Dawn of a new era, declares Nagaland CM Urges Meiteis to play role of big brother to other ethnic groups in NE

Imphal, May 9: Nagaland chief minister Shurhozelie Liezeitsu announced today that a new era of peace and understanding is dawning in the northeast with the installation of a BJP led government in Manipur and appealed to the Meitei community to play the role of a big brother being the most advanced among different ethnic groups here and serve their younger brothers for their welfare. Reckoning the tumultuous relation between Nagaland and Manipur in the past, the Nagaland chief minister said the two states have been crisis ridden for some time but with the change in government that period is already over. “We are sorry for some of our leaders in the past who had exploited the situation for their selfish ends

and created (bad) feeling among different communities,” he said. Now, people have seen a new ray of hope and herald the dawn of peace and understanding with the change of government, he stated referring to the new government in Manipur. Stating that the alliance of BJP and NPF in Nagaland has made good impact in the neighbouring state, Liezeitsu further gave assurance of extended support to Manipur chief minister N Biren promising that the four NPF legislators will continue their support till the end. “I felt it was our victory when the new chief minister took over in Manipur,” said the veteran NPF leader. Liezeitsu underlined the need for all communities in the northeastern region to foster good relation with one



another as they have the same needs and proposed a major role for the Meiteis as the big brother. He said the major community in Manipur is also the most advanced group in the region. They have many

writers and scholars who must come forward and help in creating a peaceful situation, he added. On the landmark meeting that thaw the almost frozen relationship between the two

states, he said we will interact more and we will see that the relationship is based on solid foundation. In reply to a query he promised that though blockades were common in the past it will now become a

thing of the past. The people in the hills and valley of Manipur should learn to live together and our forefathers were very good neighbors. The Meiteis, Nagas and Kukis must understand that only through peace there will be development, he stated. On his part Biren said he had held doubt whether he was bound by shared beliefs to make a call on the Nagaland chief minister first as he was younger in age. He clarified that the visit of Liezeitsu, TR Zeliang and minister Yitachu was a courtesy call and there were no extra agenda. The Nagaland chief minister wanted to show his appreciation to the good momentum built up in both hills and valley for cohesive and peaceful existence during the first 40 days of the BJP led government, he claimed.

Pharmacy selling expiry drugs closed down by MSF

Imphal, May 10: Manipur Students' Federation (MSF) has closed down a pharmacy at Thangal Keithel, near Kastury Bridge here in Imphal today after it was found selling expired medicine. In a press meet held today at MSF office today afternoon, General Secretary, W Wanglemba Khaba said that the student body received a complaint from one Konsam Ibohcha (40) about an expiry

medicine (insulin) which he bought from a Pharmacy called Rishika Medicos, Thangal Keithel yesterday evening. Being a diabetic patient he injected the insulin as prescribed by doctor however, as he found himself in obnoxious condition he checked the medicine and found it to be expired. Later, today morning, he went again to the pharmacy to buy insulin and that too was found to be expired.



After the matter was put up to the MSF, the MSF conducted a raid in the pharmacy and found several other expiry medicines which were sold in the pharmacy. Later, the MSF closed down the pharmacy and appealed the concern authority to look into the matters.

JAC Langlailu submits memorandum to CM

Imphal, May 9: The JAC against the brutal murder of R Lunglailu has submitted a five point memorandum to chief minister N Biren today explaining in clear terms that her body which is still in RIMS morgue will not be claimed and agitations will be considered if the demands are not fulfilled. In the memorandum, the JAC charged Khurajiam Inaocha, the husband of Lunglailu and prime accused in the murder of preying on tribal girl students as a teacher, mentioning a previously molestation charge

and an affair with two different students and illicit relation with his sister in law Ashalata. His mother Memchoubi and Ashalata were also subsequently charged with participation in committing cruel acts and ill treatment of the deceased victim. Thereafter, the JAC demanded capital punishment for the three in connection with the murder. It sought ex-gratia to the next of kin of Lunglailu, his father R Kakhalan within five days, i.e May 14, 2017, with the rider that the body will not be claimed until there is an agreement.

It also demanded an official order to ban the relatives of the accused from entering Chingmeirong Rongmei village as to prevent further provocation. The JAC further asked the government for permission to execute the customary practice of fine or punitive action of Lough Garak, which is the taken imposition of fine of mithun or pig as to certify crime control. It also sought permission for performing the last rites of the deceased at the place where she breathe her last as per the customary practice.

NSCN-IM reiterated stands for 'Shared Sovereignty' with India

Imphal, May 9: While stating that the Indo-Naga political talks is at fast pace and progressing smoothly, the NSCN-IM has reiterated its stands for 'Shared Sovereignty' with India. The statement said that only a part of Nagalim was conquered by British and after the British left India there are no merger agreement between the Nagas and India. India invaded Nagalim and set up arbitrary boundaries and divided the Nagas without their consents, it added. On the other hand, the NSCN-IM termed the Shillong

Accord of Nov. 11, 1975 as the most treacherous accord. “ Through this very treacherous Accord signed in 1975 with India, the NNC/FGN surrendered to Govt. of India along with all the weapons and accepted the Constitution of India, unconditionally. Hence, it is not deniable that, those who were part of the NNC/FGN are already Indian by their own volitions and consents and they are traitors of Naga National movement. The NNC/FGN had committed the most severe act of betrayal and charging them of highest treasons is fully justified. The signing of the Shillong

Accord by the NNC/FGN is the greatest Political blunder ever committed against Naga Nation. They have forfeited their rights to talk about Naga Political issues and cannot represent the Nagas at any level”, the statement said. The statement also added that the NSCN had overcome series of treacherous and deadly onslaughts which were meticulously preplanned and perpetrated against it by the traitors of Naga nation. “However, God had not failed to protect the Nagas under the visionary and dynamic leaderships of former Yaruwio, Lt. Isak Chishi Swu and Ato Kilonser, Th. Muivah,

The younger Naga generations are fortunate enough that, the Nagas' Sovereign rights are being recognized by India. The acceptance of the Nagas as a unique people and as with equal status and as a separate entity with Sovereign rights is the biggest and highest Political achievement the Nagas had ever attained. The Framework Agreement ensuring for peaceful coexistence between the Nagas and India with shared Sovereignty will surely usher in peace and brighter Political era for the Nagas”, the statement said. “It is not deniable that,

reaching the Final Stage of Political negotiations with India, resulting in the signing of the 3 August Framework Agreement, 2015, has utterly surprised and had discouraged some Political organizations”, it added. The statement also expresses surprised by the wide and in-depth knowledge of Mr. Jagdamba Mall, who has written detailed accounts about Dr. S.C. Jamir, former Chief Minister and Governor. It said Jagdamba had fully exposed the true ugly colours of Dr. S.C. Jamir in context to his opposite and confronting roles against Nagas National Movement.
