More State News **Kidney Transplantation** in Manipur – 1 year & looking ahead

IT News Imphal, Aug 16: Shija Institute of Kidney Science completed 1 year of K i d n e y Transplantation on the 14th of August, 2017. In the last one year, it has successfully performed 10 (ten) idney Transplantations on 6 female and 4 male recipients including 3 (three) from Nagaland. The Transplantation team is led by Dr. G u l i v e r Potsangbam, Director and Consultant and Nephrologist and Dr. Somorendro P a o n a m , Consultant Urologist & Renal Transplant

Surgeon, Shija Institute of Kidney Science. The donor Nephrectomy (removal of kidney) is done Laparoscopically. The institute is now equipped with 14 Dialysis machines and uses Double RO water and is pioneering in comprehensive Kidney Care in the region. The dialysis facility at the centre includes advanced machines like CRRT, SLED, etc. CRRT is used to treat critically ill, hospitalized patients in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU) who develop acute kidney injury (AKI). SLED is used as a renal replacement modality in critically ill patients with acute

Suspected militant killed in Dhaka hotel raid

By Siam Sarower Jamil, IT News Dhaka, Aug 15: A suspected militant was killed during an operation conducted by the law enforcers at a hotel in Panthapath area of the capital. Sanowar Hossain, Additional Deputy Commissioner of Counter Terrorism and Transnational Crime (CTTC), said the first phase of the operation at the hotel has been ended, leaving a suspected

militant dead. Sounds of heavy gunfire and explosion were heard from the Hotel Olio International near

Square Hospitals around 9:50am, witnesses said. Earlier this morning. Counter Terrorism and Transnational Crime unit cordoned off the hotel

Kashmir, Aug. 16: In a fresh crackdown against separatist leaders in Jammu and Kashmir, the National Investigation Agency is conducting searches at 12 locations in Srinagar and north Kashmir in connection with terror funding.Officials in the central probe agency said the searches are being carried out at 12 locations in Srinagar, Baramulla and Handwara districts They said those being raided Wednesday have alleged links to

persons being investigated in this case. According to India Today TV, the locations being raided include properties of relatives of Zahoor Watali, a prominent businessman in the Valley and a known Hurriyat supporter.

The current crackdown is a part of NIA investigation against allegations that separatists leaders



suspecting it a militant hideout. Officer-in-Charge (OC-Investigation) of Kalabagan Police Station Samir Chandra Sutradhar said, "We have the information that militants are staying in the No. 301 room of the hotel's fourth storey but we are not number." sure about their

Delhi and Srinagar were raided on 4 June as part of the ongoing investigation. The NIA had also questioned the

sons of pro-Pakistan separatist leader Syed Ali Shah Geelani on 8 August over his alleged links with Hafiz Saeed.

Saeed, leader of the Pakistan-based Jamaat-ud-Dawa and the banned terrorist outfit Lashkar-e-Taiba, is reportedly said to be a prominent source of funding for the pro-Pakistan separatist factions in the Valley and the money is subsequently being channeled to fund protesters and militants in the Valley, sources told PTI.

The NIA had also questioned Deputy Superintendent of Police

(DySP) Faheem Ali, who handles separatist leader Mirwaiz Umer Farooq's security, in connection with the case. Ali was the first police officer from the state to be interrogated by the NIA. The NIA had arrested seven persons

 Altaf Ahmed Shah, Naveem Khan, Peer Saifullah, Raja Mehrajuddin Kalwal, Aftab Hilali Shah alias Shahid-ul-Islam and Ayaz Akbar Khandey and Farooq Ahmad Dar alias Bitta Karate — on 24 July.

They were arrested on the charges of criminal conspiracy and waging war against India.

Altaf Ahmad Shah is the son-in-law of Hurriyat leader Syed Ali Shah Geelani, who advocates Jammu and Kashmir's merger with Pakistan Islam is a close aide of Hurriyat lea

ader Mirwaiz Umar Farooq. Ayaz Akbar is the spokesperson for the Geelani-led Hurriyat.
