The rascal Godman drama

Something seems to be seriously wrong with the people of Haryana and its neighbouring state who are blind follower of Godman Gurmeet Ram Rahim Singh who was convicted 20 years jail term for raping his follower. Rape is being criticised across the country and many are voicing stern punishment for the rapist. But what is more surprising is that why so many people are against the Court verdict for punishment of the so call God man who is accused of raping so many girls including his adopted daughter. The violence unleashed by Dera Sacha Sauda supporters in

the immediate aftermath of the conviction and arrest of Godman Gurmeet Ram Rahim Singh is highly condemnable. But even more so is the abject surrender to the goons by the Harvana government which allowed thousands to congregate in Panchkula where the CBI court's verdict in the rape case involving Ram Rahim was delivered and to wreak havoc on innocent residents. Accountability for such gross mishandling of an event has to start from the top. By that token, the State's Chief Minister, Manohar Lal Khattar, does not deserve to be in the coveted saddle for one more day. He miscalculated and misjudged the reaction of the Sacha Sauda supporters who had gone to Panchkula with violence in their head, and apparently believed the assurances of the Godman that his cadres would not resort to violence.

There was indeed a perceptible softness of approach for which innocent people paid with their lives and property. Residents of Panchkula who were witness to the ghastly events insist that the miscreants were well-prepared and both the local police and the para-military forces showed appalling dereliction of duty. It was the army which, with a mere 350 soldiers, controlled the situation from turning

Prime Minister Narendra Modi's 'Mann ki baat' radio address yesterday whose crux was that violence in the name of faith was unacceptable, would indeed ring hollow if the Chief Minister is not removed in pursuance of the

principle of accountability.
It is on the lips of the entire media and the citizenry that this was a clear case of the BJP having had a soft corner for the Godman and his sect. It is common knowledge that the State government was indebted to Dera Sacha Sauda for having supported it wholeheartedly in the last Assembly elections. In the preceding elections it was the Congress that was the principal beneficiary. With an estimated five crore supporters, the dera was a formidable

But that did not mean that the State administration did not have a responsibility to protect the people from lumpen crowds that went berserk. The ghastly events in Panchkula and some other strongholds of Sacha Sauda have drilled fear in the minds of people at large. Horrible memories of the sect's supporters going on the rampage will live on in people's minds for a long time. If the Modi government is to make amends and win back the trust of the people even partially, it must act fast.

Not only must the Chief Minister be sacked and replaced by a person of unimpeachable public goodwill, the miscreants of that day must be punished for their misdeeds without fear or favour. Above all, the BJP and the Congress in particular must learn a lesson from the events of that fateful Friday not to sacrifice public interest at the altar of political expediency and vote bank politics.

Marital rape: Centre's stand in Delhi High Court sparks big debate on social media

New Delhi, Aug. 29: Government of India's firm stand against making marital rape a criminal offence has sparked debate on social media. On Tuesday, the Centre in its submission to Delhi High Court said marital rape is not defined in any statue, while rape is defined under Section 375 of IPC. It said, "Defining marital rape would call for a broad based consensus of the society." The Centre argued, "What may appear to be marital rape to an individual wife, it may not appear so to others. As to what constitutes marital rape and what would constitute marital non-rape needs to be defined precisely before a view on its criminalization is taken."

The Centre's submission further said, "That it has to been ensured adequately that marital rape does not become a phenomenon which may destabilize the institution of marriage apart from being an easy tool for harassing the husbands. Quoting the misuse of section 498A of IPC observed by courts, the Centre's sumbission said it needs to be "ensured adequately that marital rape does not become a phenomenon which may destabilize the institution of marriage apart from being an easy tool for harassing the husbands."

"If all sexual acts by a man with his own wife will qualify to be marital rape, then the judgment as to whether it is a marital rape or not will singularly rest with the wife. The question is what evidences the Courts will rely upon in such circumstances as there can be no lasting evidence in case of sexual acts between a man and his own wife," it added.

Centre's submission has divided social media usersas divergent opinions have come up. Swaraj Kaushal, Supreme Court lawyer, former governor and husband of Union External Affairs Minister Sushma Swaraj on Tuesday tweeted, "There will be more husbands in the jail, than in the house". When a user asked if he was defending marital rape, Kaushal replied, "There is nothing like marital rape. Our homes should not become police stations". Journalist and writer Rana Ayyub commented on Swaraj's stand, saying, "Ex governor and husband of MEA sushma swaraj defends marital rape. So don't rejoice yet over sending godmen to jail."

Celebrated author Devdutt Pattanaik, however, believes marital rape should be declared unconstitutional. "Now that we have finally declared triple talaq unconstitutional, will we ple

declare marital rape & homophobia to be unconstitutional?," he tweeted. Senior journalist Nidhi Rajdan said, "India can learn something from its neighbours. Nepal has laws against marital rape, so does Bhutan." another tweet, she argues, "So the govt is saying it's ok to be raped once you're married. It's ok for husbands to rape wives? Wives can't say no? Pathetic logic."

However, Madhavan Narayanan, journalist and writer, tweeted, "There is reckless lobbying by activists on #MaritalRape. Out of context statements and poor understanding of first principles." Supreme Court lawyer Karuna Nundy, tweeted, "At marital rape constitutionality hearing today: *Govt now supports marital rape exception. In writing. * Another

MRA popped up. Tomorrow." Maya Mirchandani, Senior Fellow at ORF, says, "It's (Centre's) commitment to gender justice seems restricted to abolishing #Tripletalaq. Marital rape/dowry deaths almost never mentioned. Why?"

The Centre had also argued that India doesn't need to follow countries where marital rape has been criminalised. "That the fact that other countries, mostly western, have criminalized marital rape does not necessarily mean India should also follow them blindly. This country has its own unique problems due to various factors like literacy, lack of financial empowerment of the majority of females, mindset of the society, vast diversity, poverty, etc. and these should be considered carefully before criminalizing marital rape."
