

No proper guideline in State Labour and Employment department

Imphal, April 9: Much has been taken by the new government to eradicate corruption as well as to streamline good governance in the state. Even though this government has taken up many good cause somewhere, at some department the very word transparency appeared to be another joke.

Nothing has been made clear on who is the Principal Secretary of Labour and Employment department since 2016. Nothing has been officially notified by following proper procedure on who is present chairman of the Manipur Building and Other Construction Welfare Board. Whether the state government notification NO. 5/24/97 – Lab (Pt) dated November 16, 2015 has been amended or not remain as a big question to every citizen. This is being stated as there has been no government notification regarding the replacement of Principal Secretary by Additional Chief Secretary to empower him as the competent signatory for the Labour Department. Source said that after Suhel Aktar has been promoted to Additional Chief Secretary he has been withdrawing fund by signing his promoted designation instead of Principal Chief Secretary, which is a complete violation of the government guidelines.

As according to the resolution number 6(ii) adopted during the 9th meeting of the Board held on 14/4/2016 at 11.30 am at its office premises it was stated that selection of the Skill

Development Training of Registered Building and other Construction workers and their spouse and dependent children/sibling shall be done first by the Welfare Board and then by the training provider. As per source available from the members of the Board it has come to know that except for one applicant.

Report with the Imphal Times said that Additional Chief Secretary Dr. Suhel Aktar has been still acting as the Principal Secretary Labour and another E Tomba Singh has been acting as the Secretary of Manipur Building and other construction workers welfare board. Some of the members alleged that huge amount of money has been sanctioned even though members have knowledge of only one applicant for Skill Development Training.

Question arises now is that, who are those selected candidates for the skill development training programme and how many of

them had applied. The source further added that during an enquiry conducted for fraudulence case against an Inspector of the Labour Department Identified as I. Subashchandra, Additional Chief Secretary Dr. Suhel Aktar and Secretary E Tomba had recovered a sum of Rs. 1,75,000/- from him. The money was reportedly collected using fake receipt book. However, whereabouts of the money recovered has not been let known to the members of the board.

On the other hand, there are also reports that some of the Inspector of the Labour department are issuing card to applicants by skipping the official procedures.

CM to inspect developmental works at Utkhrul

Earlier the Utkhrul based civil society organisation had announced to organise a reception programme for the new chief minister. However, the TNL, one of the apex body Tangkhul community had stated that they will not organise the reception programme however they will give no objection if any government authority organised such reception function.

Mention may be made that this is perhaps the first time that Chief Minister of Manipur has been accepted at Utkhrul district in 15 years. There were incidents at which civil society organisation boycott earlier government ministers and even the chief minister.

Man drown

Imphal, April 9: A person was found drown at a pond located inbetween two temples at Khabam Lakpam Mandop in Keishamthong Elangbam Leikai, here in Imphal West late yesterday evening at around 10 pm.

Report said people of the locality rushed out of the houses after they heard a heavy splash at the pond. However as no one was seen inside the pond all were asking one another about the splash at water. When took a closure look a pair of slipper was found floating. At the same time some of the locality saw an aged person sitting at the nearby pond some hours back. As he was not seen anywhere people keep on looking at the pond. Later he was seen get drown at the pond. Later, locals of the area informed the police and the dead body was pulled up.

As per an Aadhar Card with his photo the deceased name was written as Takhellambam Joykumar of Segia Road Takhel leikai. Police deposited the body at RIMS morgue.

Bandh and blockade costs Rs 2,616.23 crores per day

till March of 2017, the State lost Rs 1,672.9 Crores, Serto elaborated.

There were 103 days of economic blockade in 2016 and 76 days of economic blockade till March of this year.

Quoting the All Manipur Road Transport Drivers and Motor Workers Union general secretary M Anil Meitei, Serto said that around 360 trucks have been shipping in goods per day to the State.

Assuming that the State's per capita income is Rs 67,207 in 2016-17 till March, it was found that the State lost Rs 943.33 Crores every day on account of economic blockade.

In total, the State lost Rs 542.81 crores in 2016 and another Rs 400.52 crore this year till March, on account of economic blockade.

Therefore, the total loss from 2016 to 2017 till March due to Bandh and general strike and Economic blockade is Rs 2,616.23 crores, Serto said.

Although the negative impacts of bandhs and blockades on the economy of Manipur are understood by most people, many organisations and individuals have been using bandhs and blockades as effective tools for exerting pressure on the Government.

Out of the total 365 days, 224 days were affected by bandhs and blockades in 2010, Serto continued.

What is more disturbing is the State's failure to respond immediately when some organisations call bandh or blockade. As such, bandhs and blockades have become a chronic issue in the State.

If the survey report can open eyes of a few people, all the efforts invested to compile the report would be considered fruitful, Serto Tondana Kom who hails from Hermontlang village, Samulamian Block, Churachandpur district.

Serto Tondana Kom had already published another survey report which said that the people of Manipur lost Rs 35 crore on account of taking other routes when the new Sanjenthang bridge was under construction. In regards to the economic loss of the state due to the bands and blockade, the survey report will be submitted to Chief Minister of Manipur and other department concern.

Handloom, handicraft training becomes boon for school dropouts in Sikkim

Gangtok, April 9: With an endeavour to preserve and propagate the art and craft skill of the local artisans of Sikkim and to provide job opportunities to the school dropouts, the directorate of handcrafts and handloom in the state has taken an initiative to generate employment opportunities.

Many youngsters, especially girls, stop going to school in Sikkim due to financial problems and lack of adequate facilities. However, to empower women and check dropout rate in the region, the directorate is generating employment opportunities by providing

skill training on handloom and craft making.

Girls of different age groups are acquiring the training without any hindrance, thus making them self-reliant.

"After completing the training, I will try to open a private enterprise and would also like to teach the children from my village if they are interested in learning," said a trainee.

As many as 100 young girls are getting trained in the institute.

Various techniques of weaving items are being taught to the girls under proper guidance of trained instructors.

"Girls come here for training with a hope to do something.

Instead of wasting their time at home they can join the institute and earn some money," said Meena Sunwar, instructor.

"Boys are not very interested in the work but girls are, as you can see we have more girls here. They not only work here but also at home. Since 2009, girls are being given admissions in thangka and wood carving sections," said Chewang Bhutia, Assistant Director.

Moreover, after undergoing rigorous training for almost two years, the girls are given a choice of working in the institute or starting a private enterprise of their own.
