Biswajit launches tree plantation as part of Van Mahotsov festival

The government of India has set a target of 33 percent tree cover including forests and non-forest areas in the country by 2020, said Trade, Commerce and Industries Minister Thangam Biswajit Singh. The Minister was speaking as the chief guest at a Van Mahotsov Festival at Tera Urak Industrial Estate, Bishnupur, yesterday, which was organised by the Tera Urak Industrial Estate Entrepreneurs' Association (TUEEA), Bishnupur. Biswajit along with Manipur State Pollution Control Board Chairman Laishram Radhakishore Singh, Manipur Industrial Development Corporation Ltd. Chairman Dr. Radheshyam Yumnam and Trade, Commerce and Industries Director C. Arthur W also planted tree saplings inside the Industrial Estate campus as part of the festival. Further in his speech, Biswajit highlighted the importance of planting trees to put a check on the environmental imbalances and said trees should not be planted only on a specific date or day but should be planted whenever possible. He said that it is also important to look after the trees and further appealed to the locals and the organisers to ensure

that the tree saplings planted today are protected. The festival will help in creating awareness among the masses about the importance of tree plantation, he added. He lauded the organisers of the festival and said encouraging tree plantation in such an industrial estate is a welcomed act as the trees will help in balancing the pollutants emitted from the industrial units.

Lauding the media for their role as the mediator between the government and the public, Biswajit who is also the Information and Public Relations Minister, said the media should also maintain a balance in their reporting to give a clear information to the general public. Officials and staffs of Trade, Commerce and Industries and Forest departments also attended the function.

Ankita Raina wins bronze in Women's Singles Tennis

Indian tennis player Ankita Raina settled for a bronze medal at the Asian Games after losing to China's Zhang Shuai in the women's singles semifinal here today. Ankita lost 4-6, 6-7 (6) in a gruelling contest that lasted a little over two hours.

India's best women's singles performance in the Games came from Saina Mirza, who notched up a silver in the 2006 edition in Doha, followed by a bronze by her in 2010, Guangzhou.

With today's bronze, the 25-year-old Ankita became only the second Indian woman to



and better as her quarter-final clash with World No. 612 Eudice Wong Chong progressed. Having eked out a tight opener, the India No. 1 completely outplayed the Hong Kong player to register a 6-4, 6-1 win. Raina was later involved in two doubles matches and she had mixed fortunes in those. She and Bopanna carved out a 6-4, 6-4 win over Hong Kong's Chong and Chun Hun Wong to enter the quarter-finals.

The Ahmedabad girl, however, could not taste success in women's doubles, where she and Prarthana Thombare went down 1-6, 3-6 to the Kazakh combine of

Gozal Ainitdinova and Anna Danilina in pre-quarter-finals. With their loss, the Indian contention came to an end in women's doubles.

Rohan Bopanna, Divij Sharan storm into Men's Doubles Final in Tennis

At the 18th Asian Games in Indonesia, the Indian pair of Rohan Bopanna and Divij Sharan today stormed into the Men's Doubles Final assuring India of a Silver medal in Tennis. In the semi-finals, the duo came back from a set behind to beat the Japanese team of Sho Shimabukuro and Kaito Uesugi, 4-6, 6-3, 10-8. Later today, Prajesh Gunneswaran in Men's Singles and the pair of

Bopanna and Ankita in Mixed Doubles will look ensure two more medals for India in Tennis when they play their quarterfinal matches. Meanwhile, in Archery, Atanu Das has booked a place in the quarterfinals of the Men's Individual Recurve event. In the pre-quarterfinals, he defeated Denis Gankin of Kazakhstan, 7-3. Atanu will now face local boy Riau Ega Agatha this afternoon for a place in the last-4. Besides Atanu, none of the Indian archers managed to progress.



A big setback was the pre-quarterfinal exit of former world number one Deepika Kumari. Vishwas also bowed out in the Men's section.

In Shooting, Women's Double Trap Finals are underway featuring India's Varsha Varman and Shreyasi Singh. The Indian Women's Volleyball has lost to Kazakhstan 0-3, in a group match. It was their third defeat in as many games. The Indian event are now rock bottom in Pool-B. In Weightlifting, Sathish Sivalingam and Ajay Singh will vie for top honours in the Men's 77 kg category. In Kabaddi, the Men's and women's teams will play their respective semi-final matches. While the Women's team will play Chinese Taipei, the Men's team will face Iran. In Canoe, Champa Mourya failed to win a medal in Single Women event as she finished seventh in the Final.

Bowling, Basketball and Artistic Gymnastics Women's Vault final will also see the Indian participation. India is currently ninth in the medals tally. China continues to be at the top, with Japan second and South Korea th
