pulled up the Centre over the delay in appointment of Lokpal, saying it should not allow the law to become a "dead letter". In the Lok Sabha, the largest opposition party Congress has only 45 members and lacks the requisite 10 per cent of total 545 seats, giving rise to the requirement to amend the present Lokpal Act. The plea by NGO Common Cause had sought a direction to the Centre to make the appointment of chairperson and members of Lokpal as per the amended rules framed under the Lokpal and Lokayuktas Act, 2013. The NGO, in its plea filed through advocate Prashant Bhushan, had also sought a direction to the Centre to ensure that the procedure for selecting the chairperson and members of Lokpal must be transparent as envisaged under the Act.

PM flags off Shimla-New Delhi flight under UDAN scheme

Shimla, April 27: Prime Minister Narendra Modi today inaugurated the maiden Shimla-New Delhi flight under a government scheme to boost regional air connectivity. The flight is being operated by Alliance Air, a subsidiary of Air India. The airline has deployed its 42-seater ATR plane on this sector. The prime minister also simultaneously flagged off regional connectivity scheme (RCS) flights on the Kadapa Hyderabad and Nanded-Hyderabad sectors through video-conferencing. With the RCS scheme, also

called UDAN or "Ude Desh Ka Aam Nagrik", the government aims at connecting 45 unserved and under-served airports and make flying affordable by capping fares at Rs 2500 per seat/ hour. Five airlines were awarded 128 routes under the scheme last month after a bidding process. Under the UDAN scheme, the operators would be extended viability gap funding (VGF). The amount is estimated to be around Rs 205 crore per annum for the operators chosen in the first round of bidding.
