

Nagaland College body fumes over inclusion of 3 candidates from Manipur in professional course entrance examination

Intensifying the pressure on Nagaland's directorate of Technical Education to not allot seats to non-indigenous citizens to undergo MBBS, BDS and other professional courses from the state's quota, the Naga Students' Federation (NSF) and the All Nagaland College Students' Union (ANCSU) have pointed out three candidates as anomalies on the list. The two organisations issued a joint statement on Monday stating that the parents of the 'doubtful candidates' were confirmed to have enrolled in the electoral voters' list of Manipur state of 2018. "Father of merit list NEET SL.No. 61 is found in part 46 of

E-Roll of Manipur 2018, Oklong village under Senapati district at serial No. 628; father of merit list NEET SL.No. 7 is enrolled in part 8 of E-roll of Manipur 2018 Yangkhunuo village under Senapati district at Serial No. 304; father of Merit list NEET SL.No. 50 is found to be enrolled in part 46 of E-roll of Manipur 2018, Oklong village under Senapati district at SL. No. 262," the statement read.

The two student organisations stated that the candidates in question cannot be considered indigenous citizens of Nagaland because their parents are enrolled in the electoral-roll of another state. "The director of Technical Education is requested to initiate necessary action immediately in order to avoid

any misunderstandings and confrontations.

"The NSF and ANCSU reiterate its earlier demand and warn the directorate of Technical Education not to allot seat for undergoing the mentioned courses under state quota under any circumstances, failing which the NSF and ANCSU shall initiate its own course of action," it stated.

Contending that the documents namely scheduled tribe and indigenous certificates, of stated candidates were obtained without proper verification, the organisations demanded that the Nagaland government initiate disciplinary action against the erring officials immediately.

Asian Games 2018- Day 3

16-year-old Saurabh Chaudhary wins 10m air pistol gold

16-year-old Saurabh Chaudhary stunned a strong field of shooters in the Men's 10m Air Pistol as he won a gold medal scoring 240.7 points in the final to set an Asian Games record. Compatriot Abhishek Verma finished third with 219.3 points. Japan's Tomoyuki Matsuda, who led for most of the final, won silver with a tally of 239.7 points. This is India's first shooting gold at this edition of the Asian Games and only their eighth shooting gold across all editions of the Asian Games.

He had also finished on top of the table in the qualification round, scoring 586, two points ahead of former Olympic Champion Jin Jongho from Korea. He had earlier set a World record, scoring 243.7 at the ISSF Junior World Cup in Germany, where he won a gold medal in the same event. Chaudhary is the first Indian to win gold in the 10m air pistol event at the Asian Games. The only other Indian to medal in this event is Vijay Kumar, who won bronze at the 2010 edition in Guangzhou.

Prakash Nanjappa, who won a silver in the same event at the 2014 Commonwealth Games, said that Chaudhary has a bright future, saying, "Saurabh is an extraordinary talent. I think he's a definite future Olympic medalist, if he keeps up his performance." Verma, who is a qualified lawyer, started shooting the big scores just when it mattered as he hit a 10.7 to



move to the second position, eclipsing Saurabh, when six contenders were left in the final. However, a slight fumble of 9.1 in the next shot made him slide down to third as Chaudhary once again came back to the silver medal position with a 10.6 when four contenders were left. There was a final twist in the tale though as Matsuda shot 8.9 on his penultimate shot to slip from the top position. Chaudhary showed nerves of steel, scoring 10.2 and 10.4 on his last two shots to secure the top position. Verma only started shooting three years ago at a shooting range in Hissar, Haryana and finished sixth in the qualification round with a score of 580. This is Chaudhary's first senior event. He had won the Asian Championships in the

same event in 2017 and also finished fourth at the World Championships in the same year. Verma was also making his competitive debut at a major event and has never taken part in even a World Cup

before this. Chaudhary and Verma were chosen for the Indian team over the more accomplished duo of Jitu Rai and Om Mitharval after defeating them at the national selection trials.

An orientation workshop on Ayushman Bharat in collaboration with the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare Department was held today at the Auditorium of, ROB, Imphal.

Ayushman Bharat is National Health Protection Scheme, which will cover over 10 crore poor and vulnerable families (approximately 50 crore beneficiaries) providing coverage upto 5 lakh rupees per family per year for secondary and tertiary care hospitalization. Ayushman Bharat - National Health Protection Mission will subsume the on-going centrally sponsored schemes - Rashtriya Swasthya Bima Yojana (RSBY) and the Senior Citizen Health Insurance Scheme (SCHIS).

Ayushman Bharat - National Health Protection Mission will target about 10.74 crore poor, deprived rural families and identified occupational category of urban workers' families as per the latest Socio-Economic Caste Census (SECC) data covering both rural and urban.

Sanjeev Rajput wins silver in men's 50m Rifle 3 Positions

Indian shooter Sanjeev Rajput clinched a silver medal after letting slip early dominance in the men's 50m Rifle 3 Positions event at the 18th Asian Games here on Tuesday.

The 37 years old shot 452.7 to claim the silver medal, while China's Hui Zicheng notched up the gold medal with a score of 453.3. Japan's Matsu,oto Takayuki bagged the bronze with 441.4. Meanwhile, India's Manish loses to Almat Kebispayev of Kazakhstan in the men's 67kg wrestling final in the Greco-Roman category. Manish appeared to have suffered an injury midway through the bout, but Kebispayev was the more dominant of the two from the start.

In Fencing, India's Jyotika Dutta continues her impressive run in the

women's epee individual event. She progressed to the quarters with a 15-8 win over Thailand. She has now won 5 of her 6 bouts today. In Tennis, India's Rohan Bopanna and Divij Sharan have thrashed Thailand's pairing of Kachapanan N and Trongcharoenchaik 6-3, 6-1 to enter the quarter-finals of the men's doubles event. India's Sumit Nagal and Ramkumar Ramanathan had to work hard but did manage to get past Chinese Taipei duo Chen T and Peng H 7-6 (5), 7-6 (2) to enter the quarter-finals of the men's doubles event. In Greco Roman Wrestling, India's Manish has beaten Japan's Shimoyamada Tsuchika 7-3 to qualify for the quarter final of the 67kg category. On day 3 of the Asian Games 2018, Indian athletes will look to increase the medal tally with gymnast Dipa Karmakar leading the fray. (In action- 2:30pm)

On the wrestling mat, Divya Kakran in women's 76kg freestyle category has a favourable draw, while on the men's side Manish and Gyanendra will be in action. In the bow and arrow arena, Atanu Das will present the Indian challenge along with Jagdish Chaudhary, Sukhchain Singh, Vishwas in the Recurve event. (9 am onwards) Indian men's Kabaddi team will take on Sri Lanka Indonesia and Thailand in the group clashes while the badminton teams will take the net by storm in the semifinals at 11 am. In Shooting, Abhishek Verma, Saurabh Chaudhary will be in action in the 10m air pistol qualifications. (Final-9:45am) The Indian archers were left feeling tough roads to a medal in the women's individual recurve competition after none-too-happy performances in the

ranking round at the GBK Archery Field in Jakarta on Tuesday. Deepika Kumari finished with a 72-arrow total of 649 for the 17th rank among 66 entrants. She shot 330 in the first half and was 12th at the break. Deepika Kumari, who had risen to eighth place with a total of 496 after 54 arrows, slid to the 15th place when her final arrow in the 10th end of six pegged itself way off the mark and earned her a lone point. However, not letting that setback affect her, she made a strong finish with a bull's eye and five 9s in the final end. With the shifting winds challenging India's best-known archer, the other three were hard-pressed to keep pace. Promila Daimary (642) managed to stay in the top half, ranked at 21, while Ankita Bhakat (617) was placed 36th. Laxmirani Manjhi's score of 608 was good for her to be ranked 44th.
