Thoubal District MP Candidature Demand Committee has demanded that a person from the Assembly constituencies of Thoubal district that are included in the Outer Parliamentary constituency be sent to the Rajya Sabha as the voters in these constituencies have been denied the right to stand for election in their own parliamentary constituency. Election for the lone Rajya Sabha seat will be held on coming May 25 after it fell vacant following the death of Haji Abdul Salam who incidentally hails from Wabagai, one of the eight star-crossed Assembly star-crossed Assembly constituencies. The remaining Assembly constituencies in the Outer Parliamentary constituency whose 2.35 lakh electorates candidate are Heirok, Wangjing Tentha, Khangabok, Kakching, Sugnu and Hiyanglam, all part of the erstwhile Thoubal district, and Jiribam.

A sit in protest was also organised today to reinforce the demand to the state government. The committee has warned that it is all geared up to launch a series of intense agitations and even go far ahead to boycott the Rajya Sabha elections if the demand is not heeded.

The committee also expressed its unhappiness over the denial of the right to stand in the Lok Sabha elections as the outer constituency is reserved for ST, stating that the people of the eight Assembly constituencies have been reduced to status of second class citizens

In a joint statement, seven CSOs namely the All Tribal Women Organisation; Molnoi Area Welfare Council; Kuki Women Human Rights; Chingtam Nupi Apunba Lup, Pallel; District Women Council, UNMM, Chandel; Cente for Women and Girls; Molnoi Area Youth Union and Weaker Section Development Council demanded that the families demanded that the families of Nengneikim and Kaikholen Tuboi be given justice, adding that they will not stop condemning the

killing until the persons behind their deaths are booked. The bodies of Nengneikim, a teacher at a kids care centre, and Kaikholen Tuboi, 28, were discovered at separate places near Sugnu yesterday. Tuboi appeared to have been struck multiple times on the

head with a heavy, blunt object. The CSOs also addressed the press at Molnoi today. The secretary of Centre for Women and Girls Hechin Haokip spoke on behalf of the CSOS

Current status of DBT, financial inclusion reviewed

Imphal, May, 6: Deputy Chief Minister Shri Y. Joykumar Singh today reviewed the current status of Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) and Financial Inclusion relating to various welfare schemes which are being implemented in the State. The meeting which was held at the Conference Hall of Manipur Secretariat (South Block) and chaired by the

Deputy Chief Ministerdiscussed in length the technicalities of implementation of DBT for various schemes implemented by the departments.

Head of departments including from Rural Development, Social Welfare, Tribal Affairs & Hills and School Education deliberated on issues pertaining to the cent-percent

implementation of DBT and seeding of Aadhar & Mobile number with beneficiaries bank accounts in the State.

While acknowledging the difficulties faced by various departments in implementing schemes through DBT, mostly in the remote areas where banking facilities have not been provided, Shri Joykumar Singh instructed the bank officials to expedite means to open branches wherever necessary. He maintained that all major issues like infrastructure, connectivity and communication while opening bank branches would be addressed if all the stakeholders co-operate each other.He appealed to all the stakeholders to co-operate with the government to attain the target as it is one of the target set by the government. Regarding the opening of bank branches in the unbanked blocks in the State, Commissioner (Finance) Shri V. K. Dewanggan said, of the 32 unbanked blocks in the
