

State level Teacher's Day Celebrated Need to introspect teaching system: Y.Joykumar Singh

Imphal, Sept 5: Manipur celebrated Teacher's Day today as a mark of honour to Dr. Sarvapali Radhakrishnan, second President of India. State level celebration was held at the Auditorium of Manipur State Film Development Society (MSFDS) at Konung Mamang in Imphal. Deputy Chief Minister Yumnam Joykumar Singh along with Education Minister Th. Radheshyam Singh led the people to pay floral tribute to the portrait of departed educationist and Bharat Ratna Dr. S. Radhakrishnan. Speaking on the occasion, Deputy Chief Minister said, there is the need to introspect teaching system in the State.



He said, lot of changes have been witnessed over a period of decades. In olden days, relationship between teachers and students were good enough to infuse knowledge. Competitive examinations were held regularly so that competitions among students increased a lot but in these days, it has been witnessing a change. He said, good relationship between teachers and students are the key for an effective teaching and learning system. Joykumar Singh further said, teachers should pay utmost care and love to the students as their children and students should also respect teachers as their parents so that a pleasant environment can be created for learning. Teachers should not engage themselves only on formal teaching but to teach informal education like discipline and cleanliness to students. He appreciated the Green School Campaign undertaken by the Education Department in the State and appealed to take pledge by the teachers and students to teach

and learn for a meaningful future. Education Minister Th. Radheshyam Singh while speaking at the function said, teachers are the main contributing force that human resource development can be made possible in society. He said, what we are today is their contributions and we should respect them at our best. Keeping in view of the role played by the teachers, Government is fully committed for their welfare. Their problems including transfer & posting, quarters in remote schools, service extension to the National and State Awardees will soon be sorted out. On teaching and learning system in Government Schools, Radheshyam Singh said, there has been lack of extracurricular and co-curricular activities in schools which the Government has taken care of and will try to revamp it soon. Dhanamanjuri University Bill and other two bills regarding regulation, control and checking of

private schools and private coaching/tuition centres will soon be implemented. Lauding the contributions made by private schools in education sector in the State, Radheshyam Singh appealed to all the stakeholders to co-operate with the Government in bringing a major change in the sector in days to come. Yumnam Radheshyam, Chairman (MANIDCO & MANITRON) and T.T. Haokip, Chairman, Hill Areas Committee of Manipur Legislative Assembly also spoke on the occasion. Altogether, 10 teachers were awarded with State Teachers Award and teachers selected for their contributions in Green School Campaign were also felicitated in the function. A book named "Education in Manipur" written by Dr. S. Jamini Devi was also released in the function. Principal Secretary Education(S) Vineet Joshi, Commissioner (Higher & Technical Education) H. Deleep Singh, teachers and students participated in the function.

The academy offers courses in six different sport disciplines does not have proper infrastructure including teachers.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi holds bilateral talks with Chinese President Xi Jinping on the sidelines of BRICS summit in Xiamen

Panchsheel. Chinese delegation comprised President Xi, Chief Spokesperson Lu Kang, Foreign Minister Wang Yi, and State Councilor Yang Jiechi. Prime Minister Modi was accompanied by National Security advisor Ajit Doval, foreign Secretary S Jaishankar, spokesperson of Ministry of foreign affairs Raveesh Kumar.

SC seeks government stand on plea challenging Rohingyas' deportation

New Delhi, Sept. 5: The Supreme Court has sought the stand of the government on a petition challenging its decision to deport illegal Rohingya Muslim immigrants back to Myanmar. The matter came up before a bench of Chief Justice Dipak Misra and Justices A M Khanwilkar and D Y Chandrachud. The bench asked Additional Solicitor General Tushar Mehta to take instruction from the Centre about its response. The petition has challenged the

decision on various grounds including that it violated international human right conventions. While the bench posted the matter for 11th September. Advocate Prashant Bhusan appeared for the two Rohingya immigrants who claimed that they are registered refugees under the United Nations High Commission of Refugees, UNHCR. The petitioners claimed, they had taken refuge in India after escaping from Myanmar due to widespread discrimination,

violence and bloodshed against the community there. Earlier, on 18th August, the National Human Rights Commission, NHRC, had issued notice to the Centre over its plan to deport the Rohingya immigrants, who are residing in various parts of India. India has ratified and is a signatory to various conventions that recognise the Principle of "Non-Refoulement", which prohibits deportation of refugees to a country where they may face threat to their lives.

Imphal, Sept. 5: Governor of Manipur Dr. Najma Heptulla said that women should fight for their rights and get justice for their courage. She said this after watching the 35mm celluloid Manipuri film 'Nangna Kappa Pakchadey - Tears of a Woman', screened yesterday evening at the Durbar Hall, Raj Bhavan, Imphal. The film is the 5th production of PK films directed by Dr. Makhonmani Mongsaba, produced by Thouyangba and Thougamba and story by Late Maharaj Kumari Binodini Devi. The film, produced in the year 2013, has been screened in many International Film festivals and has recently received the Special Judge Award with the title Epic Mirror of the Century from Kinshasa International Film Festival (KIFF). The movie focused on women empowerment giving a true hope for a new muscular feminism. The Governor said that when a man and woman produce a child, it is their responsibility to take care of the child and not leave them unfortunately. It is the nature. If the woman and the man do not take the responsibility, the guardians would not know what to do and how to fight it out. Greed makes a person the way he behaves, she further added. The movie that focused on



the sufferings of a young village woman and her child left by her husband and denied of her rights. In spite of her young age she took the challenge to take the responsibility of the child and lives for the child. This kind of life, seen in all parts of the country, is the problem of the society. This is the story of Manipur. The film was so beautifully produced and so simple. There is no melodrama but a true story, she added. She further

said that the movie gave a message that women should be independent and not beg for something. She also said that she had been working, nationally and internationally, for the empowerment of the women and had come across the same condition in other parts of the world. Remembering a discussion with an African woman, she said that the woman collects firewood, cooks food, feed the children and husband go into the forest for a long walk and do not work. It is the woman who works. The story was the same everywhere. However, today the things are changing and that is the message of the film. She also expressed her desire to dub the film into Hindi or other languages instead of English as people in other country will have problem with the language and people will see more. Appreciating the works of the producers and the actors, she said that she would try to make some shows outside Manipur. Tonhoi, Denny, Leibakshemba were the lead actors with Sorojini, and Pishak supporting the movie. Many well-known women working for women empowerment and other art lovers attended the screening of the film.
