New Delhi, Sep 8 (PTI) The Committee of Administrators (COA) today assured that all six north eastern states will be playing Ranji Trophy as individual units next season with BCCI GM (Game Development), Ratnakar Shetty, given charge of their smooth integration. The six states Meghalaya, Manipur, Mizoram, Sikkim, Nagaland and Arunachal Pradesh met Vinod Rai for one and a half hour with plea of taking part as a combined unit this season.

However, they were assured that by next season they would be part of Ranji Trophy while they will play as separate states in the age group categories (U-16, U-19 And U-23) from this season onwards.

"Mr Rai told us that since Ranji Trophy is starting from October 6, it will be difficult to play this season.

However we will be playing as individual states from next season. After all these years this is the first time we have got complete assurance.
