

Students' and Women's wing of JCILPS sets deadline for driving out 25 fruit stalls ; Express sceptical to the announcement of introducing ILPS Bill

Questioning the state government on how the 25 fruit stalls in front of Bhairodan Maxwell Primary and High School at Thangal Bazar have been provided permission while women street vendors selling vegetable on the road side at Khwairamband Keithel have been drive out by various state force, Students' and Women's wing of JCILPS today sets deadlines for driving out the 24 fruit stalls. "When our women selling vegetables at road side at Khwairamband Keithel are being driven out time and again either by the traffic police or by the VDF or by police force destroying their vegetable, how those 25 fruit stall attached to the wall of Bhairodan Maxwell Primary and High School at Thangal Bazar have been given person on what basis at that crowded area", Samjetsabam Memcha Leima, convener of the JCILPS Women Wing asked the



government. Talking to media persons near Bhairodan Maxwell Primary and High School at Thangal Bazar, Leima said if the government fails to drive out the fruit stalls from the crowded area within three days time then the JCILPS will not remain quiet. On the other hand while appreciating the government on its announcement to introduce a JCILPS Bill in the

upcoming monsoon session of the state Assembly, convener of the students' Wing JCILPS S. Manjit expressed sceptical on the commitment as no stakeholder has been consulted so far about framing of any such Bill. "Govt. had stated that all stakeholders will be consulted and a Bill that will be agreed by every community of the states will be framed by constituting a

Committee", Manjit said and asked the government if there has been any such committee formed or consulted the stakeholders. "We have witness a mass uprising as a Bill which turns out as an instrument to protect the outsiders has been introduced in the state assembly, we would not tolerate if any Bill that will not be accepted by the people is introduced", Manjit warned the govt.

Poverty kills: Wife died, husband in critical state after the couple consumed caustic soda

Unable to find means for survival and probably seeing to means to bear to the cost of their only 6 years old son, a couple consumed caustic soda to kill themselves but the husband survives in critical state while the 42 years old wife succumbed at the hospital. The incident reportedly happened at around 2 am today morning. The deceased Sarangthem Ningol Leimapokpam Ongbi Sundari @ Abem and her husband Leimapokpam Imocha @ Ingocha of Wangkhei Ningthem Pukhri

Mapal Makha Leikai were found lying at their temporary residence. Both Sundari and Imocha were taken to JNIMS hospital, as the condition of both worsen Sundari was referred to Advance Hospital and her husband Imocha at RIMS. Sundari succumbed while her husband is still struggling for life at RIMS. According to a report from deceased family, last night around 12:30 am, Imocha, after returning from an urgent work left with Sundari without informing any of the family members. Later at around 2 am family members were informed that the duo were admitted at

JNIMS after they were found consuming caustic soda. A suicide note found indicate that both might have tried to commit suicide as they were unable to fulfill the future of their only 6 years old son due to extreme poverty. Imocha who is a resident of Wangkhei Ningthem Pukhri Mapal Makha Leikai had sold all his property including his house and have been residing at Sundari parental home due to health condition of Sundari and were look after by the bride family members, according to a family member. Both were unemployed though Imocha work as a daily labourer and had one 6 years old son.

Sit-in-protest for 7th pay continue

Armed rebel group People's Revolutionary Party of Kangleipak (PREPAK) said that the outfit is observing 5th Indian Colonialism Resist Day tomorrow the 26th April, 2018. A press statement of the armed rebel group said that the day is being observed against the various form of atrocities, harassment, killings by the Indian armed force for years. For 69 years after the region has been occupied the colonial force has been suppressing the people of the

region and the PREPAK stands to break the chain of colonialism to make a sovereign, self ruled, self sustain develop and socialist state.
