

10 houses swept away by flood water at Lilong

Imphal, June 3: Heavy monsoon rain continued to unleash havoc in various places across Manipur as over 10 houses at Lilong Haoreibi Awang Leikai have been swept away following Imphal river bank breached at Lilong Haoreibi Awang Leikai early on Sunday. There, the Imphal river bank collapsed about 100 ft around 4 am, according to officials.

Thousands have been rendered homeless due to the river bursting its bank in the area. Residents expressed dismay over alleged failure of the state government to provide immediate relief. They said they were battling the flood water. Officials said over 10 houses nearby the Imphal river bank in Lilong area have been swept away. About 20 km of stretch starting from Lilong Haoreibi under Lilong Assembly Constituency have been submerged under flood water.

PREPAK condoles death of col Kim

Due to incessant rainwater the last three days, multiple breaches occurred in ImphalTurel in the area of MayangImphal on Sunday inundating approximately 30 houses of the village.

Breakthrough in HSO prez killing, suspect held

Imphal, July 3: Thoubal commandos has reportedly picked up a suspect in connection with the killing of president of Haokip Students' Organisation Letkholal Haokip alias Palal at his residence at National Games Village on June 23. Sources said a major breakthrough in the investigation of the killing was achieved today when the suspect was arrested from the general area of Komlathabi which falls under Chandel district. Though there are

reports of other arrest being made as well the information including that of the one in Komlathabi could not be officially confirmed as yet. Letkholal was shot five times by the assailants from close range in the evening of June 23 and died on the spot. The killers reportedly escaped in a grey Maruti car. Many students' organizations including the Kuki Sporting Organisation straight away condemned the killing asserting that repeated attempts on the lives of leaders of civil organizations

cannot be tolerated. Beginning the next day candle light vigils and sit-in-protest were staged in different parts of the state condemning the killing. The family has been refusing to claim the body of the student leader unless the perpetrators are booked. KSO initially served a 48-hour deadline on June 25 to the state administration for their arrest but went on to extend it by four more days after finding the investigation of the police going ahead satisfactory.

Instead of blindly following the trends of popular Bollywood and Hindustani music, it will eventually prove to be beneficial if we concentrate on our indigenous music and create a niche in the South Asian music market, he stated. Many eminent musicians spoke words of encouragement for both Madakini and Rabishankar on their excellent records in their careers overcoming the odds of being visually impaired.

AIIMS to adopt 50 physically challenged old-age people

New Delhi, July 3: The AIIMS in association with an NGO would adopt 50 elderly people, who are economically and physically challenged, to provide them with various health care facilities. These senior citizens would be adopted from various old age homes and the society as per their health requirements and access to health care

facilities. As part of the programme, the Geriatric department of the AIIMS and the NGO 'Healthy Aging India' would provide free medicines at their doorstep and also facilitate treatment and transport to the medical institute in case of a medical emergency, said Dr Prashun Chatterjee of the AIIMS. The move came after a study

initiated by the Geriatric department of the AIIMS in multiple old-age homes in Delhi and NCR (specially run by NGOs) revealed that around 80 per cent of the home residents were devoid of any health facility. Around 1,200 inmates living in 20 old age homes and around 4,000 from the society were interviewed during the study.

Neo-colonialism a possibility, says Ram Madhav

New Delhi, July 3: Senior BJP leader Ram Madhav today said geopolitics in the Indian Ocean region had made "neo-colonialism" a possibility with countries seeking to dominate each other through money, market and military. "We know the evils of colonialism. They are fresh in our minds," Madhav said while delivering a lecture on 'Emerging Horizons in India-Vietnam Relations'. "It is important for us to make sure that the 21st century version of the same colonialism does not return to haunt us and succeed," added Madhav, who is affiliated to India Foundation, a BJP-linked think

thank. His comments come in the backdrop of China increasingly asserting its claim over the Spratly archipelago in the South China Sea, which has overlapping claims from Vietnam and other littoral southeast and east Asian countries. Madhav also pitched for Vietnam and India to "jointly and independently work towards defeating all such forces and tendencies". "Geopolitics in the Indian Ocean region makes the possibility of neo-colonialism a reality with countries trying to dominate others through money, market and through military," he added.

Madhav's remarks also assume significance in the wake of the ongoing stand-off between Chinese and Indian troops in the Doklam area near Sikkim. India has commercial interests in the South China Sea, which hosts one of the major Sea Lanes of Communications (SLOCs). Contending that the Indo-Pacific region had emerged as a "new global powerhouse", Madhav said the global power axis had shifted from the Pacific-Atlantic to this region. "But this region is also a home to big militaries, with massive defence budgets increasing military movements and purchases. It is projected that
