Public transport system in Manipur

The need for a viable public transport system in the state and especially in the valley areas has been felt for a long time, and the move by the Biren-led state government to reactivate the public transport services should be hailed as one of the more pragmatic and necessary decisions given the rapidly increasing traffic congestions and correspondingly decreasing civic sense of motorists. However, reports of the newly reintroduced interdistrict and city bus services by the state government running at a loss hardly makes for interesting news, for the outcome has been expected, and one experienced before. The previous government even tried to privatize the operation but couldn't find any taker. What is interesting is the fact that despite the claim of loss which obviously would mean that there isn't any passenger willing to avail of the service despite the low fare and fairly good conditions of the buses, the roads around the city are still chock-a-block with private passenger service providers who would not have remained in business had there been no passenger. The contradictory situations clearly points to a grave anomaly- either in the planning of the routes or schedule or in implementation and monitoring the whole operations.

Considering the lack of parking spaces and increasing traffic

which inevitably increases pollution and noise, the public transport system presents a better and more sensible alternative to the people of the state, and should be presented as such. The government think-tank should consider ways and means to persuade the public to rely more on the public transport system rather than to use their own private vehicles as far as possible. Increasing parking fees might be one of the means to dissuade vehicle owners from using their private vehicles. Another move that would make a significant difference to the traffic problem being faced by the public at present would be to limit the area of operation of autorickshaws to the peripheries of the city and preventing them from entering the heart of the city, at least during the peak rush hours. Perhaps an opinion poll or campaign involving the public can throw light as to the root cause of the public transport services not being able to take off and be commercially viable despite the pressing need for it. Another aspect of the problem could be the lack of monitoring of the operations on the ground. Most of us who have used public transport services in other states would have been familiar with the practice of inspectors of transport making random checks on various routes regularly and penalizing ticketless travellers. Also a means of checks and balances on the transport crews can also make a difference to the whole operation.

There is no reason why the public transport system cannot be a success in the state. But for that to happen, various steps need to be taken up. Taking into consideration the opinions and suggestions of the public who are the end users would go a long way in forming a practical and acceptable plan of action.

Opposition Presidential candidate Meira Kumar files her nomination

New Delhi, June 28: Opposition candidate and former Lok Sabha speaker Meira Kumar today filed her nomination for Presidential Election in Parliament House. The 75-yearold Ms Kumar is the joint opposition candidate of 17 non-NDA parties against the ruling NDA's nominee Ram Nath Kovind. Congress President Sonia Gandhi, former Prime Minister Dr Manmohan Singh, NCP leader Sharad Pawar, BSP leader Satish Mishra, CPM general secretary Sitaram Yechury, TMC leader Derek O Brien, Karnataka chief Minister Mr Siddaramaiah and Puducherry Chief Minister V Narayanswamy were

also present on the occasion. Talking to media after filing her nomination papers, Ms Kumar said from today the fight for ideology has started. She said this ideology is of democratic values, inclusiveness freedom of press and destruction of caste system. She said, she will be leaving for Sabarmati tomorrow

to launch her campaign. Congress Vice President Rahul Gandhi has said Meira Kumar represents values that binds us together as a nation which is against the ideology of divisiveness. In a tweet, Mr Gandhi said, he is proud to have Ms Kumar as opposition's presidential candidate.

4 bodies of suspected HPC-D cadres recovered from Barak River

Pherzawl, June 28: Four bodies suspected to be cadres belonging to the Hmar Peoples' Convention-Democratic (HPC-D), were fished out from Barak River near Jiribam and Barak River at Palarbond,

It is suspected that the bodies were those robbers who had reportedly robbed doctors and nurses at Sivapukar Primary Health Centre, Pherzawl district on the intervening night of June 21 and 22, according to reports

The militant group HPC-D) at Sinlung

reportedly shot dead some of its cadres believed to have been involved in the Sivapukar robbery incident and later threw their lifeless corpses into the Barak River. Reports claimed that HPC-D punished them to death for the excess they had committed against the medical staff of Sivapukar PHC. It may be recalled that on June It may be recalled that on June 21 midnight some armed persons wearing camouflage dresses intruded Sivapukar PHC and there they reportedly robbed the doctor and nurses. The robots then fled the site with Rs 10,000 and two mobile phones after firing three-four

rounds in the air to make their way.

Fearing their safety, the doctor and nurses from Sivapukar and other neighbouring PHCs left their postings the next day. It infuriated

the neighbouring villages. Demanding action against those robbers, irate villagers reportedly tried to storm Sinlung designated camp of HPC-D militants, the reports claimed.

Two bodies were recovered from Barak River at Palarbond on Tuesday and another two bodies fished out from Manipur side of the river yesterday.

US to help Indian armed forces it needs to support security in South Asia: Mike Pence

New Delhi, June 28: The US Vice President Mike Pence has said that his country will help the Indian armed forces to obtain the resources and technology it needs to support security in South Asia. He said the process to approve the

In a key note address to members of the US India Council in Washington yesterday, Pence said, the US and India can deepen their ties in many industries and areas He urged India to enact the necessary economic reforms to ensure fair and reciprocal bilateral trade. He also said India and the US, are strong partners in fight against

He said, the United States and India already collaborate to a significant extent. But in the face of terror networks that are ever-more sophisticated, ever-more dispersed He said, both countries will continue to take renewed action to facilitate two-way information and intelligence sharing to confront this threat.

Centre makes linking of existing Aadhaar with PAN of taxpayers mandatory from 1st July

Delhi, June 28: The New Government has made it mandatory to link existing Aadhaar numbers with Permanent Account Number (PAN) of taxpayers with effect from July 1

Amending income tax rules and notifying the same, the Government has also made quoting of the 12digit biometric Aadhaar or the enrolment ID a must at the time of application of permanent account number (PAN). The revenue nt said the rules will come

into force from July 1, 2017. Finance Minister Arun Jaitley

through an amendment to tax proposals in the Finance Bill for 2017-18 had made Aadhaar mandatory for filing income tax returns and provided for linking of PAN with Aadhaar to check tax evasion through use of multiple PAN cards.

There are over 25 crore PAN card holders in the country while Aadhaar has been issued to 111 crore people. Army and ITBP officers take stock of Sikkim border showdown with China

Union Home Ministry on Tuesday reviewed the situation along the Sino-Indian border following tension in the forward areas in Sikkim after a scuffle between personnel of the Indian Army and the People's Liberation Army (PLA). The meeting, attended by representatives of the Army and the Indo-Tibetan Border Police, besides the home ministry took stock of the border, particularly in Sikkim, officials said.

Of the 3 488-km Sino-Indian border from Jammu and Kashmir to Arunachal Pradesh, 220 km falls in Sikkim. The scuffle between the Indian Army and the PLA led to Chinese troops damaging bunkers on the Indian side. The incident happened in the first week of June near the Lalten post in the Doka La general area after a face-off between the two forces, which triggered tension. After the scuffle, China stopped the travel of Indian pilgrims to Kailash Mansarovar through the Nathu La border post in Sikkim.

China on Tuesday lodged a protest with India over the alleged "crossing of boundary" by its troops in the Sikkim sector and demanded their immediate withdrawal. Beijing warned that future visits of Indian pilgrims to Kailash Mansarovar will depend on the resolution of the standoff. Government officials
