Economist Surjit Bhalla Resigns from PM's Economic **Advisory Council**

Economist newspaper columnist Surjit Bhalla on Tuesday stated that he had quit as a part-time member of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's economic advisory (PMEAC). council

"I resigned as part-time member PMEAC on December 1st; also look for my book Citizen Raj: Indian Elections 1952-2019," Bhalla tweeted on Tuesday morning.

According to government sources, his resignation has been accepted by the Prime Minister.

Bhalla, according to his tweet, will continue to be a contributing editor at *The Indian Express* and has joined as a consultant for the Network18 Group. His resignation comes on

the heels of a series of exits by government economists over the last

year. This includes former Niti Aayog boss Arvind Panagariya, former chief economic adviser Arvind Subramanian and former RBI governor Urjit Patel. The PMEAC was set up in September 2017 by Modi as a five-member panel. It is currently headed by senior economist and Niti Aayog member Bibek Debroy and also includes other members like Rathin Roy, Ashima Goyal, Shamika Ravi and Ratan Watal.

The council identified ten areas for reviving growth and employment such as jobs, monetary policy, public spending

and agriculture.
According to people with knowledge of the matter, Bhalla helped draft a report on employment months before his exit.

This report, sources say, has been criticised through feedback given by third-parties such as Mahesh Vyas of Centre for Monitoring Economy (CMIE).

Blood screening report confirms, Guwahati scribes maintain good health

Guwahati, Dec. 11

The city based scribes maintain good health as most of them have them have performed well in a recent blood screening camp conducted by Assam's celebrated healthcare institute Dispur Hospitals. Nearly 80 scribes, age limit from 30 to 60 years, participated in the free camp, where their blood samples were collected to test thyroid, haemoglobin and sugar. Only 11 scribes were diagnosed with high thyroid stimulating hormone (more than 7 milli-international units per liter or mIU/L), where

four participants were with low haemoglobin (less than 12 gm/dl) and five with high random blood sugar (more than 140 mg/dl), said a statement from Guwahati Press Club, where the camp was organized last week. Dr Jayanta Bardoloi, managing director of Dispur Hospitals offered free consultations to the participating member-journalists, so that they can start medication in need. Interested scribes may arrive at his hospital in Ganeshguri locality of the city for necessary consultation and medications

Sensex down by over 500 points, rupee crashes 1.5% following RBI governor's resignation

Agency New Delhi, Dec. 11

The rupee slumped 1.5 per cent against US dollar and the Sensex was down by the Sensex was down by 521 points or 1.49 per cent at 34,438 on Tuesday morning following the shock exit of former RBI Governor Urjit Patel and amid uncertainty ahead of the Assembly election results of five states — Madhya Pradesh, Telangana, Chhattisgarh, Mizoram and Rajasthan.

The rupee was trading at 72.46 against the US dollar, down 1.5%, as dollar, down 1.5%, as compared to Monday's close of 71.32. The Nifty too fell by 1.28 per cent or 134.65 points to trade at 10.353.80.

Meanwhile, a day after RBI governor Patel's resignation, eminent economist and columnist Suriit Bhalla resigned as part-time member of Economic Advisory Council to the Prime

Minister (EAC-PM).
Bankers and fund managers are bracing for volatility in the markets on Tuesday. Soon after Patel's resignation, which came following a months-long fractious faceoff with the government, the Nifty and Sensex had plunged around 2 per cent on Monday to register their worst closing levels in four weeks.

The rupee too slid over 1.1 per cent (72.46 to the US \$ at 6.30 IST) in the

overseas (Non-Deliverable Forward) market. The Sensex closed at 34,959.72 points, down 713.53 points, while the Nifty closed at 10,488.45, down 205.25 points or 1.92 per cent. Fund managers had predicted on Monday that the resignation would be "taken negatively by the market" on an the market" on an immediate basis and his replacement would hold

Markets have been volatile this year following rising crude oil prices and depreciation of the value of rupee. The lowest levels for the Sensex and Nifty this year were at 32,483.83 9,951.9 on March 23.
