Gold bars worth around Rs. 6 Crore seized

Imphal, Oct. 1: 12 pieces of gold bars weigh around 19.954 Kg, which is worth around Rs. 6 crore were seized from Jiribam bound Tata Sumo vehicle at Yurebam area in Imphal West district at NH-37 today morning by officials of Custom Division Imphal. Superintendent of Custom Division, Imphal N. Meiraba while speaking to media persons today morning at its office at Sangakpham Imphal, said that the huge consignment of gold was

seized after staffs of the division check the vehicle near Power House of Yurebam area in Imphal West at around 6 am today after getting specific information about smuggling of gold along the route. The registration number of the Tata Sumo vehicle transporting the gold bars is MN-01 G 8543. The driver is identified as Md. Nazimuddin of Lilong Turel Ahanbi and the owner of the vehicle is identified as one Md. Yusuf from Bengoon Mayai leikai. As per statement of the

Superintendent of Custom Division, Imphal, N. Meiraba the gold bar were smuggled from Myanmar side to India but at the moment investigation is being on to find out which way the smuggler used as smuggling of such items is not possible at the International border gate at Moreh. Earlier on September 16, this year CISF personnel deployed at Imphal Tuliha Airport seized around 6 Kg of gold hidden at the anus of six persons trying to board for Kolkata.

Smuggled fertilizers seized at Pallel

Imphal, Oct. 1: State police seized 25 bags of fertiliser from two vans in front of Pallel Police station while trying to smuggle at Myanmar. Report reaching here said that, a team of police while checking an Eco-Van coming towards Moreh side bearing registration number MN05A-4805 found 10 (ten) bags of Urea fertilizer inside it at around 10.30 am yesterday. While asking for relevant document to the driver of the van identified as K. Meipaksana.Singh (36) S/o (L)



R.K. Khedasana Singh of Chongtham Kona Wangoi, Imphal West, it was found that the fertilisers were trying to smuggle at Myanmar. A similar van carrying 15 bags of Urea Fertilizer was also caught around the same time from the same place. The



registration number of the vehicle is MN1A-8852 and the driver is identified as Md. Ibo (41) S/o Md. Babu Khan of Kshetri Awang Leikai, Imphal East. Both the persons were arrested after seizing the fertiliser bags.

Players in World top-50 to get chance of direct entry in National Quarterfinals: BAI President

Bangalore, Sept 30: The Senior National Badminton Championship will now boast of an unprecedented prize purse of Rs 10 million, a 10-fold increase from last year, announced Dr. Himanta Biswa Sarma, President of the Badminton Association of India. He also said that it will be mandatory for all the top ranked players to participate in the country's top event. Ushering in a change in the format, Dr. Sarma said that those players who are in the World top-50, would get a direct entry into quarterfinals. However it will be limited to a maximum of eight slots out of a total of 16. Dr. Sarma was talking to media persons after felicitating the Junior National Team, which is bound for Indonesia to take

part in the World Junior Championship and Myanmar for the Asian Badminton Championship, by setting a precedent of handing over the Indian blazer, at the Karnataka Badminton Association, here on Friday. It also marked the conclusion of a 20-day preparatory camp under the supervision of the Junior National Coach Sanjay Mishra who will lead a 38-member strong team for the Asian Championship. KBA president BV Srinivas will accompany the team as the manager. With a focus on building the future of Indian badminton, BAI will concentrate on honing the skills of the junior players. "Most of the times, good talented players drop out of the game due to financial constraints. Hence to support

such players, we will be providing a scholarship of Rs 25,000-50,000 per month for about 20 juniors to begin with, and take the number to 100 in a year," said the President while urging the corporate sector to support the cause. There will be a two-month summer camp across the country, especially for the players who have immense talent but missed out on the opportunities owing to various factors. "Every state association will nominate five players each and there will be four national camps in the summer. National and International coaches will assist the trainees," said Dr. Sarma. India opens two border crossing points with Myanmar, Bangladesh

New Delhi, Oct 1: India has opened two immigration check posts along the borders with Myanmar and Bangladesh. In a gazette notification, the Home Ministry said, the Central government has designated Zorinpui land check post in Lawngtlai district of Mizoram as an authorised immigration check post for entry into or exit from India with valid travel documents for all classes of passengers to or from Myanmar. The Central government has also designated Kawrpuchhuah land check post in Lunglei district of Mizoram as an authorised immigration check post for entry into or exit from India with valid travel documents for all classes of passengers to or from Bangladesh. Zorinpui was selected for a new land custom station along the Indo-Myanmar border in Mizoram for the Kaladan multi-modal project. Kawarpuchai is situated in Mizoram along a riverine border with Bangladesh.

He also distributed certificates and mementos to the Voluntary organizations that organize at least three Blood Donation Camps from April to September, 2017. Minister also visited the Blood Donation Camp which was being organised in the G.P. Women's College hall. Attending the function S. Subhashchandra Singh, Parliamentary Secretary, Health and Family Welfare mentioned about his concern to introduce a policy to motivate the blood donors of the state so that many more donors will come forward. He also handed over a cash reward of Rs. 5000 to a donor who has donated blood 54 times. He also announced payment of Rs. 1000 per month from his salary till his office last as incentive for a blind donor who has donated blood 56 times. Dr. K. Rajo Singh, State Mission Director and Director, Health Smt. Valentina Arambam, Project Director, Manipur State AIDS Control Society and Dr B. Lalhari Sharma as President and Guests of Honour respectively. Health Services Staffs, students from different nursing Institutes, Differently able person, representatives of voluntary organizations were also present at the function.
