A notification issued by Superintendent, State Archaeology, Government of Manipur, states that only 10 representatives of any party will be allowed to enter Kangla without Microphone/Loudspeaker and vehicle. They should follow traffic regulation i.e., to go on the left side of the road. Separate treatment for widows of rebels and that of Security Forces – Is it iustified?

IT Desk Imphal, Feb 24: Chief Minister N. Biren Singh new initiative to stop all kind of mob violence which some even term it as mob justice is one of the most appreciating effort. He had rightly pointed out that no good is brought by mob violence as it would tantamount the existing law of the land as well as image of a

good governance. Before, N. Biren Singh led government came to power, people in the state have been experiencing the souring and intolerable mob violence at many part of the state.

A house being burnt, a family being thrown out and even mothers, sisters, and father being thrown out of the locality for a crime committed

by a person. Showing his concern the Chief Minister had time and again stated that why should the members of the family of those criminal be punished for the crime committed by a member of the family.

This is a common understanding and everyone of us knows that the Chief Minister is right and almost all people support any such measures to counter mob violence.

Well, when Chief Minister N. Biren Singh said that no family member should be punished for a crime committed by a family member, he meant to say that not everyone of his family is criminal. The Chief Minister is right. One family member's criminal act cannot make all the members as criminal.

Well there is government scheme for financial assistance to widows and children of victims of conflict. If a person, civilian died in cross firing between security force and armed insurgence they are entitled to get some amount of financial assistance from the government. This scheme does not cover widows of alleged rebels or say terrorist in the language of the

government. Widows and children of insurgences or say terrorist suffer the same like those of the security forces or civilian. Of course the civilian victim if happen to be a government employee or the security force somewhat were left with certain facilities. But when it comes to the widows and Children of the rebels then they are left with no choice. These children and widow of insurgence even though have no connection with what their father had done were treated discriminately with other women. They are left on

their own to survive. Something seriously is wrong the way that financial assistances are provided to victims of conflict.

On one hand if the widows and children of rebels are left with such attitude than there is a possibility that they felt discriminatory and are being punished for the crime that they have not committed.

What difference does it make for a mob punishing the family of a criminal and for the state government treating widows and children of rebels who were killed in encounter or alleged encounter as two separate categories? Widows are widow, no matter her husband was a civilian, security forces or armed rebel

group.
The financial assistance provided by the government to widow should not be discriminated. The system need to be changed.

Its time to ponder in this specific issue as reducing crime rate is now priority of the

The stigma, and discrimination that they faced after the dead of her husband was no difference from other widow but she has been denied of any facilitied because her husband was a rebel. Hutchin Haokip , a woman activist also narrated on how the widows in Hill area are suffering while trying to get the benefit provided for the widow under various schemes of the government of India. he said that as the government offices sometime remain close for reason best knnown to them they have to return empty hand. The President's statement said, "The present degenerated situation is a consequence of overlooking our own identity at one historical point of time, the tendency to merge with India, its culture and traditions and subsequent surrender of our political and economic rights to the foreign power. Now Manipur has been enveloped with thick multiple layers of the Indian political system and its traditions. As a result we have forgotten our own identity and we are in a dream world of being genuine Indians. Such a way of living and perception of things is one fundamental factor for the

downfall of Manipur. We are a people drifting without any direction amidst the political turmoil. To free ourselves from this life of subjugation and servitude, and put Manipur on a new trajectory of freedom and progress, we must overthrow the Indian colonial rule. "Some people have been blaming the revolutionary movement for the restive situation prevailing in the society and its economic underdevelopment. But this is a misplaced concept. Since the day India forcefully annexed Manipur, New Delhi completely took over all the administrative and political powers and all economic policies were designed to suit their colonial interests. Thus, the political and socio-economic life of the people of Manipur was driven in the direction they chose. The highly degenerated socio-economic and political condition seen today in Manipur is a direct product of the colonial policies of India. The chaotic situation prevailing in contemporary Manipur is an outcome of the colonial policies. There is no room for the revolutionary movement to intervene into this sorry state of affairs nor is there any question of the revolutionary movement posing hurdles to economic development. On the contrary, the revolutionary movement has been taking pivotal roles towards bringing a peaceful and progressive society. "The understanding that economic development will have adverse impacts on the revolutionary movement

is totally wrong. Economic development can never alter the idea of and commitment to the liberation movement.

The ongoing revolutionary movement of Manipur would be different from the many revolutionary movements seen in different parts of the world in 1950's/ 1960's. Freedom, Democracy and Development have become the fundamental parameters of defining a Nation in the 21st century where the light of unprecedented development has reached every corner of the planet. In this scenario, the classical concepts of revolution can no longer guide the national liberation movement of

"We must have a clear understanding of the kind of peaceful and progressive society we are yearning. Our forefathers and ancestors laid the foundation of Manipuri nation on a solid and firm ground called freedom. To our forefathers, freedom is the soul of a Nation. "A momentary life of freedom is far better than living 100 years under bondage" was a common saying among our forefathers. Our attempts to foreground the 2000 years old history of independence to identify Manipur in the face of any formidable challenge are the basic elements which would form the foundation of future Manipur. Living a life of slavery while we are completely denied our freedom can never be called a peaceful life. There is no meaning to economic development when the political reins of the nation are controlled by foreign

power.
"We are aware that the ongoing revolutionary movement against the colonial rule is related with

the economic development and social tranquility but we firmly believe that restoration of sovereignty should precede all other national duties. Even if the masses wish to stay away from the liberation movement, the idea of freedom galvanized by our long history will never fade and the revolutionaries, representing the people will write a new history of independent Manipur. "Some people have been working hard to project that the revolutionary movement and the masses are traversing on two separate, unconnected paths. This is one area of serious concern. Their understanding of education and their principles of pushing their sons and daughters into different professions are different from ours. All the educated sons and daughters and all those who have excelled in different disciplines invariably love Manipur. The future generations too will never study or interpret the history of Manipur in wrong light. Even if they cannot take active roles in the revolutionary movement at present, there will come a time when they use their expertise, knowledge, wisdom and physical resources for advancement of wisdom and physical resources for advancement of the revolutionary movement. Many sons and daughters of the soil who have settled in different parts of the planet will come back when Manipur regains its sovereignty and they will use their knowledge and resources freely for the welfare of our motherland.
