Deck clears for first phase Manipur Legislative Election

Imphal, March 3: All preparations have been put in place for free and fair poll in tomorrow's first phase of the state assembly elections. A total of 11 Lakh and 19 thousand electorates

across of 38 assembly constituencies from the six districts of Imphal East, Imphal West, Bishnupur, Kangpokpi, Churachandpur and Pherzawl will exercise their franchise in tomorrow's poll. Polling will start at seven in the morning and will end at three in the afternoon. Altogether 168 candidates including six women are in the fray in the first phase.

Out of the 1643 polling stations for the first phase, 529 polling stations are identified as sensitive. 280 companies of Central Paramilitary Forces will be deployed and only central force will be deputed for polling duty in all polling stations.

Meanwhile, the Eastern Army Commander, Lt. Gen. Praveen Bakshi had already visited the state on Wednesday on a two day visit to review the security situation ahead of the assembly elections. The

Meanwhile, border trade has been totally shut down following the closure of the border gate. Namphalong Market complex remain shuts and the international trade is expected to be affected till March 8, that is till the conclusion of the 2nd phase election.

Bomb found at candidate's residence

Imphal, March 3: One hand grenade was found today inside the residential complex of NPP candidate for Kshirgao Assembly Constituency Vevek Raj Wangkhem at around 8.30 am. The grenade was found at the lone of the candidate's residence. Police team who rush the site safely retrieved the the bomb.

Meanwhile, locals of the area today staged a sit-in-protest in front of the residence of Vevek Raj Wangkhem decrying the placing of the hand grenade. The protestors urged concern authority to clarify the reason for placing of the bomb and also appealed not to repeat it in future. A local meira paibi said that such an act may cause serious casualty to innocent people as many people use to visit the candidates' residence for election purpose.

Vevek Raj Wangkhem is also the general secretary of National Peoples' Party. As of now no individual or groups have claimed responsibility of the placing of the bomb.

Congress eyes dominance, BJP promises end to economic blockade

Imphal, March 3: The elections fever has gripped Manipur as it gears up for the 11th state assembly polls. A total of 167 candidates of 17 political parties including the Congress, Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), Naga People's Front, All India Trinamool Congress and Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) besides others are in the fray.

Polling for the 60-member legislative assembly will be held in two phases on March 4 and March 8 respectively. Kicking off the BJP's campaign at Langjing Achouba ground in Imphal, Prime Minister Narendra Modi promised to find a solution to economic blockade that has crippled life in the state for months now if the BJP is voted to power.

"BJP government will be formed in Manipur and once we come into power we won't allow blockades to continue in the state. We promise that

and we will show how the administration functions," the Prime Minister said. Ahead of the assembly polls, Congress vice-president Rahul Gandhi also addressed a rally at Hapta Kangjeibung in Imphal and said that his party would guide Manipur on the path of development and prosperity.

"O. Ibobi Singh is the Chief Minister of Manipur and he will take into consideration the views of the common people and run the administration smoothly and this will benefit the people of Manipur and the state as a whole," Gandhi said. Over the last six months, several smaller parties have also emerged on the political scene. Irom Sharmila's People's Resurgence and Justice Alliance (PRJA) is one of the new parties. "In a multi-cultural society living in hills and valley and in between hill and valley, there will be a very harmonious living together

with understanding by connecting their hearts, to solve any problems by bringing real democracy in our state," said activist and PRJA candidate Sharmila. In wake of the polls, the Election Commission of India launched awareness campaign for the voters in Manipur.

"We launched our SVEEP campaign in the form of democracy event. On the event, election commissioner had coined the word 'Festival of Democracy' wherein all the stakeholders should participate in a festive mood either they are electors, political parties, candidates and officials. All of them should take it in the spirit of festival of democracy. That was the term the election commissioner coined it when he visited Manipur," said Vivek Kumar Dewangan, Chief Electoral Officer, Manipur. The election results will be announced on March 11.

Armed assailants burnt 4 vehicles of two candidates in Senapati district

Imphal, March 3: Four vehicles belonging to 2 candidates contesting the upcoming 11th Manipur Legislative Assembly election were hijacked and burnt by armed assailants today at 47-Karong Assembly Constituency in Senapati district.

Report said that one Bolero and a Tata Sumo vehicles used by workers of BJP candidate Joanthan Tao of Karong assembly constituency and another two vehicles an Alto car and a Tata Sumo use by supporters of LJP Candidate Kh Savanai who is also contesting at the same Assembly constituency were hijacked by armed militants on March 1, while they were campaigning for their respective candidates from Vaki area, the junction of Pural, Phuba And Chilivai area



located on top of Pural village. The vehicles were all found burnt down at the area today. On the hand, gun shots were heard at Motbung area in Kangpokpi district at around midnight yesterday. Report reaching here said that

KNF (p) summoned all village chiefs from Saitu area and threatened them to vote for BJP. The report added that on receiving that news, KRA (U) cadres blank fired in the air. There were no reports of any human casualty.
