Imphal, Nov. 16: Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution Minister Shri Karam Shyam today said a State cannot achieve State cannot achieve development if the media is not allowed to function independently. He was speaking at the National Press Day cum One-Day Workshop on "Challenges before the Media" function held at 1 a Bn. Manipur Rifles Banquet Hall, Imphal organised by Directorate of Information and Public Relations.

The seminar organised by the Directorate of Information and Public Relation, Govt. of Manipur was attended by Yumnam Rupachandra, General Secretary, Editors' Guild Manipur, Sothing Sinray, Ex-President Manipur Hills Journalists' Union and Sanju Journalists Chilol and Sanju Bachaspati Mayum, member All Manipur Working Journalists' Union as main speakers, Vetaran Journalist AK Sanaton moderated the

the three speakers highlighted the issues and problems of journalist of the state due to the rampant threats from both state and non state actors. The issues of journalists still deprived of their right from getting minimum wage as approved by the Majitha Wage board as well as the non compliance of the Supreme Court order in providing appropraite wage for journalist.

Former President of the Manipur Hill Journalists' Union, Sothing Simray while readin his paper highlighted

on how the hill region are somehow deprived by the main newspapers in the state. he said like the Manipur felt neglected in terms of news coverage by the national mainstream media houses, the Hill people of the state somehow felt that the hill people are being neglected by the Imphal base newspaper as they hardly covered issue of

the hill people.
On the other hand Sothing Sinray also drew the attention the Directorate Information and Public relation over non functioning of DIO offices at Hill districts While presenting his paper Yumnam Rupachandra, General Secretary of Editors' Guild Manipur expressed apprehension about the fate apprenension about the are print media particularly the local language newspaper which are being printed in Bangali scripts. He said that newspapers that are being publiched in Manipuri publiched in Manipuri language using Bangali script is going to face serious problem as youths who have completed graduate are in no position to read in Bangali script as they have been taught and learnt in Meitei Mayek. The reviving of the Meitei Mayek is appreciated and should be done but when it comes to the newspaper it is challenge, great c ipachandra said.

"No newspaper can published both in Meitei Mayek as well as Bangali script to enable both groups of people who are able to read in Bangali script as well as who are able to read in Meitei Mayek".
Rupachandra said. he further added that as the process will take some times the government of Manipur should formulate a machanism either in way of providing subsidies or grant to enable all the people access to the newspaper. Sanju Bachaspati Mayum

Morgue today. Speaking to the media persons, Chief Minister said that the security personnel had died in the line of duty on a special mission of the new government "Go to the Hills" mission so the government is taking the matter seriously. The government would also provide financial support of Rs 5 lakh each to

those injured personnel, he added. The proposal for providing financial aid would be placed before the Cabinet, he added. Expressing deepest condolences, Chief Minister extended his heartfelt sympathies to the bereaved

Replying to a query about the recent ambush that killed 2 AR iawans in Chandel district recently, Chief Minister said that violence will not bring any solution and it hampers in bringing peace and prosperity in the State. Political dialogue is very much needed to resolve any issues, he added. Chief Minister further stated that the State government is planning to have political dialogue with the insurgents/outfits if the Centre gives their approval for
