The refusal followed the drivers' demands to take action against militants who fired at trucks and oil tankers along the NH 37 on Monday. They denied police claims that the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) and Sashastra Seema Bal (SSB) personnel escorting the trucks responded to the firing.
On Wednesday, the Manipur

High Court directed the state government to escort at least 200 oil tankers from Assam to Imphal. While petrol pumps remain

closed, roadside vendors are selling fuel at Rs 150-200 a litre.

# Meghalaya Governor V Shanmuganathan Resigns After 'Young Ladies Club' Controversy

Shillong, Jan. 27: Meghalaya Governor V Shillong, Jan. 2... Meghalaya Governor V Shanmuganathan has resigned days after nearly 100 members of his staff alleged in a letter to Prime Minister Narendra Modi that he had "compromised the dignity" of the Governor's House and turned it into a "young ladies

club". Mr Shanmuganathan, who also has additional charge of Arunachal Pradesh, has denied the allegations.

The letter signed by 98 workers of the Governor's House in Shillong - widely

Republic Day was being celebrated. "The Governor should step down. We want impartial probe into sexual harassment in the governor's house," said Tarun Bharatiya,

A day after Shanmuganathan decided to step down as Governor of Meghalaya and Arunachal Pradesh, President Pranab Mukherjee, accepting his resignation, gave Assam Governor, Banwarilal Purohit additional charge of Meghalaya. # Demonetisation, GST to fetch more revenues to government: Jaitley

Visakhapatnam, Jan. 27: Finance Minister Arun Jaitley today said demonetisation shook the financial system for a short while but will integrate the shadow economy with the formal in the long run and ensure better tax compliance.

He said most contentious issues regarding the Goods and Services Tax (GST) have been sorted out between the Centre and states and the new indirect tax regime is at the final stages of implementation. He was speaking after inaugurating the two-day 23rd edition of CII Partnership Summit currently underway in Visakhapatnam.

The finance minister said with the implementation of GST, new indirect tax regime will make India one single market, eliminate multiple assessments, check evasion and bring more revenues into the system. He further said the government plans to implement GST, from July 1st.

Mr. Jaitley also said Andhra Pradesh has achieved double digit

growth rate in the country. He said the State is progressing with the sole aim of achieving speedy industrialisation and strong economy. He said Andhra Pradesh has become the top state in the country in ease of doing business. Mr. Jaitley said the government is inviting FDIs sector wise.

He said the Centre had established several industries in record time in the State after bifurcation and is concentrating on the overall development of the state, emphasizing that there is wider scope for employment in manufacturing and service sectors He gave a call to the industrialists to come forward with investments in AP as there is huge scope for it.

Gajapati Raju, Y.S.Chaudhary and Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu participated in the inaugural of the summit being attended by more than 350 delegates from
