State pays last respect to two soldiers

Appropriate action will be taken, no one will be spared: Chief Minister

Imphal, Nov. 14: State paid last respect to the two Assam Rifles jawans who were killedin a bomb blast at Chandel district headquarters vesterday. Chief Minister Nongthombam Biren Singh along with Deputy Chief Minister Yumnam Jovkumai Singh led the people in laying wreath to the mortal remains of the two jawans of 18 Assam Rifles at Imphal International

After showing last respect to the two jawans, talking to media persons, Chief Minister Biren Singh said, the incident that happened all of a sudden yesterday morning shocked us. Terming the incident as unfortunate, Chief Minister said, it is a cowardly act to kill jawans who are here to serve us and we condemned it in the strongest term.Government will not tolerate such acts and appropriate action will be

initiated against those who are responsible for the killing and no one will be spared. He said, soon after the blast additional forces including police commandos rushed to the area and large scale combing operations has already begunand if required, reinforcement will also be sent. He said, he has already spoken to the Ministry of Home Affairs and appropriate action will be taken in this

Member of Parliament (Rajya Sabha) Ksh. Bhavananda Singh, Director General of Police L. M. Khaute, Deputy Commissioner of Chandel District, Inspector General Assam Rifles (South) Major General Virendra Singh and other top paramilitary officials also laid wreaths to the mortal remains of the two Assam Rifles jawans namely, Sohan Lal and Inder Singh. The two bodies will be sent to their respective native States for the last rites later today.

It may be mentioned that, besides killing two jawans, six others were injured in the blast suspected to be triggered by militants near Chandel district headquarters yesterday morning at around 6 am. One jawan killed on the spot while the other succumbed to his injuries on the way to

JFA bats for a specific law to deal with apartment-residents

Guwahati, Nov 14: Journalists' Forum Assam (JFA), while observing an increasing number of flat (apartment) owners residents in the city, urges the government to formulate a specific law to safeguard

interest of both the apartment dwellers and local residents. The forum insisting on specific guidelines (may be like those in Maharashtra State Apartment Association Act 1970) emphasizes on a healthy media debate over the matter.

It may be noted that the prehistoric city of Guwahati has witnessed a haphazard growth of multi-storey residential buildings in the residential buildings in the recent past and the trend continues in ascending direction involving more families every passing day. The forum argues that the

concerned authority should take timely initiatives to encourage the growth on the right direction.

"We need to create adequate public awareness about the rights and obligations of the family members residing in a housing premise. The rights of those residents while purchasing the flats from the builder/developers and also in their society itself should be clarified," said a be clarified," said a statement issued by JFA president Rupam Barua and secretary Nava Thakuria.

The forum also added that the specific law should also deal with the rights of the tenants in a housing

complex. Moreover, the responsibility/obligations of those apartment residents towards their

neighborhood in a particular locality should also be included in the guidelines.

"In many cases it is observed that the builder/developers use deep boring (welling) to extract water for the apartment residents causing alarming depletion of ground water level in that locality. It

affects the neighboring families, who cannot afford the highly expensive drilling, particularly in the winter season," asserted the JFA statement. The government may also

encourage the apartment societies to harvest sufficient rainwater for their daily uses like kitchen-gardening, vehicle-washing, cleaning etc so that the pressure on ground water can be minimized to many extents. It will help regenerating the storage of ground water for the benefit of environment, added the statement.
