

JE/Dengue Alert:

State Health Dept swung into action

Imphal, July 19: Recent spread of Dengue, Malaria and Japanese Encephalitis epidemic at various part of Churachandpur district has prompted state health department to swung into action for fighting the spread of the diseases. Besides, sending medical team to the villages reported with spread of such disease, the Directorate of Health Services and National Health Mission had started conducting awareness campaign free health camp. Today an awareness cum interaction program on Vector Borne Diseases with special focus on diseases like Dengue, Malaria and Japanese Encephalitis with resource persons from Department of health and services, Govt. of Manipur and media persons was held at DC Complex, Churachandpur District.

It may be mentioned that there is a total of 41 confirmed cases of Dengue till 19th July. 36 confirmed cases of Japanese Encephalitis and 1 confirmed case of H1N1 (Flu). Out of the 41 cases of Dengue 38 (92%) patients are from Churachandpur and 19 out of 36 cases i.e. 52% of Japanese Encephalitis are reported from Churachandpur district. One person has already expired from Japanese Encephalitis. The program was also attended by Shyam Lal Poonia, Deputy Commissioner, Churachandpur, and various media groups and channels invitees. Dr. K Lokendro Singh, Director Department of Health Services speaking to the media persons said that the diseases in

question seems to concentrate at Churachandpur mainly as majority of the patients diagnosed hails from Churachandpur and its outskirt villages. He said that Health services alone can't effectively counter the disease and media has a larger role to play in fighting these diseases. He stated that compared to previous years, this year the cases of Dengue, malaria and Japanese Encephalitis were discovered early and is under control. Steps like fogging and fumigations have been taken at the reported sites, he added. Dr. Kh Sasheekumar Mangang while speaking to the media said that concentration of such diseases in Churachandpur is

because of the living style and poor economic condition of the people. He further said that fumigation and fogging are not absolute solution as the mosquitoes have developed resistances against such chemicals and they caused more harm than good to human health. On being asked by Imphal Times if there is an alternative to fumigation, he stated that a good health institution and maintaining a good and clean surrounding and proper use of mosquito nets are a better solution. The program highlighted the need of information sharing and awareness to counter the breeding of mosquitoes and stops further spread of the disease.

Nagaland Governor appoints T.R. Zeliang as new CM

Kohima, July 19: Nagaland Governor today appointed new TR Zeliang as new chief minister of the state. Raj Bhavan sources said Mr. Zeliang will be sworn in as Chief Minister at 3 pm today. Governor PB Acharya has asked Zeliang to prove his majority on the floor of the House on or before on Saturday, the July 22nd. Zeliang staked claim to form government in Nagaland with a majority support of 47 members of the Legislative Assembly. Earlier this morning Chief Minister Shurhozelie Liezietsu and his MLAs did not turn up to face a floor test at a special session of the state assembly

follow which the House was adjourned sine die. Report says, Mr. Zeliang was forced out of office in February following large scale protests over holding of urban local bodies election with 33 per cent reservation for women. With this, the Naga Peoples' Front led Democratic Alliance of Nagaland Government in the State will have the fourth Chief Minister within its five years term of ruling the State. It may be mentioned that the incumbent Chief Minister Shurhozelie who is facing a rebellion from his party MLAs did not turn up to face a floor test today. The Governor had earlier asked the Speaker to

summon an emergent special session of the state assembly today for the chief minister to seek the confidence vote.

17 year old boy drown

Momocha fell into the water when he slip from an air tight tyre tube while on his way to fetch fish from fish net station at the Wangoi Mamang Leiphprakpam Ngangou pat.

Yumnam Momocha is a student studying in Class 10. Locals of the Wangoi Mamang Leiphprakpam Ngangou pat along with the army personnel have begun search operation for the body of Yumnam Momocha but still no sign of the body to be found at the time of filing this report. Mention may be that the incident occurred area is under the Ngangou Loukol which is still affected by water from the recent flood broke out from the Imphal River.

Students' protestors throng Raj Bhavan

Students from various schools and colleges chanting slogans marched on Keisampat Leimajam Leikai towards Raj Bhavan. Students protestors gathered in front of the Raj Bhavan were also joined by students of TG School and GP College in the protest rally demanding a law to prevent non-locals from



contesting elections and to stop playing election politics on population influx. Though Imphal West Police personnel tried to control the protestors, the students continued to shout the slogans in front of Raj Bhavan.

Later, four representatives from the students' protestors were allowed to meet the governor at Raj Bhavan and a memorandum was also submitted. The protest rally was organised by Kangleipak Students' Association (KSA).

Gold worth over 2 crore seized

Do's & Don'ts

- Do**
- Cover your mouth and nose with a handkerchief or tissue when you cough or sneeze.
 - Wash your hands often with soap and water or use an alcohol based gel.
 - Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth.
 - Avoid crowded places.
 - Stay more than an arm's length from person afflicted with flu.
 - Get plenty of sleep.
 - Drink plenty of water and eat nutritious food.
- Do Not:**
- Shake hands or hug in greeting.
 - Spit in public.
 - Take medicines specially aspirin without consulting a physician.
- IF YOU THINK YOU HAVE H1N1 FLU:**
- Stay at home, if advised by doctor.
 - Do not travel or go to work or school.
 - Avoid close contact with others for 7 days after your symptoms begin or until you have been symptom-free for 24 hours whichever is longer.

17 NGO's of Middle East are funding Indian- Bangladeshi terrorists

Dhaka, July 19: The government intelligence agencies of Bangladesh will move to bring all financial transactions in the country under their strict surveillance to prevent Islamic militant fund transactions, said officials. After finding unusual transactions, the overall activities of 17 foreign non-government development organisations have already been brought under intense surveillance. According to a relevant taskforce meeting last month, the most of the terrorist financing has happened through mobile banking and courier services. The meeting asked for more surveillance on transactions and compulsory preservation of records of those transactions. Intelligence agencies found 17 NGOs involved in militants funding, the meeting said, laying emphasis on more scrutiny of the transactions. It said monitoring on online transactions, especially banking transactions with foreign countries, should be strengthened. The meeting was chaired by Industries Minister Amir Hossain Amu, chief of the taskforce. It was attended by Home Minister Asaduzzaman Khan. Other officials of different forces participated in the meeting. The authorities have initiated strong monitoring and surveillance after militancy incidents since 2012. After surveillance of last five years, the intelligence agencies have found more accurate information about the militancy transactions by the 17 NGOs. Bangladesh Bank officials said most of these NGOs are under the control of Jamaat-e-Islami politics. The NGOs are based in

Kuwait, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Bahrain and other Middle East countries. Some domestic NGOs are also under surveillance now. Major NGOs of the list, which include Bangladesh Krishi Kalyan Samity, Muslim Aid Bangladesh, Rabeta Al-Alam al-Islami, Qatar Charitable Society, Islamic Relief Agency, Al-Furkan Foundation, Kuwait Joint Relief Committee, International Islamic Relief Organization (IRO), Hayatul Ighachha, Revival of Islamic Heritage Society, Tawhidi Noor and Al-Muntada al-Islami. BFIU General Manager Devprasad Deb Nath said to the Imphal Times "A number of issues including militancy funding were discussed at the June 21 meeting which came up with some important decisions," said "Among the decisions, the issue of militant funding is very sensitive and important." he added. Devnath said the surveillance has been increased against the 17 NGOs as the authorities concerned have found the evidence of helping Bangladeshi militancy and terrorist activities. They are engaged with north-east indian terrorists too. We informed this matter to the indian govt. agencies. According to the Annual Report 2014 of Baangladesg Finance Intelligence Unite, the number of suspicious transactions in different financial institutions including banks and insurance firms in Bangladesh is increasing alarmingly. The normal process is not being followed in these transactions. In the financial year 2013-14, there were 619 such suspicious transactions in Bangladesh. The amount of the previous year was 420. In the fiscal year 2011-12, the number of suspicious transactions was 175.
