

# Process for verification of pet dogs in the pipeline: MAHUD Minister

Imphal, Dec. 7

Forest & Environment and MAHUD Minister Thounaojam Shyamkumar yesterday appealed to all the dog owners of the State to put collar belts around their pets and not to let loose their pets astray in the streets and locality.

Speaking to media persons at his New Secretariat office, Minister Th. Shyamkumar said that MAHUD Department will issue an order to all the Urban Local Bodies to identify domestic and stray dogs so that necessary action can be taken up for the concern departments. Stating that the recent attacks on domestic livestock were carried out by animals including dogs, he said there is a chance of spreading rabies disease. As a precautionary measure all the dogs in the urban local bodies need identification at the earliest,



he added. He said the Minister of Veterinary and Animal Husbandry will be consulted for the dog census so that number of domestic dogs as well as stray dogs can be easily verified. He further said consultation will be also held regarding census on the number of dogs which have already received rabies

vaccination. He also made fervor appeal to the public no to panic over the incidents as the authorities as well as the experts are jointly working and assessing the situation. He said officials and staff of Forest and Environment are working towards maintaining a peaceful coexistence between humans and the wildlife.

## PPFA bats for preserving Netaji's INA headquarter in Yangon

Guwahati, Dec. 7

As President of India, Ram Nath Kovind sets to visit Myanmar next week, an Assam based patriotic citizens' forum appeals to the Head of the State for pursuing his counterpart in NayPyi Taw to preserve all monuments relating to India's glorious freedom struggle including the INA (Azad Hind Fauj) headquarter in Yangon (formerly Rangoon) city. It may be noted that President Kovind will arrive in the southeast Asian country on 10 December next with a five-day visit schedule. He is expected to visit NayPyi Taw as well as

Yangon and meet with his host President U Win Myint and State Counselor Aung San Suu Kyi. Several issues are on card for discussions and bilateral agreements are expected to be signed during the President's visit to the neighbouring country. "Myanmar (earlier Burma) played an important role in India's freedom movement where many legendary Indian leaders either took shelter or imprisoned there by the British colonial administration," said Patriotic People's Front Assam (PPFA), in a statement adding that Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose later shifted the Indian National Army's

head quarter to Rangoon and fought against the imperialist forces with its 40,000 valiant soldiers from the soil of Burma. The forum of nationalists expressed apprehensions that rampant construction activities in various parts of Myanmar might have destroyed most of the historical ruins including the INA building in Yangon. So the PPFA urges President Kovind to discuss specially with Nobel laureate Suu Kyi, whose father General Aung San was a close friend of Netaji Subhas, for her personal initiative to preserve those Indian heritages scattered in Brahmadash.

## CM chairs review meeting of RD & PR department

Imphal, Dec.7

Chief Minister N. Biren Singh chaired a review meeting of the Rural Development and Panchayati Raj (RD & PR) Department at the Cabinet Hall of Chief Minister's Secretariat yesterday. Additional Chief Secretary (RD & PR) M.H. Khan presented a PowerPoint slide show regarding various works, achievements, issues and problems of the Department at the meeting.

According to the presentation, the Central Government has agreed to release Rs. 122 crore including wages and material under MGNREGS for the State within December 2018. In the last financial year 2017-18, a total of Rs. 15778.89 lakh were received. However, in the current financial year Rs. 16504.69 lakh were so far received and more funds are expected in the last quarter.

Till date, the Manipur Social Audit Agency of the Department has conducted Pilot Social Audit in nine Blocks, one Block each in a district. The agency currently has one Social Audit Expert and nine District Social Auditors. Under Prime Minister Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY), the Ministry of Rural Development, Government of India has set a target to construct roads having a total length of 1000 km covering a total of 85 habitations during 2017-18 financial year, out of which 731 km covering 58 habitations have been completed as on March 31, 2018 securing 3<sup>rd</sup> position in terms of rural roads construction among North East States.

In the financial year 2018-19, the Ministry set a target to construct 900 km out of which 230 km have been completed as on October 30, 2018. The total number of approved roads under Prime Minister Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY) for the State from 1981-82 to B-I, 2018-19 is 1860 covering a length of 11366 km. 1320 roads covering a length of 6340 km have already been completed so far. Out of the 142 bridges sanctioned during this period, 45 bridges have been completed. On the other hand, the total length for Stage-I (formation of cutting) is 5629 km and the completed length is 4282 km. For Stage-I+II/II/ upgradation and blacktopping, the total sanctioned length is 5737 km and the completed length is 2057 km. Works under the Phase-I of the National Rural Mission are being taken up at Khangabok Cluster. In the Phase-II, works will be executed at Keirao Makting Cluster. Unfinished works of Khangabok Cluster may be completed when the fund for the third instalment is received from the Government of India. The State Government has set a target to construct 9740 houses under Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana - Gramin (PMAY-G), out of which 2448 houses have been constructed so far. Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana - National Rural Livelihood Mission (DAY-NRLM) is being run in four Blocks i.e. Sawombung, Keirao, Chandel and Tengnoupal. The mission has been formulated to reduce poverty by enabling the poor households to access gainful self-employment and skilled wage employment opportunities. Deen Dayal Upadhyaya - Gramteen Kaushalya Yojana (DDU-GKY), which is the skills action-arm of the National Rural Livelihoods Mission, is also being implemented in the State. It has been tasked with skilling rural youth, moving them from poverty to productivity. Chief Secretary Dr. J. Suresh Babu, Director (RD & PR) H. Balkrishna and other high ranking officials of the Department were also present at the meeting.

## SC dismisses PIL against FM Arun Jaitley

The Supreme Court Friday dismissed a PIL raising allegations against Finance Minister Arun Jaitley relating to capital reserve of the Reserve Bank of India. The apex court also imposes a cost of Rs 50,000 on advocate M L Sharma, who had filed the public interest litigation (PIL).

"We find no reason whatsoever to entertain this PIL," a bench comprising Chief Justice Ranjan Gogoi and Justice S K Kaul said. Sharma had accused the

Finance Minister of plundering the capital reserve of the RBI.

The bench also directed the apex court registry not to allow Sharma to file any PIL till he deposits Rs 50,000.
