# Arunachal Pradesh. Assam on flood alert after China releases water in Brahmaputra

Flood alert has been issued in low-lying areas nearing the Siang/ Brahmaputra river in Arunachal Pradesh and Assam after 9020 cumec of water was discharged into Tsangpo river by China on Thursday. The Siang river in Arunachal Pradesh has turned virulent with unusually high waves, according to sources in the Central Water Commission (CWC). The East Siang District Administration has cautioned the public to refrain from venturing into Siang River for fishing, swimming and other activities to avoid any eventualities." Chinese Government relayed to Government to Arunachal Pradesh by Government of India states that due to heavy rainfall in Chinese portion the Tsangpo river is swelling with observed discharge of 9020 cumec this morning (Thursday) at 8 am at the various GD station on Tsangpo river which is reported as highest in 50 years," said T Tatak, deputy commissioner, East Siang District, Pasighat, Arunachal Pradesh."People living in low lying areas namely Jarku, Paglek, SS Mission, Jarkong, Banskota, Bergung, Sigar, Borguli, Seram, Kongkul, Namsing, Mer are advised to remain alert but no panic due to the situation," Tatak added.In view of the flood warning issued by the Assam State Disaster Management

Again the police investigations will also leave no stone un-turned in summoning the victim girl. It is high time for the concern government department to take up some sort of immediate measures for the


girl to save her future.

Joshna had a match ball on 10-9 in the fourth game but David fought back to take the next three points, levelling the match at 2-2. The crowd support too was heavily in favour of Malaysia but not enough to distract the gritty Indian. In the final game, she converted match ball on 10-9 to complete the biggest win of her Asian Games career.

"I was very upset yesterday as you must have seen. I did not play the way I was supposed to play. Spoke to my parents and coach and that helped. Today, I

just wanted to be myself. Nicol is such a champion. She always plays a fair game and today was no different. Really happy to have come through," said Joshna after the 12-10, 11-9, 6-

Joshna after the 12-10, 11-9, 6-11, 10-12, 11-9 victory. David was gracious in her defeat. "Joshna played really. It was a very good match and I could not play my A game," the

35-year-old said. World number 19 Dipika Pallikal Karthik too did not play to her potential against Joey Chan on Thursday. But in second singles match in the tie against Malaysia, she came out firing on all cylinders against former world number five Low Wee Wern.

The Indian's brute power was too much to handle for Wee Wern, who is on a comeback trail after a 20-month injury lay-off. The scoreline doesn't suggest so, but it was a tricky match for Pallikal, who eventually pulled through 11-2, 11-9, 11-7.

"The plan was definitely to rattler her with my power. Wee Wern has been a top player and has already won three tournaments after her comeback. Also, I had to do it for Joshna. She played such a great match to get us on the brink of a win," said Dipika. India is likely to play long-time rival Hong Kong in the final on Saturday. "Hong Kong are as tough to beat as Malaysia. They have a very solid team. But our confidence has got a major boost after today," she added. With the win, India women's team

has equalled its best performance at the Games, having won a silver four years ago.

# Injured Vikas can't fight semis, settles for bronze

boxer Vikas Krishan (75kg) settled for a bronze medal in the Asian Games after he was declared medically unfit to fight his semifinal bout due to a cut on his left evelid sustained

earlier in the event. The 26-year-old was to take on Kazakhstan's Amankul Abilkhan in his last-four clash on Friday evening but has been forced out due to the injury.
"There is inflammation in

retina as well and it is too risky to let him fight. He will have to take a break for a few weeks," an official of the

contingent said. Vikas has, however, managed to script history by becoming the first Indian



boxer to clinch three successive Asian Games medals.

He won a lightweight 60kg category gold in Guangzhou 2010, before winning a middle-weight bronze in the 2014 edition in Incheon.

The Haryana-boxer

sustained the cut during his pre-quarterfinal bout and the

injury aggravated during his gruelling quarterfinal clash against China's Tuoheta Erbieke Tanglatihan.

The former world championships bronzemedallist, who won a gold at the Commonwealth Games earlier this year, overcame the bleeding to assure himself a medal.
