Imphal, Oct 18: Tibetan Spiritual leader Dalai Lama, who arrived here in Imphal yesterday on a three day visit today, highlighted the importance of peace for enhancing a better world.

"India is having potential of contributing a lot in building a peaceful world," the Tibetan spiritual leader, who is in exile for the pass many years said to a houseful audience gathered at City Convention Centre, Palace Compound, Imphal, during a Civic Reception programme organised by the Manipur state government. Dalai Lama was however referring to the rich ancient Indian learning methodology and philosophy, when he said India can play vital role in building a peaceful World.

The present chaos, crisis, and uncertainty happening in many part of the country is



due to the improper education policy, but India being a rich traditions with ancient knowledge have the potential in shaping the world into a peaceful atmosphere, the spiritual leader clarified when enquired about how the country having its own problem can be a factor of building peace in the world during interaction session.

Earlier, in his welcome speech, Speaker of the Manipur Legislative Assembly, Yumnam Khemchand expressed gratitude to the Spiritual leader on behalf of the Manipur government over his acceptance to visit the

among humanities.

Dalai Lama, the Tibetan spiritual leader, who has been in exile since the occupation of Tibet by China, has been standing firm with his commitment to restore independence of his country without using any form of violence.

"I believe in non violence.... if you carried positive action (Karma) you can defeat negative action (karma)", the confident spiritual leader, who is now 82 years old said to the large gathering at City Convention Center auditorium.

On the issue of the rise of violence among various community across the Globe in the recent days, Dalai Lama said that violence in any form is against any religion, any faith which they followed.

Violence killed, shattered peace and spoil the harmony of human kind said Dalai Lama.

Expressing his concerns about the Global politics, Dalai Lama recalled the kind of disaster that was brought by the United State of America over its policy towards Iraq during Bush administration.

On the recent violence in Rakhine state of Myanmar, Dalai Lama said that there cannot be a Muslim terrorist or Buddhist terrorist. Terrorist cannot be follower of any faith or religion, he added.

The spiritual leader also talks about the lots of problems that are suffering the humanity. He talks about the self centric politics of certain people and the natural disaster suffering the people that are caused by the negative emotion of human being.

"Everybody likes happy life, at the same time they could not find it", Dalai Lama said and added that this are because of the too much short cited emotions.

India signs pact to send interns to Japan for training

New Delhi, Oct 18: India has signed a Memorandum of Co-operation (MoC) with Japan to send youngsters there as technical interns for on-the-job training for a period of three to five years. The MoC on

Technical Intern Training Programme was signed by Skill Development Minister Dharmendra Pradhan and Japanese Minister of Health, Labour and Welfare with Katsunobu Kato in Tokyo yesterday.

India is the third country with which Japan has signed the MoC. As per the Japan's official data for 2016-end, approximately 2.3 lakh technical intern trainees from multiple countries are on training in the island nation.

Temporary disruptive effect of GST over, says economic affairs secretary

New Delhi, Oct 18: Economic affairs secretary SC Garg on Tuesday said the temporary disruptive effect of the Goods and Services Tax+ (GST) is over as the manufacturing sector recorded positive growth of 3.1 per cent in August.

Commenting on the twin data on industrial output and price situation, he said that the benign and moderate inflation has become the order of the day.

"Manufacturing grew by 3.1 per cent in August after two months of negative growth of -0.5 per cent and -0.3 per cent. Temporary disruptive effect of GST is over," he said in a tweet.

Overall, industrial production grew at a nine-month high of 4.3 per cent in August, mainly on account of robust performance of mining and power sectors coupled with higher capital goods output. India's economic growth slipped to a three-year low of

5.7 per cent in the first quarter of the current fiscal. Despite slowdown, the Reserve Bank of India at its policy review meeting earlier this month kept the key interest rate unchanged at 6 per cent, citing upward trend in inflation.

"Benign and moderate inflation is the order of the day with consumer inflation of 3.3 per cent in September. Food inflation remained 1.8 per cent only," he said in another tweet.

North Eastern Council to be reoriented: Dr Jitendra Singh

New Delhi, Oct. 18: North Eastern Council (NEC) will be reoriented to meet the current requirements and to address the new emerging issues in the North Eastern region.

Minister of State for Development of North Eastern Region, Dr Jitendra Singh said, NEC will be reoriented and

developed as a state-of-the-art resource centre for the North Eastern States with necessary resources, knowledge and skill to execute innovative and strategic vision for the region.

Addressing a meeting of the senior officers of his Ministry in New Delhi yesterday, Dr Singh said, the NEC was set

up in early 1970s with the intention to give special focus to the development of this region. He said, the council requires to be reshaped after the identification of thrust areas and critical gaps in order to take up as many development initiatives as possible within the annual budgetary allocations.
