

## SDC fined Rs 22,500 for holding back RTI information

**Imphal, May 14:** The Manipur Information Commission has imposed a fine of Rs 22,250 to the SPIO/SDC, Sagolmang, M Suranjay Singh, under the RTI Act 2005 for not furnishing information to an appellant on a mutation case within the mandated date of 89 days.

According to the decision of the commission passed on May 5, 2017, the SPIO/SDC had repeatedly failed to furnish information to the appellant, P Basant Singh in spite of numerous directions from the DC, Imphal East and the commission to furnish it. The SPIO/SDC also did not comply with an explanation (show-cause) called by the commission under Section 20 (1) of the RTI Act.

Basant had filed his RTI application on January 5, 2017 seeking information on a mutation case and related issues in respect to a homestead measuring 0.46 acres situated at Khundrakpam in Imphal East district. The DC, Imphal East directed the SDC, Sagolmang to dispose the case from his end through a letter dated

January 10, 2017. Having received no information, Basant filed a first appeal to the FAA/commissioner of revenue on February 2, 2017 after which the DC, IE reminded the SDC, Sagolmang to furnish the requisite information by March 25, 2017. Aggrieved by the total inaction of SDC even after the expiry of the last date, the appellant filed a second appeal before the commission.

On April 21, 2017, the commission directed the SPIO/SDC Sagolmang to furnish the complete information within 10 days and seek a written explanation for his failures to do so in the past. During the subsequent hearing, the SDC neither appeared nor submitted any reply to the explanation notice. The representative of the appellant pointed out the

even after a lapse of four months and directions from the FAA and commission the information had not been furnished and pleaded for imposition of necessary penalty under Section 20 (1) of the RTI Act, 2005. After consideration of arguments from both parties, the commission decided on imposition of the fine. The sum of Rs 22,500 which amounts to Rs 250 per day (89 days) is to be deposited to the Major Head-0070 Other Administrative Service, Sub Major 01 under Administration of Justice under intimation from the commission within 45 days from the date of the decision. The commission further directed the SDC/Sagolmang to provide complete information to appellant within a period of one month from May 5, 2017.

**Imphal, May 14:** The state police has categorically refused the allegations of harassment leveled against the department by human rights activist Binalakshmi Nepram who had asserted that a heavily armed police team came to her maternal home and threatened her and family members in her absence on Friday. Clarifying on the issue Inspector General of Police Clay Khongsai did agree that a team of SDPO Imphal went to the activist's maternal

residence at Sagolband Nepra Menjor Leikai but said it was purely an official visit to seek her statement in connection with a suo moto case concerning the alleged threat to Utsav Singh Bains, a Supreme Court advocate, by militants. The investigating officer went to meet Binalakshmi and take her statement as she was one of the two persons known to be closest to the advocate who had left the state without meeting the IO and recording his statement, Khongsai said. He

specifically mentioned that only the IO proceeded to her house and met family members while the rest of the police personnel stayed guard outside. The team returned after finding that she was not present there and during the brief stay there was no incident of issuing threats or using other forms of intimidation to the people present in her house, the IGP said dismissing such rumours doing rounds in the social media as totally false. ## Govt issues alert against latest cyber attack

**New Delhi, May 14:** Government's cyber security arm CERT-In has alerted vital institutions including RBI, stock markets and NPCI against the latest cyber attack that has infected thousands of systems globally. It has issued a list of do's and don'ts to these agencies and advised installation of relevant "patches" to protect against any data breaches. AIR correspondent reports that nearly 100 countries, including India, were hit by a massive cyber attack which began on Friday. A new ransomware named

"Wannacry" is spreading globally that encrypts files on the infected Windows PCs. As per the advisory issued by CERT In yesterday, the ransomware infects other computers on the same network and is also spreading through malicious attachments to e-mails. CERT-In has advised users and organisations to apply patches to Windows systems to prevent this infection. The attack was first reported from Sweden, Britain and France. Meanwhile, Microsoft has taken the unusual step of releasing security updates for some older versions of its Windows platforms to counter the cyber ransomware attacks.

"The helpline bearing number 181 is an attempt to provide all kinds of assistance - legal, police, medical, counseling and temporary support services - to women affected by violence," Meghalaya State Commission for Women chairperson Theilin Phanbuh said at its launch. It's centre is currently situated at Ganesh Das Government Maternal and Child Health Hospital in Shillong. "The helpline is a long felt need for women in distress and its launch will be a boon in reaching out to those who need of help," she said. Phanbuh also appealed to the helpline staff to dedicate

themselves to the cause and work to restore the dignity of women. Social welfare additional chief secretary H Marwein, who was present on the occasion, said that the helpline is an "effective mechanism that will go a long way in curbing sexual abuse and atrocities against women."

## North East region will have better rail connectivity: MoS Railways Rajen Gohain

**New Delhi, May 14:** Minister of State for Railways Rajen Gohain said that the North East region of the country will get better rail connectivity and service. Talking to AIR, he said that as per direction of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the Railway Ministry has laid emphasis upon the better rail connectivity in the region to promote tourism and other sectors. He said that the Railway Ministry will complete the double track project upto the

Guwahati via Goalpara within short period. Mr. Gohain said that for the electrified train traffic in Assam all the process have been completed. The minister said that 29 new trains are already introduced in North East region. The Ministry has proposed to declare the old Haflong station as a heritage station. Regarding the recruitment policy of North East Frontier Railway, Gohain said that the Ministry chalked out policy to recruit the local youths in 3rd and 4th grade posts.

## India to grow at 7.7% in 2018-19: IMF

**New Delhi, May 14:** The International Monetary Fund says India's growth is expected to rebound to 7 (point) 2 per cent in the 2017-18 fiscal and 7 (point) 7 per cent in 2018-19 after disruptions caused by demonetization. IMF has also recommended the removal of long-standing structural bottlenecks to enhance market efficiency. It

said temporary disruptions caused by cash shortages accompanying the currency exchange initiative are expected to gradually dissipate in 2017 as cash shortages ease. Such disruptions would also be offset by tailwinds from a favorable monsoon season and continued progress in resolving supply-side bottlenecks, the IMF said.
