IPS officer caught copying scored high in UPSC's ethics paper in 2014

Hyderabad, Nov. 1: IPS officer Safeer Karim, who was caught redhanded copying in UPSC Civil Services (Main) exam in Chennai on Monday, scored high in the ethics paper of the Civil Services-2014 exam.

Ethics paper tests the integrity of a candidate. By scoring high in the paper, Safeer managed to secure an all-India rank of 112.

Safeer, who completed engineering in electronics, scored top percentile in CAT, but instead of pursuing MBA, went to Vajiram and Ravi Academy in Delhi for civil services coaching. After learning the tricks in Delhi, he returned to Kerala and opened his own civil services coaching centres, Karim's La Excellence in Kochi and Thiruvananthapuram.

Safeer secured 112 rank in the 2014 Civils exam in his third attempt. An All India Service (AIS) officer, is Safeer's batchmate, told TOI that the Kerala native had scored high in the ethics, integrity and aptitude paper, which had enabled him to secure a good rank.

"The ethics paper was introduced by UPSC in 2013 to test integrity of a candidate. Safeer's case is the classic example of how the paper failed to test integrity

candidate, who later went on to commit a fraud to shame the entire AIS officers' fraternity. He had scored 108 in the 250-mark paper in General Studies-4 (ethics, integrity denical studies—(emics, miegrity and aptitude) paper. His scores in other three General Studies papers were comparatively less," an IRS officer, who too appeared in the UPSC Civil Services Examination— 2014, said.

Safeer had secured 772 out of 1.750 marks in written exams and 178 out of 275 in the interview, with a cumulative of 950 out of 2,025 marks. Not just AIS officers, even directors of coaching centres condemned Safeer's shameful act.

"It is highly condemnable that somebody who scored so well in the ethics paper has been found adopting such unethical means to be an IAS officer. The government must initiate CBI probe into the issue to ensure that justice is delivered," KS Rao, director of KS

Rao IAS Academy, said. Expressing shock over an IPS officer resorting to hi-tech copying in UPSC Civils exam, director of another prominent coaching centre in Himayatnagar said, "It is an irony that someone who scored 108 marks in the subject, took the unethical route just to be an IAS

8 killed by New York motorist in 'cowardly act of terror'

New York, Nov 1: A man in a rented pickup truck drove onto a busy bicycle path near the World Trade Centre memorial today, killing at least eight people and injuring several others in what the mayor called "a particularly cowardly act of terror.

The 29-year-old driver was shot by police after jumping out of the truck with what turned out to be a fake gun in each hand, officials said. He was taken into custody. His condition was not immediately disclosed.

Witnesses described a scene of panic and blood, with people screaming in fear and the path strewn with bodies and mangled bicycles.

Cities around the globe have been on alert against attacks by extremists in vehicles. The Islamic State has been encouraging its followers to mow down people, and Britain, France and Germany

have all seen deadly vehicle attacks

in recent months and years.
Police said the vehicle, a rented Home Depot truck, entered the bike path on West Street a few blocks from the new World Trade Centre and mowed down several people. The truck also slammed into a small yellow school bus, injuring

two adults and two children. A paintball gun and a pellet gun were found at the scene, police said. "This was an act of terror, and a particularly cowardly act of terror aimed at innocent civilians. Mayor Bill de Blasio said.

At least two bodies could be seen lying on the path beneath tarps, and the front end of the pickup was smashed in.

Tom Gay, a school photographer, was on Warren Street and heard people saying there was an accident. He went down to West Street and a woman came around the corner shouting, "He has a gun! He has a gun!'

Gay said he stuck his head around the corner and saw a slender man in a blue track suit running southbound on West Street holding a gun. He said there was a heavyset man pursuing him.

He said he heard five or six shots and the man in the tracksuit fell to the ground, gun still raised in the air. He said a man came over and kicked the gun out of his hand.

The attack closed roads across the western edge of Manhattan along the Hudson River and sent uniformed officers rushing to the neighbourhood as people prepared for Halloween festivities, including an annual parade through

Greenwich Village. Eugene Duffy, 43, a chef at a waterfront restaurant, said he was crossing West Street when he heard something, turned back and saw the white pickup on the bike

After seeing the mangled bikes, he ran south, seeing the school bus

that appeared to have been Tand officers at the scer guns drawn, ducked behind patrol cars.

'So many police came and they didn't know what was happening,"
Duffy said. "People were
screaming. Females were screaming. Females were screaming at the top of their

At least eight people were killed and 11 others injured in Lower Manhattan today after a gunman in a truck ploughed through a busy bike path, an incident the US termed as an "act of terrorism".

The suspect, 29-year-old Sayfullo Saipov said to be from Uzbekistan, was shot in the stomach before being arrested.
"I have just ordered Homeland Security to step up our already

extreme vetting programme. Being politically correct is fine, but not for this!" Trump tweeted.

Trump also changed the banner on his Twitter account to the New York skyline.

His administration announced last

week that it would resume accepting refugees after a 120-day ban, though arrivals from 11 "high-risk" countries, most of them home to Muslim majorities, will still be
