Imphal, Nov. 7: Justice is still not delivered to the Manipuri student Chanam Pravish, who was found death in Uttar Pradesh in a mysterious circumstance after he went missing on September 8 after witnessing a concert at Greater Noida.

A statement of the People Action Committee Against the Brutal Killing of Ptavish Chanam of Uripok Achom leikai at Greater Noida, Uttar Pradesh said that even though the Uttar Pradesh Government has directed for an investigation over the death nothing has been done till today to book those culprits behind the death. The committee said that,

during a meeting with the Chief Minister of Manipur N. Biren Singh, the family and the committee has been assured to deliver justice. N. Biren Singh also showed a written assurance from the Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh which stated that the matter will be investigated by the Uttar Pradesh if in case the investigation is not satisfies then the matter can be handed over to the CBI, the committee's statement said while thanking the chief Minister N. Biren Singh for his concern to the case.

The statement said that when the family members went to inquire about the progress of the case at Noida, it is learnt that the case remain pending. It said the government should handed over the case to CBI. Pravish Chanam was suspected to have been a victim of a gang involved in organ transfer. His death body was cremated by the government authority of UP without informing to the family member who were searching for his whereabouts by filing report to the police station.

Rupee falls 14 paise against US dollar to 64.69

Mumbai, Nov. 6: The rupee dropped by 14 paise to 64.69 against the dollar at the interbank forex market today amid fresh foreign fund outflows.

Traders said fresh demand for the US currency from importers and a lower opening of the domestic equity market weighed on the rupee.

The dollar's weakness

against some currencies overseas, however, restricted the rupee fall, they added.

Foreign investors pulled out around Rs 9,690.84 crore from equity markets on Friday.

On Friday, the rupee closed with a rise of 6 paise at a fresh six-week high of 64.55 against the American currency. Meanwhile, the benchmark BSE Sensex fell by 97.19 points, or 0.28 per cent, to 33,588.37 in early trade.

Post demonetisation country has moved to a much cleaner, transparent & honest financial system: FM Arun Jaitley

New Delhi, Nov. 7: Finance Minister Arun Jaitley on Tuesday said the country has moved on to a much cleaner, transparent and honest financial system after implementation of demonetisation.

In a Facebook post, Mr Jaitley said, cash seizure by Income Tax Department has more than doubled in 2016-17 as compared to 2015-16.

During search and seizure by the Department, Rs. 15,497 crore of undisclosed income has been admitted which is 38 per cent higher than the undisclosed amount during 2015-16.

Mr Jaitley said, undisclosed income detected during surveys in 2016-17 is Rs. 13,716 crore which is 41 per cent higher than the detection made in 2015-16. The minister said, benefits of these may not yet be visible to some people. The Finance minister said, November 8, 2016 would be remembered as a watershed moment in the history of Indian economy. This day signifies the resolve of this Government to cure the country from "dreaded disease of black money". Mr Jaitley said one of the important objective of demonetisation was to make

India a less cash economy and thereby reduce the flow of black money in the system. He said the number of suspicious transaction reports filed by banks during 2016-17 has gone up from 61,361 in 2015-16 to 3,61,214.

The Finance Minister said Income Tax Department has taken action against more than 1150 shell companies which were used as conduits by over 22,000 beneficiaries to launder more than Rs. 13,300 crore. Laying down measures taken post demonetisation, Mr Jaitley said SEBI has introduced a Graded

Surveillance Measure in stock exchanges.

This measure has been introduced in over 800 securities by the exchanges. The Minister informed that over 450 such companies have been delisted and demat accounts of their promoters have been frozen in order to ensure that such suspicious companies do not languish in the exchanges.

Mr Jaitley said, stone pelting incidences in Jammu and Kashmir and naxal activities in Left Wing Extremism affected areas are reduced significantly due to the impact of demonetisation.
